



#### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners-

Happy Feast of Pentecost! If we go back to the Old Testament or Hebrew Scriptures, we discover that Pentecost was one of the Jewish feast days. Only they didn't call it Pentecost. That's the Greek name. The Jews called it the Feast of Harvest or the Feast of Weeks. It is mentioned five places in the first five books—in Exodus 23, Exodus 24, Leviticus 16, Numbers 28, and Deuteronomy 16. It was the celebration of the beginning of the early weeks of harvest. In Palestine there were two harvests each year. The early harvest came during the months of May and June; the final harvest came in the Fall. Pentecost was the celebration of the beginning of the early wheat harvest, which meant that Pentecost always fell sometime during the middle of the month of May or sometimes in early June. As Christians, we believe the apostles received the gift of the Holy Spirit which enabled them to evangelize to those of other languages and cultures. We see the spread of the Church into Gentile territory bringing many people to the Christian faith. We are the recipients of these gifts and the faith through our Baptism and Confirmation and called to evangelize as well through word and deed.

Over the past few months, there has been some suggestions on what to do with the property at St. Thomas. One proposal was to use it as a soccer field. I approached the Pastoral Council, the Buildings and Grounds Committee, the Finance Council, and Catholic Mutual Insurance Company, our insurance carrier. There was much discussion and input. Some of our council members were in agreement, others were not. Catholic Mutual recommended that we NOT use this as a soccer field due to liability issues. Even though the Indianola Soccer Tribe would carry insurance, our parish would still be liable. Hence, after consultation with our councils and Catholic Mutual Insurance Company, we will NOT use this as a soccer field. The decision is final and there will be no further discussion!

Second, we were approached by some members of having a Prairie View. I approached our Pastoral Council, our Buildings and Grounds Committee, and the Finance Council for input. There was much discussion and input. Again, some were in agreement stating this be a good thing for the environment, that it could be used for graduation and wedding pictures, etc. Others were concerned about how this would be in the winter. Certainly, these are valid concerns. After much discussion and input from our Councils, I have decided to permit the Prairie View. Hence, the decision is final and there will be no further discussion on this matter!

I would like to thank those who have participated in the Annual Diocesan Appeal. I realize that many of you are making great sacrifices-with the Parish Capital Campaign, the Diocesan Capital Campaign, tithes, and trying to make ends meet with the provision of the basic necessities of food, shelter, and clothing. We are at 66 percent of our goal at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish. Our goal is \$52,400. We have received payments of \$30,900 as of May 15, 2015. Those who have not participated in this appeal are most welcome to help us meet our goal. Any gift would be greatly appreciated!

I want to thank our parishioners who have participated in the Annual Diocesan Appeal from Immaculate Conception, St. Mary's. Our goal is \$14,686. We have received gifts of \$7575 as of May 15, 2015. We are at 55.8 percent of our goal. Those who have not participated in this appeal are most welcome to help us meet our goal. Any gift would be greatly appreciated! Blessings and peace!


