

How do we use God's gifts?

"The Earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it." Ps 24:1

We are all called to be good stewards; however, we must first hear the call. Jesus calls us to many things, but we can simplify these into three major areas. He calls us to share our time in some form, to share our talents with others, and to share our treasure for the building of His Kingdom. God himself bestows these gifts of time, talent and treasure upon us. How we utilize these gifts tells us what kinds of stewards we are becoming.

In basic terms, a steward is someone who is in charge of something that belongs to someone else. Over the past several years here at St. Thomas More Parish, we have learned to become better stewards of the gift of time through prayer, the gift of our talents through ministry, and the gift of treasure through our finances. 

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Traditions Explained


Question: Why is the Church against stem cell research, especially if it offers the possibility of cures for diseases like Alzheimer's and Parkinson's?

Answer: Like so many issues, the truth about stem cell research is more complicated than a few sound bites and vague promises of cures. For the Church, the problem is with embryonic stem cell research, not the research itself. The destruction of human life, even for a seemingly noble cause, is never acceptable. The ends cannot justify the means. Stem cells can be obtained in other ways, including from the placenta as well as from adults. So research is possible without the destruction of other life. On the other hand, stem cell research shows much promise, but no concrete results. Some scientists also dispute what diseases might be cured by new discoveries. The research is still in its early stages. The question for our country is whether we should invest a lot of money in research now, looking for cures that will probably remain out of reach for most people, or should we invest that money in other programs with more immediate benefits, especially those that stress prevention and education. It is indeed a complex issue that requires close scrutiny and investigation before we jump to inaccurate conclusions or make decisions based on good, but misinformed, intentions.

Scripture Sunday October 15

The Bible is a personal gift from God to guide us and Pope Francis has asked all dioceses to designate one Sunday a



year as Scripture Sunday. October 14/15 is Scripture Sunday in the Diocese of Owensboro.

- Carry your Bibles to Mass (your Protestant friends will wonder what you are up to!). Mark your Bible for the readings of the day and then follow the readings in your Bible during the Liturgy of the Word.
- Each family will receive a bookmark with Lectio Divina guidelines to help them pray the Scriptures along with a blessing of Bibles at the end of Mass.

The Bible is part of our Christian heritage just like the Mass and is one of the ways we encounter Jesus Christ.
