ADMINISTRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

- **Baptism** • We welcome all families with young children. For your first step, you must become a registered, practicing, contributing member of St. Rose of Lima for at least 4 months with proven Mass attendance. Your second step is to contact Kathy in the office, 851-1874, to schedule and get a baptism packet. **Be sure you provide all the necessary documents 10 days prior to the baptism class.** Baptism class is the 2nd Thursday of every month at 6 PM. *Reservations are needed for the class.* At least one godparent must be a practicing Catholic. All baptisms are celebrated on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, & 4th Sunday of each month at 12 noon, after the 10:30 Mass.
- **Matrimony** • At least one party must be a registered, practicing member of St. Rose with at least 6 months active proven attendance at Mass. After this is accomplished, please call Jane Lucero to make an appointment to begin your 6 month marriage preparation process. *Please make no arrangements until after this appointment.* You may pick up a marriage packet in the parish office. *Engaged Encounter* weekend is required: www.renoee.org for dates, times and registration.
- **Anointing of the Sick** • It is best to call at the *beginning* of a serious illness or when surgery is first scheduled.
- **Funerals** • Upon the death of a loved one, please call the Parish Office to make arrangements, 851-1874.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

When we imagine the disciples cowering behind locked doors on the first Easter, it is a matter of the greatest urgency that the doors get opened. They are not locked in as if in prison; rather, they have chosen to marinate in fear. Both the lock and the key stand on their side of the door, in their control. Christ breaks through this significant barrier with a message of “Peace.” The risen Lord’s word propels them through the door and along the path leading to the consoling image of the community living in harmony in the first reading today. What do we pray for in our tradition? More than anything else, we pray for peace. Every Mass is an earnest prayer for peace with God, with self, with neighbor, and for peace in the world. Yet, curiously, the peace Christ offers is deeper than the mere absence of conflict. Our tradition treasures the memories of saints who were remarkably open to Christ’s gift of peace even in the maelstroms of history. St. Edith Stein and St. Maximillian Kolbe, martyrs of the Holocaust, are but two examples. At the eye of a fearful storm, they stand as witnesses to the power of Christ’s rising in our lives. —Rev. GOD'S WORD TODAY Easter changes everything. Listen carefully to today's Gospel passage, and notice the fact that this account includes Jesus breathing on his disciples. The same Greek word for breathing used in this passage also appears at the very beginning of the Bible. There, in Genesis, the Lord God breathes upon Adam, giving him life. In the Gospel passage, through this act of breathing on the disciples, the risen Jesus gives them new life. What does new life in the resurrected Christ look like? We need only look at the first reading to discover what a community of believers acts like when its members are living lives in the risen Christ. As we prepare to listen to the scriptures, let us pray that the breath of God will fill us with new life and help us live like the early Christian communities, when there was no needy person among them. 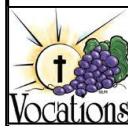

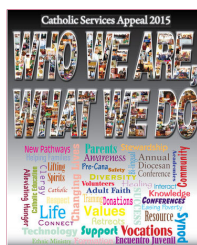

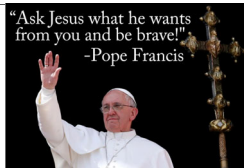

ISSUES OF PEACE & JUSTICE

On this 2nd Sunday of Easter, the opening line from the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles state, "The community of believers was of one heart and mind." Can we imagine such a state in our world today? St. Paul speaks of the Spirit of Truth who helps us to believe in the Son of God and follow His commandments which "are not burdensome." And we hear Jesus once again greet the apostles in the upper room with "Peace be with you."

"Conflict cannot be ignored or concealed. It has to be faced. But if we remain trapped in conflict, we lose our perspective, our horizons shrink and reality itself begins to fall apart. In the midst of conflict, we lose our sense of the profound unity of reality. When conflict arises, some people simply look at it and go their way as if nothing happened; they wash their hands of it and get on with their lives. Others embrace it in such a way that they become its prisoners; they lose their bearings, project onto institutions their own confusion and dissatisfaction and thus make unity impossible. But there is also a third way, and it is the best way to deal with conflict. It is the willingness to face conflict head on, to resolve it and to make it a link in the chain of a new process. 'Blessed are the peacemakers!' In this way it becomes possible to build communion amid disagreement, but this can only be achieved by those great persons who are willing to go beyond the surface of the conflict and to see others in their deepest dignity. This requires acknowledging a principle indispensable to the building of friendship in society: namely, that unity is greater than conflict. ... This principle, drawn from the Gospel, reminds us that Christ has made all things one in himself: heaven and earth, God and man, time and eternity, flesh and spirit, person and society. The sign of this unity and reconciliation of all things in him is peace. Christ 'is our peace.' The Gospel message always begins with a greeting of peace, and peace at all times crowns and confirms the relations between the disciples. Peace is possible because the Lord has overcome the world and its constant conflict 'by making peace through the blood of his cross.' But if we look more closely at these biblical texts, we find that the locus of this reconciliation of differences is within ourselves, in our own lives... The message of peace is not about a negotiated settlement but rather the conviction that the unity brought by the Spirit can harmonize every diversity. It overcomes every conflict by creating a new and promising synthesis" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, Pope Francis, #226, #227, #228, #229, #230)

PADRE SERRA SAYS:

How will you work out your life response to God? The National Coalition for Church Vocations has distributed a pamphlet containing general information on some of the many ways to continue God’s work. The following are some excerpts from that pamphlet. “Community” describes the life religious brothers and sisters choose.

Community enables the individual to reach out to others with the strength and courage that comes from knowing, “I don’t have to do it alone. Others stand with me in this. My abilities are complemented by their gifts, confidence, wisdom and vision.” In community, sisters and brothers live out their vowed commitments, knowing that, though each member is unique, the binding force in life is each one’s personal and communal relationship with Jesus.

Today, the three vows (celibacy, poverty and obedience) which most religious make in a public way, may seem to be out of step with an age of sexual revolution. They are considered inconsistent with the popular demand for more and better “things,” and with the ultimatums for the individual’s “personal rights.”

Celibacy is a gift and a promise to love very deeply and to express that love for others without using those physical expressions proper to marriage. The lives of many men and women religious are rich and loving within the context of celibate love as are the lives of happily married couples.

In a world waging war on poverty, men and women religious choose to live as Jesus did — simply. Because they share expenses and try to keep their personal and communal needs simple, they can get along very well on very little.

Then, there’s obedience. The obedience of sisters and brothers is to the God they love, and the ways to this love are not obscure.

God’s voice is heard in the many voices of community.

Everyone has a vocation; pray for yours.
