

A Message from Fr. Brad The Importance of Your Commitment

Our first annual Stewardship Commitment Weekend is coming up on November 4 and 5.

Making an annual commitment to Stewardship of time, talent and treasure, by all parishioners allows ministries to coordinate and plan activities using a calendar year. It will also simplify bookkeeping for most, as their commitment to giving also will follow the calendar year.

In the 1992 Bishops' Pastoral Letter entitled *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, makes clear that responsibility and accountability are paramount. "Becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ leads naturally to the practice of stewardship. These linked realities, discipleship and stewardship, then make up the fabric of a Christian life in which each day is lived in an intimate, personal relationship with the Lord."

We realize Stewardship is not a one-size-fits-all proposition. Some may be suited to contribute financially, but may believe they lack the time to dedicate to a particular ministry, or the opposite may be true for others. While we don't want parishioners to over commit to something that is not feasible, it is important that we, as good stewards, work to give in all three areas. Please take a moment to prayerfully consider how you can make Stewardship a way of life for you and your family.

Priesthood Sunday is a time to celebrate and affirm the men who commit their lives to the Lord and the Church in the Sacrament of Holy Orders. It is an op-

portunity for Catholic parishioners to thank, affirm, and share their love and support for our priests. On this day, parishioners are encouraged to make a commitment to pray for all priests and especially for their own parish priests. It is also a time to pray for vocations to priesthood and to encourage young men to courageously seek God's will and follow his call.

National Vocation Awareness Week (November 5-11)

Did you know that in our country, compared to 50 years ago, there are 20,000 fewer priests and 130,000 fewer religious sisters? At the same time, the Catholic population has continued to grow steadily. Many factors have contributed to the decline: growing secularism, a lengthened period of adolescence, attitudes about celibacy, etc. During the week we encourage all Catholics to:

- Take time to pray for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life.
- Reflect on our own vocation and strengthen our personal relationship with Christ.
- Participate in the CALLED BY NAME process.
- Invite and encourage young people to consider a vocation to priesthood or religious life and to consider participating in our discernment opportunities.3
- Educate our young people about the importance of silent prayer and taking the time to truly listen to God's voice in our hearts.

Stewardship and Treasure

Commitment Weekend is Nov. 4 - 5

rue stewardship is taking care of and sharing all that we have and all that we are—our time, talents, and treasure. Why is it so important to share our treasure?

Money and all of the things that we possess (our treasure) are gifts from God that we are asked to care for and generously share for our own benefit and the good of others. It is important for us to share our money and all of our material possessions for two reasons: first, because all the good things that God has made (including money) are meant to be shared, and second, because each of us has a need to give.

Why do we need to give? We need to give our money to individuals and families in need, to the Church, and to other worthwhile charitable organizations because giving money is good for the soul and because we need to return thanks to a loving God for all of the many blessings each of us has received.

One of the most frequently asked questions in any stewardship program is "How much do I have to give?" The



answer (from a stewardship perspective) is nothing. We don't have to give anything. "How much do we want to give?" is the question that stewardship asks. Stewardship is not minimum giving. It is maximum giving. That means giving as much as we can, as often as we can, from the heart as a faith response because we are generous stewards who want to share our time, talent, and treasure with others.

Frequently, in discussions of stewardship (or "sacrificial giving"), reference will be made to "the biblical tithe" (giving 10 percent of income) and other norms that could provide helpful guidelines for generous giving. As disciples of Jesus, each of us has a responsibility to support the Church and to contribute generously to the building up of the Body of Christ. The emphasis in the bishops' pastoral, Stewardship: A Disciple's Response, is not on "tithing" (giving a fixed percent of income), but on giving according to our means. In many ways, this is a far more challenging norm. It challenges us to be good stewards not only in how much we give away, but in what we do with all our resources.
