FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Amos 7:12-15 Ephe

Ephesians 1:3-14 Mark 6:7-13

With God's Grace Strengthening Us, We Can Accomplish All God Asks of Us

If we are doing the right thing for the right reason, we would like to think that people would welcome us into their midst. We might even expect that they would thank us for our efforts, especially if what we do is to fulfill God's will and to be of service to God's holy people. The cool reception given to the Old Testament prophets and the martyrdom that awaited many of our Christian ancestors would suggest that this is more wishing thinking than reality.

The prophet Amos would certainly have attested to this. Amos was living a peaceful life as a shepherd when he was called by the Lord to serve him. This was around the year 750 B.C. This was a time of relative peace and prosperity for the Jewish people. But they had been divided into a northern kingdom known as Israel, and a southern kingdom known as Judah. Amos was called to leave Judah and go to Israel, where the prosperity of the people there had brought a lack of fidelity to God. The people preferred to live a life of merriment and frivolity, with no thought of listening to God or changing their ways. They were unconcerned about the idolatry and injustices that existed in their midst.

So God sent Amos from the land of Judah into the kingdom of Israel to preach a message of repentance. When Amos finally prophesied exile to the people, destruction of the temple and death for the king, the anger of the priest Amaziah was stoked into a furor. He banished Amos from the king's court, warning him to stay silent. In the verses that follow today's reading, Amos reissues his Godinspired warnings before setting off, at the Lord's command, to move his mission of prophecy back to his own people in Judah.

The disciples, who were sent forth two by two in today's Gospel, would require the same level of determination as Amos to fulfill God's will. They were sent only with the comfort of their companion and the knowledge and faith in all they had seen and heard Jesus do and say. They were instructed to accept both hospitality and hostility. If the hands of welcome were not extended to them, or if their message was rejected, they were to leave the town, shake the dust from their feet and keep moving. Jesus encouraged his disciples to waste no time, but to keep preaching the Kingdom of God to anyone who would listen.

While it would be vary easy to lose heart and to give up because of discouragement or lack of results, true disciples of Christ will keep their eyes fixed on Jesus. In this way, we can continue to be faithful to the work Jesus has called us to do, even in the midst of suffering and tribulation. While most of us would like a warm welcome and great success as we try to live as Jesus taught, we are to be prepared to accept our fair share of hostility. To help us, we can recall the words of Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta: *God calls upon us not to be successful, but to be faithful*.
