New Year, New Commitment

Making a New Year's resolution goes back over 3000 years. A New Year gives us a fresh start, a new beginning, and new opportunities.

It is a time when people feel that they can begin their lives anew. Common New Year's resolutions are to lose weight, exercise more and eat healthier; or to spend more time with family.

Although there is nothing in the Bible or notable in Christian tradition about New Year's resolutions, many good stewards take advantage of this time of year to become closer to the Lord. They may recommit themselves to prayer, or read the Bible more, or attend Mass more regularly. Here are a few ideas to get you started on your New Year's resolutions.

Practice gratitude: Cultivating a grateful heart is the hallmark of a Christian steward. Every day, express thankfulness to the Lord and others.

Encounter the Lord each day: Find time to be with the Lord each day, whether it be for an hour or ten minutes. Have a conversation with the Lord. Give your joys and worries to Him as well. Allow God's love to transform them. Our encounters will keep our eyes and ears open to the presence of Christ in our midst. Remember the Commitment to Prayer you completed at the beginning of Advent: You can download the booklet of monthly prayers from our website.

Be present to others: There is much celebration and mourning, joy and sorrow in peoples' lives. What a blessing it is to be able to share those times. The gift of your presence to others is much more valuable than you realize.

Resist overwork: There is a pressure to produce, meet goals, and be successful. But activities that lead us to overwork, constant fatigue and worry do not give glory to God. What God calls us to do we can do well. Be mindful that life requires balance, down time and letting go of unrealistic goals.

Nurture friendships: Our friends are those we choose to be with, those with whom we spend our evenings, with whom we vacation, to whom we go to for advice. Friends are gifts from God who give us a greater appreciation of God's love for us. Friends need our time and love.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children": "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full

restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms.

Because January 22 falls on a Sunday this year, the designated observance for 2017 is Monday, January 23.





Stewardship of Prayer Update

Our commitment and the next step



An integral part of good stewardship is a commitment to be a person of prayer. With the busy lives that we all lead, sometimes daily prayer time seems to get lost. Many of us recently made a personal commitment to prayer and agreed to make prayer a priority over all the other activities that fill our lives. Daily prayer lifts us up, give our lives meaning and purpose, helps us cope with life's ups and downs, and bring us joy and peace. Stewardship of Prayer infuses our parish with God's spirit and is the cornerstone for the other two aspects of total stewardship: ministry and giving.

Beginning soon, during Mass, we will pray the monthly stewardship prayer as a parish family. Please continue to pray the monthly prayers on your own. The Stewardship of Prayer booklet is available on our website at www.stmore.org.

Next Steps...

Over 95% percent of Saint Thomas More Parishioners indicated they would attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, with another 35% adding weekday Masses to their prayer commitment.

Nearly 90% of our parishioners marked 'Prayer at Mealtimes' as part of their Stewardship of Prayer plan.

These are impressive numbers to be sure. Let us each consider how to take those commitments and live them.

Does praying at mealtime include those times when we dine out? Could we find time to add a short prayer for the family after a recited mealtime prayer?
