**FROM THE
PASTOR**

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. As Catholic Christians we believe in the real presence of Jesus under the form of bread. In the Gospel of John, Chapter 6, verse 55-56, Jesus says, “For My flesh is food indeed and My blood is drink indeed. He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me and I in him.” As the Lord fed the Hebrew people in the desert with manna on their journey to the Promised Land so He now feeds us on our journey to the kingdom of Heaven. At the Last Supper, Jesus said- “Take and eat, this is My body. Take and drink, this is My blood.” The Lord came as food. He was born in Bethlehem, which means house of bread and He was placed in a manger, which was a container where food was placed for animals to feed. This was prefiguring that Jesus was living bread come down from Heaven. What a gift that we have from Jesus.

It is sad to see many ignore this gift. One reason is that it is said that 70% of Catholics don’t believe in the Real Presence. If you really believed that Jesus is really present, would you not come to be in His Presence? This could be why many do not attend Sunday Mass. Also, many are ignorant as to why to go to Mass. You will hear people say, “I don’t have to go to Church to pray. I can pray at home.” Two comments in response to that. First, do you pray at home? If you ask that question, the common response is either, “yes at times” or “no I don’t.” Many find it hard to have a daily time of prayer at home. The second comment is,

we go to Church to worship, to offer sacrifice, and to be fed at the Eucharistic table. You cannot do this at home. So not coming to Church is in a way rejecting God’s gifts—belonging to a community of faith, given the perfect sacrifice that Jesus gave on Calvary and the food of heaven which is His body and blood. These gifts are given to help us to get to Heaven. To reject these gifts is putting oneself in spiritual peril.

Reflection of the Week

Scriptural Teaching

An Inquisitive Walk through the Scripture, 79

We recommend keeping these reflections in a three-ring binder for the sake of pondering, challenging, questioning what is offered. Please consider that this is a series and some things may not be as clear if all individual reflections are not read.

The Lord has revealed Himself in Scripture but He has also revealed us to ourselves. He has revealed how He created us to be in complete and perfect union with Him and ourselves and how we are to do this. This revelation has been gradual and was first recorded in Scripture. Scripture became more fully understood and this understanding is recorded in Tradition. This is true in both Judaism and Christianity (and in most other religions.) It can also be seen in the way we humans learn from the time of conception through the different “grades” of life. In the womb and early infancy, a child learns from her senses. Then a basic vocabulary is introduced, then an alphabet, then the ability to learn stories from books, then some basic ideas, then more philosophical, etc. (This is an extremely simplistic way to portray learning. Any educator may feel free to laugh but we hope that the basic thought that the learning capacity and experience develop over time in some basic ways.)

Likewise in God’s revelation. It is gradual. Even before Abram, the man of faith, came to be a friend of the One God, God had made Himself known to pagans and polytheists in some way. God made a covenant with Noah before He was known to be One. Before God came to be understood as Trinity, God spoke of Himself as One. Jesus is the fullness of the revelation of the Father (“He who has seen Me has seen the Father” (Jn. 14:9)) but Jesus told us we would understand more fully only when the Spirit came (“I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all the truth...” (Jn. 16:12, 13)) God’s revelation and our understanding of this revelation continue today.

All this is mentioned for the sake of proposing that the Hebrew Scripture portrays concrete, historical realities and stories as symbols and “alphabet” for understanding the spiritual, eternal verities that are more fully revealed in the Christian Scriptures. The doctrines of Incarnation and Trinity came to be understood only after the Holy Spirit began His ministry in a way that could be understood more fully by humans. The Spirit was seen as present and active as early as Genesis 1:2; the Second Person of the Trinity is seen in Genesis 1:3 (“God spoke”) as only understood and articulated in Jn. 1:1 – “In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God.” God is patient in His revelation and we humans are slow in our understanding.

All of this is for the sake of setting the stage for looking at some of the historical books of the Hebrew Scripture. Some think that the God of the “Old” Testament is not the same as the God of the “New” Testament. There are not two different Gods. Nor did the One God change. God is not of two minds or two modes of revelation. We humans can only absorb so much at a time and taking a few millennia to teach humankind is understandable. Given our difficulty in grasping the message of Truth and Love, it is understandable that we still need more time (hopefully not millennia) to enter more deeply into the Life of God.

Corpus Christi Sunday

Today's observance, therefore, accents the joyous aspect of Holy Thursday.
