Eucharistic Adoration

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ,

Eucharistic Adoration is "God and Man reaching out for each other, at the same time!" Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. Pope St. John Paul II is credited as the igniter of the renewal of Eucharistic devotion. At the 1993 International Eucharistic Congress in Seville, Spain, Pope John Paul said he hoped for "the establishment of perpetual Eucharistic adoration in all parishes and Christian communities throughout the world."

In his 2003 encyclical Ecclesia de Eucharistia, he wrote: "The worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass is of inestimable value for the life of the Church. ... It is the responsibility of Pastors to encourage, also by their personal witness, the practice of Eucharistic adoration, and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in particular, as well as prayer of adoration before Christ present under the Eucharistic species" (No. 25).

Father Victor Warkulwiz from the Apostolate for Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in Bensalem, Pennsylvania, told "It brings an increase in spiritual life in a parish, a spiritual vitality. "That is the way you are going to change things in the world, by going for an hour a week and visiting Our Lord."

The spiritual lives of our families are strengthened through our Holy Hour. (Blessed John Paul II). Perpetual Adoration extends its influence far beyond the individual adorers, touching their homes and families and reaching out to the parish community and beyond. (Pope Paul VI). A Holy Hour in front of the Blessed Sacraments worth more than a thousand years of human glory. (St. Padre Pio) I would be very happy if all of my parishioners participate in every Holy Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, and visit the Blessed Sacrament every day. May God bless you.
