Dear Parishioners,

Happy Easter! Jesus Christ is Risen, He is Risen indeed. This is the great feast of our faith. By His rising, death is no longer the final answer. Scriptural Teaching

An Inquisitive Walk through the Scripture, 70

We recommend keeping these reflections in a three-ring binder for the sake of pondering, challenging, questioning what is offered. Please consider that this is a series and some things may not be as clear if all individual reflections are not read.

Moses was one of the “types” revealed by God so that humans would be able to recognize the true Messiah when He appeared. As Moses led God’s people Israel out of bondage in Egypt through the Red Sea and desert into the Promised Land so the Lord Jesus leads us from bondage through the waters of Baptism through life’s journey to Heaven. We have looked at some elements of this journey in past weeks and now we look at the giving of the Ten Commandments on Mt. Sinai.

God called Moses to the top of the Mountain and spoke to him from the Burning Bush. (Ex. 19:1-31:18) Along with the Ten Commandments other items dealing with the Ark, the Tabernacle and the Priests were related to Moses. Moses received the Law from the Word of God. Orthodox iconography of this event portrays the Virgin Mary as the Burning Bush with Jesus in her lap speaking to Moses. St. Ignatius of Antioch referred to Jesus as “the Word of God proceeding from the silence of the Father.” The Son of God is the Communicator of God’s revelation. St. John’s Gospel proclaims: “The Law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, He has made Him known.” (Jn. 1:17, 18)

The Law was needful to set standards and guidelines for the people to follow so as to enter into the Promised Land. It was also important so that people could understand that the Law would prove difficult and that no one could be saved by simply following the Law. “Grace and Truth” (Jesus) had to come to mercifully set us free and then send the Spirit to empower us to live by the Spirit. St. Paul in his Letter to the Galatians (chaps. 3-5) portrays the contrast between the Law and the Spirit. Well worth the time to read in full. As a symbol of this, when God punished the people for the Golden Calf (Acts 32:28), 3000 people died; when the Spirit came at Pentecost, 3000 came to life in the faith. (Acts 2:41)

Moses ratified the people’s agreement to the law by sprinkling blood upon them and said: “Behold the blood of the covenant which the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words.” (Ex. 24:8) With the New Covenant, it is the Blood of the Son of God which ratifies our relationship with the Father and it is sealed by the Holy Spirit. As always, the Lord is kind to provide for us criteria to recognize the Messiah so that our faith in Him is not blind but reasonable.

The Sunday after Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday!



How should we prepare for this great Feast of Mercy?

Pope John Paul II said that the image of the Risen Jesus Christ portrays Jesus bringing Mercy to the whole world. Our Lord said, "I want the image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it. I promise that the soul that will venerate

this image will not perish". (Diary 341, 48)

Jesus said to St. Faustina, "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You." (Diary 327) "The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the cross. ...Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him." (Diary 299)
