





This year's Lenten campaign focuses on Sierra Leone, a country struggling to recover from civil war, the Ebola virus and a series of landslides that have killed thousands. At week-end Masses on 17th/18th February in St Michael's, parishioner Colm Hogan gave a first hand account of the plight of the people of this African country having recently visited Sierra Leone as part of his work with Trocaire. Colm spoke of the positive life-changing benefits of the Lenten campaign to those families & communities who are experiencing great hardship.

As well as funding emergency programmes overseas, Trócaire campaigns to create an awareness of the causes of poverty in the developing world. The three-day World Meeting of Families Pastoral Congress will run from 22-24 August in the RDS, Dublin and is packed with major panels, workshops, testimonies, cultural events and music performances throughout each day. There will also be breakfast lectures in the mornings for everyone but especially for members of the business community. The Congress will include the daily celebration of the Eucharist.

The events of each day are guided by a key theme from Pope Francis' document *The Joy of Love (Amoris Laetitia)*, on love in the family, and will include topics on the joys and challenges of love, marriage and family life in today's world. Young people and children can also have a faith experience at our tailored programmes for children (4-12 years) and young people (13-17 years).

Memories of the Beast from the East and Emma

Yes, the newspapers were right: snow was general all over Ireland. It was falling softly upon the roads of Bluebell, Inchicore and surrounding parishes and gently falling into the canal. Thursday night was a strange time: snowdrifts wiping out the footpaths and roadsides; rubbish bins flying through the air in blizzards; the country brought to a standstill. The 'Beast from the East', and now Storm Emma herself! The Siberian winds caused schools to close, wiped out sports fixtures, left people stranded on the main roads overnight and clogged up our airwaves and TV screens. The Beast from the East received wall-to-wall coverage for sure. For those who had to work, the weather was an unwelcome challenge. But that is only half the story. For the children, it transformed Bluebell/Inchicore into a winter wonderland. And they made the most of it: building snowmen, joining snow fights, and swiftly inventing snow sleighs. As Wordsworth wrote on a different matter: Bliss it was in that dawn to be alive, To be young was very heaven! As Irish people, we are obsessed about the weather anyway in a way that no other country does. For us talking about it is a national hobby, be it snow, rain or shine. In some respects its an acknowledgement of the power that the elements have had on this island down through the ages. It shows our understanding that there is little we can do to influence these elements. Regardless of our beliefs, we still acknowledge that there are many factors in our lives that are beyond our control. There are forces far greater than ourselves, including weather fronts. The natural world has an uncanny ability of showing us who is boss, even though we may think that we have finally conquered it. It's the idea that we are not the masters of all that can happen to us. There will be times in our lives when we can do little more than accept the circumstances in which we find ourselves, make the best of it, surround ourselves with true friends not depending on ourselves but on our Creator God.
