Pentecost Sunday

Today, Pentecost Sunday, is called by many the birthday of the Church. Not only does the Lord imbue His followers and Apostles with the Holy Spirit, but He sends them out into the world to accomplish and further His mission.



In the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles is a reminder to us about living a stewardship way of life. The apostles are celebrating Pentecost, 50 days after Passover (which, for us, is Easter). Passover (as reported in the Book of Numbers in the Old Testament) was a time when the first bundle reaped from the barley harvest was presented to God; however, at Pentecost the first fruits of the wheat harvest were given to God.

This concept of giving the first fruits to God is at the heart of stewardship.

How do we share the bounty that has been given us?

The people of Jesus' time were deeply conscious of all their gifts, including the gifts of the earth. Everything we have comes from God. This is a day to contemplate that and to respond to it.

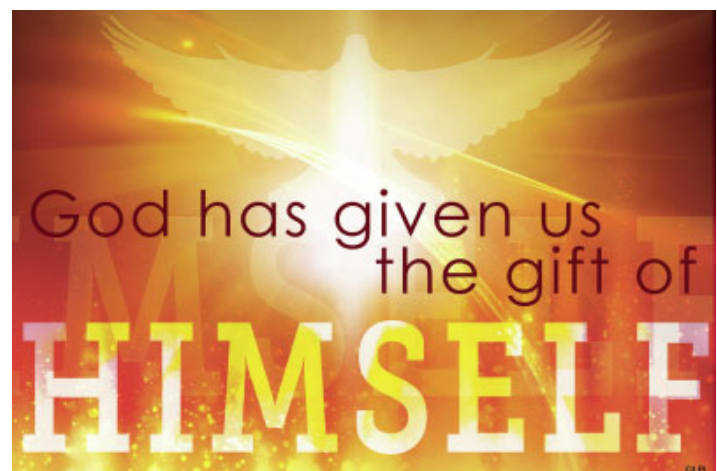

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Traditions Explained

Question:

Is it true that the feast of Pentecost, the celebration of the descent of the Spirit upon the followers of Jesus, was a Jewish pilgrimage festival?

Answer:

Pentecost is only mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles, written by the author of Luke's Gospel. John's Gospel speaks of Jesus breathing the Spirit upon his followers on Easter Sunday. Luke in Acts is the only one who unpacks the Easter events of Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, ascension, and the sending forth of the Spirit in a period of fifty days.

The Jews had three pilgrimage feasts--Passover, celebrating the Exodus from Egypt; Shavuot, or festival of Weeks, celebrating the giving of the law on Mount Sinai; and Sukkot, the harvest festival of Booths, commemorating the forty years of wandering in the desert. Shavuot celebrated the central covenant event in Jewish life--the giving of the law to Moses on Mount Sinai. The mighty wind, the shaking of the house in which the followers were gathered, along with the tongues of fire all reflect elements surrounding the giving of the law to Moses in the Book of Exodus. Luke was imaging this very backdrop and scenario in this significant event of the community being gifted with the Spirit. As the Torah was the way to God for Jews, so Jesus' Spirit was the guide, power, and path to God for his followers.



You've Got The App - Now What?

Here are a few things you can do



Last weekend we asked everyone to take a few minutes to download our new Saint Thomas More Mobile App. So far, we have had nearly 500 downloads! We are so happy so many of our parishioners have chosen to download the App.

Now that you have the Mobile App downloaded, you may be wondering what you can do with it.

The first thing you will notice is the home page of the App. Look at it like a Directory of Services. Here, by just touching on a particular square, you can find things like the daily readings to follow along with at Mass. You also can find many common Catholic prayers by touching the "Prayers" square. The prayers section includes the Mysteries of the Rosary, as well as many other Catholic prayers.

In the lower right corner you will see a "Blogs" square. Just touch it and it takes you to the most important news items pulled directly from the Saint Thomas More website. You also can choose the "News" square to get headlines from the Vatican News Service.

The most exciting thing for the App is the ability to send notifications. Notifications from Saint Thomas More will pop up on your phone much like a weather alert or a news headline. All of our ministry coordinators have the ability to send notifications. Which means they no longer have to keep an email group and constantly update it. As long as you have the App, you will get messages updating meeting times or other important ministry information. To be sure you don't miss out, please make sure you enable notifications on the App. By turning on notifications, you can receive immediate messages from ministry groups as well as from church staff.

To turn on notifications, simply touch the three parallel lines in the upper left corner of the home screen, then choose "notifications" by touching it. There you will see a list of all the groups available. Just touch the groups you want to be included in and you are all set. Make sure and turn on the General group as well. That is where we will post church wide messages of importance. If you miss a message you can always choose the "Messages" square on the home page and read past postings.

Ministry Coordinators need to be registered to send notifications to groups. If you are a Ministry Coordinator, make sure and email Patrick Kerr at patrick@stmore.org to get registered.

We hope you enjoy the new Mobile App. If at any time you have questions about the App, just touch the "Staff" square and send a message to either Patrick Kerr or Melisa Mast. We will be glad to answer any questions you may have.
