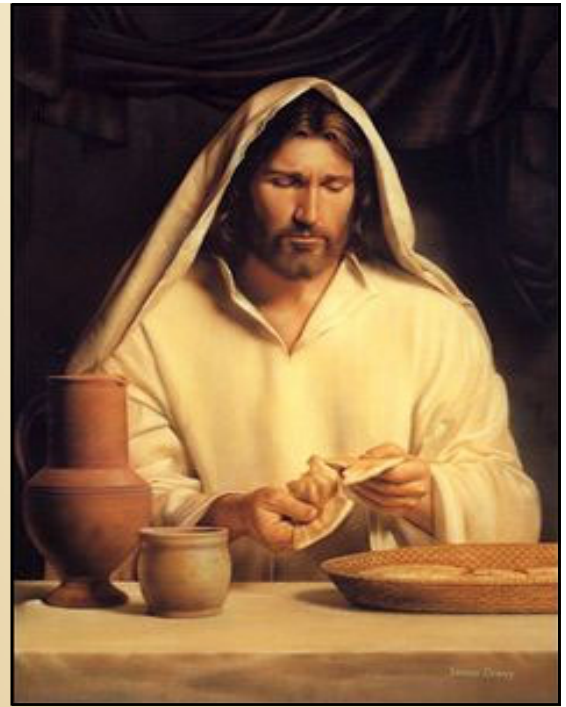

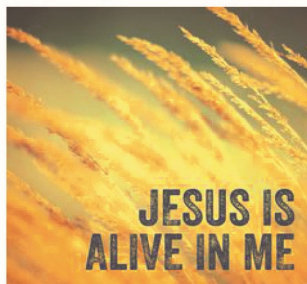
Where do you see Jesus?

As today's gospel reveals, the first meal shared with the risen Lord happened in a place called Emmaus. Perhaps there is no better time to reflect on this story than in those prayerful moments at Mass when we return to our place after receiving Holy Communion. Those few moments give us an opportunity to reflect on our stewardship of Christ's presence within us. We have a chance to practice hospitality by inviting Jesus into our hearts to walk and talk with us about our own Emmaus journey. We can relive once again the time when he broke bread for the disciples. And just as they did, we too can recognize Christ in this meal we have just shared with others.

The Gospel Reading also recounts Jesus' appearance to the two disciples along the road to Emmaus. What is interesting about today's account is the two, although evidently familiar with the Lord, do not recognize Him ("...their eyes were prevented from recognizing him.").

This is a challenge for us today as well. St. Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) once wrote, "I see Jesus in every human being. I say to myself, this is hungry Jesus; I must feed him. This is sick Jesus. This one has leprosy or gangrene; I must wash him and tend to him. I serve because I love Jesus." That should be our motivation for serving, for being a disciple, for practicing stewardship.

Like the two disciples going to Emmaus we must be alert and prepared to see Jesus in places we least imagine Him. Stewardship is, of course, a two-sided perspective. Not only do we need to seek and search for Jesus in others and then serve, but also others need to see and recognize Jesus in us.

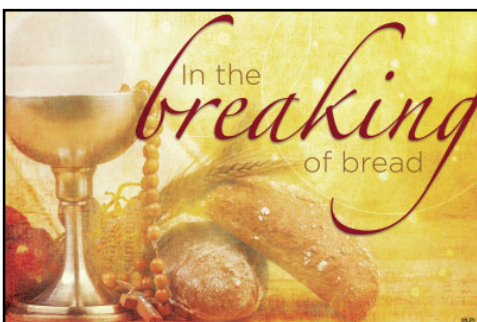

Dear Friends at St. Thomas More,

Thank you! Paducah Cooperative Ministry was very blessed again this year by your very kind response to the Faith Formation annual Lenten food drive. You all did a super job—very successful! The response from the congregations was amazing. It took us almost a whole day to pick up all the donations. What a blessing to get our pantry shelves replenished with thanks to you.

As you know, people come every weekday to our food pantry for help with groceries. In January we helped 540 households with food. In February, 375 families received help from our pantry and then in March, PCM helped 389 times with emergency groceries. So just in the last three months, our pantry has helped folks who are having a hard time with groceries on 1,304 occasions. That is a lot of food!

Please know that we very much appreciate you and the support you give to bring such blessings to others.

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Traditions Explained

Question:

Is it true that Catholics have to go to confession at least once a year?

Answer:

Paragraph #1457 of the "Catechism of the Catholic Church" teaches us that "each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year." The obligation to confess applies only to serious sin; if one practices one's faith sincerely, receives the sacraments, prays daily, strives to be holy, and is unaware of any serious sin, one would not be obligated to go to confession. Paragraph #1458 goes on, however, to encourage people to confess venial sin and to view the sacrament as another tool in the struggle to grow in faith through the formation of conscience. Like any exercise, when we get out of the habit, it is more difficult to return to the practice. Athletes understand how important daily practice is. It is the same for those who do physical therapy to recover from an injury. In the same way, the regular practice of one's faith makes it easier to develop a deeper relationship with God. Examining one's conscience and honestly looking at oneself daily, helps a person understand the need for celebrating the sacrament of penance, even more than once a year.
