The blessing included in the First Reading from the Book of Numbers is one with which most of us are familiar. "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord let His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you..." In the Jewish culture this has been known for centuries as the Aaronic blessing as it was dictated by God Himself to Aaron. It is important to note that it begins with "The Lord bless you."

Solemnity of Mary, Holy Mother of God January 1 is a Holy Day and not because of New Year's



ost Catholics know January 1 is a Holy Day however, many erroneously believe the Holy Day has something to do with the New Year. And, those of us that do know it is the Solemnity of Mary, Holy Mother of God, may not understand the significance of the feast as it is oftentimes confused with the Annunciation or the Assumption.

The feast is a celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus. The English title "Mother of God" is a translation of the Latin title *Dei Genetricis*, which means "She Who Generated God." This title was adopted at the First Council of Ephesus as a way to assert that Jesus is God, and that his mother can therefore be called Mother of God. The title that the January 1 feast celebrates is thus not only Mariological but also Christological.



The feast, as it relates to others in the Church, is not that old however, its roots date back to the 13th or 14th century. The Second Vatican Council said, "Clearly from earliest times, the Blessed Virgin is honored under the title of Mother of God." Early in our history, the Church in Rome celebrated on January 1 a feast that it called the Anniversary of the Mother of God. When the feast was overshadowed by the feasts

of the Annunciation and the Assumption, adopted from Constantinople at the start of the 7th century, January 1 began to be celebrated as the Octave of Christmas, the "eighth day" on which, according to Luke 2:21, the child was circumcised and given the name Jesus.

In the 13th or 14th century, January 1 began to be celebrated in Rome, as the feast of the Circumcision of the Lord and the Octave of the Nativity, while still oriented towards Mary and Christmas, with many prayers, antiphons and responsories glorifying the maternity of Mary. Pope John XXIII's 1960 rubrical and calendrical revision removed the mention of the circumcision of Jesus and called January 1 simply the Octave of the Nativity.

The feast of the "Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary" was established in Portugal in 1914, for celebration in October and was extended to the entire Catholic Church by Pope Pius XI in 1931. In 1969, a revision of the liturgical year and the calendar stated definitively, "January 1, the Octave Day of the Nativity of the Lord, is the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God, and also the commemoration of the conferral of the Most Holy Name of Jesus." This change removed the October feast, even for Portugal, by declaring, "The Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated on January 1 in the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God."

In his Apostolic Letter, *Marialis Cultus*, Pope Paul VI explained, "This celebration, placed on January 1 is meant to commemorate the part played by Mary in this mystery of salvation. It is meant also to exalt the singular dignity which this mystery brings to the 'Holy Mother, through whom we were found worthy to receive the Author of life.' It is likewise a fitting occasion for renewing adoration of the newborn Prince of Peace, for listening once more to the glad tidings of the angels, and for imploring from God, through the Queen of Peace, the supreme gift of peace."
