

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by a priest or deacon. Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Bishop William P. Callahan at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. The form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse, Office for Clergy; or on the diocesan website at: www.dioceseoflacrosse.com. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website.

Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception, St Joseph, and St John Cantius!

This last week I received a call from a priest friend of mine whom I studied with in seminary. He is from Rhode Island. In our conversation he told me that his parish has 14,000 members. I can't imagine his work load. On average in America there are about 2,000 Catholics per every priest. Large metro areas such as Joliet Diocese in Illinois are approaching about 10,000 Catholics per every priest, while rural dioceses hover closer to 1,000 Catholics per every priest.

l share this, partly cause I like numbers, but also because I feel blessed to be in the small and friendly communities that surround our three parishes. Because of our rural setting I am able to provide a more personal touch as minister to each of you. Likewise, I am also able to reach outside of the parish walls and meet people within the community. Thus thank you to everyone who has invited me to community events. Please keep thinking of me when something is happening.

Our Gospel this week speaks about the feeding of the five-thousand with just five loaves and two fish. When we live a life for Christ the small daily offerings we offer to God are multiplied and in his providence bear abundant fruit. When we offer the little we have, God can provide amazing blessings.

We come to church for many reasons. But one of the primary reasons we come is to rest for an hour in the presence of God. The gentleness and love of God at Holy Mass helps calm our hectic and noisy lives. In no other place can we find the same rest and peace. When we place ourselves in the presence of God we begin to experience healing as we hear his gentle and tender love God.

l encourage you therefore in your walk with the Lord. He is loving you abundantly wherever you find yourself. I am so happy to be here with you. Please reach out if you are in need of anything. May God in his love continue to bless and protect you.

Please pray for me as I continue the beautiful blessing of shepherding your parishes! I am definitely keeping you all in prayer!
