

Dear Parishioners,

My name is Fr. Peter Shaba. I am from Nigeria. I entered the Major Seminary in 2011 – SS Peter and Paul Major Seminary Ibadan, Oyo State Nigeria where I studied Philosophy and Theology. I was in The Republic of Benin for my Spiritual year and Togo for my pastoral year.

Ordination and place of mission: I was ordained in 2010 and sent on mission to the Central African Republic, a country bordered by Cameroun, Chad, Sudan (both North and South) and the two Congos. The name of the Mission is St Pierre, Mabondo. We have 18 other out stations, covering over 140 miles. I work among the Pygmies. These are people who are traditionally hunters and gatherers and they live in the forest. They depend on the forest resources for their livelihood. They see themselves as inferior and as people not worthy to mingle with the outside world.

Mission: Our mission among them is first and foremost to give them the identity they need, making them aware that they too are human beings who can as well live in an organized society. We do this through education, with the one classroom block we have in two villages (though these are elementary schools) and through the medical care we provide for them. We also help out with clothes, water, food and also paying the school fees of the brilliant children, those who are very successful in the elementary stage.

Aim and projects: Our aim is to give a proper education to these children and make them better than their parents, since they are the ones we can rely upon for proper formation, while the project we plan for is to build a three to four classroom blocks for those other children who are not so lucky to further their education after the elementary stage. Also, we hope to complete another dispensary which we just cleared the site in February of this year in one of our stations where we also have pygmies. More so, we are planning to build a recreation hall especially for showing of films, especially if we are able to get a projector.

Challenges: We have very bad roads, which are not good for our cars, which are always in need of repairs since we do not have bikes. Just as in our village and in the villages around, the Government impacts are not felt, there is no portable water, no dispensaries or hospitals, no schools and where these are present, they are dilapidated huts, just standing, no drugs or medicines, and as for the schools, the children are not taken care of. Girls are discouraged from going to school by their parents, since they are forced to marry early, thus there are early pregnancies. A lot of HIV and AIDS patients, (many of whom do not even know their status), due to lack of education and proper information. There is very little social distractions for the kids, football (soccer) only.

Major challenge: The major challenge we are facing now is insecurity especially after the coup d'état which ousted the former president Francois Bozize in March. Many parishes are now being attacked with goods worth thousands of dollars carted away by these rebels-mercenaries. On August 7 2013, just few days ago, the parish where am working was attacked. The guard was injured, a lot of things were stolen from the rectory, some of which includes: household utensils, laptop computers, handsets, cash, clothes, etc. It will take a great deal to get them replaced.

Evangelization: The pygmies have the idea of a divine being, but we bring Christ to them through our works, saying Masses in our 18 villages at least once every three months and when we are not there, there are some trained helpers who help in Sunday services.

You could support and consolidate our efforts through: prayers, technical know-how, donations, especially to upgrade and equip our school, donation for sports and social equipment and facilities, football (soccer ball), projectors, etc., donation towards replacing the mission properties stolen by the rebels recently and girl-child school sponsorship and support for teachers and catechists mainly through means of transport, i.e. bicycle and motorcycle.

Scouting News




