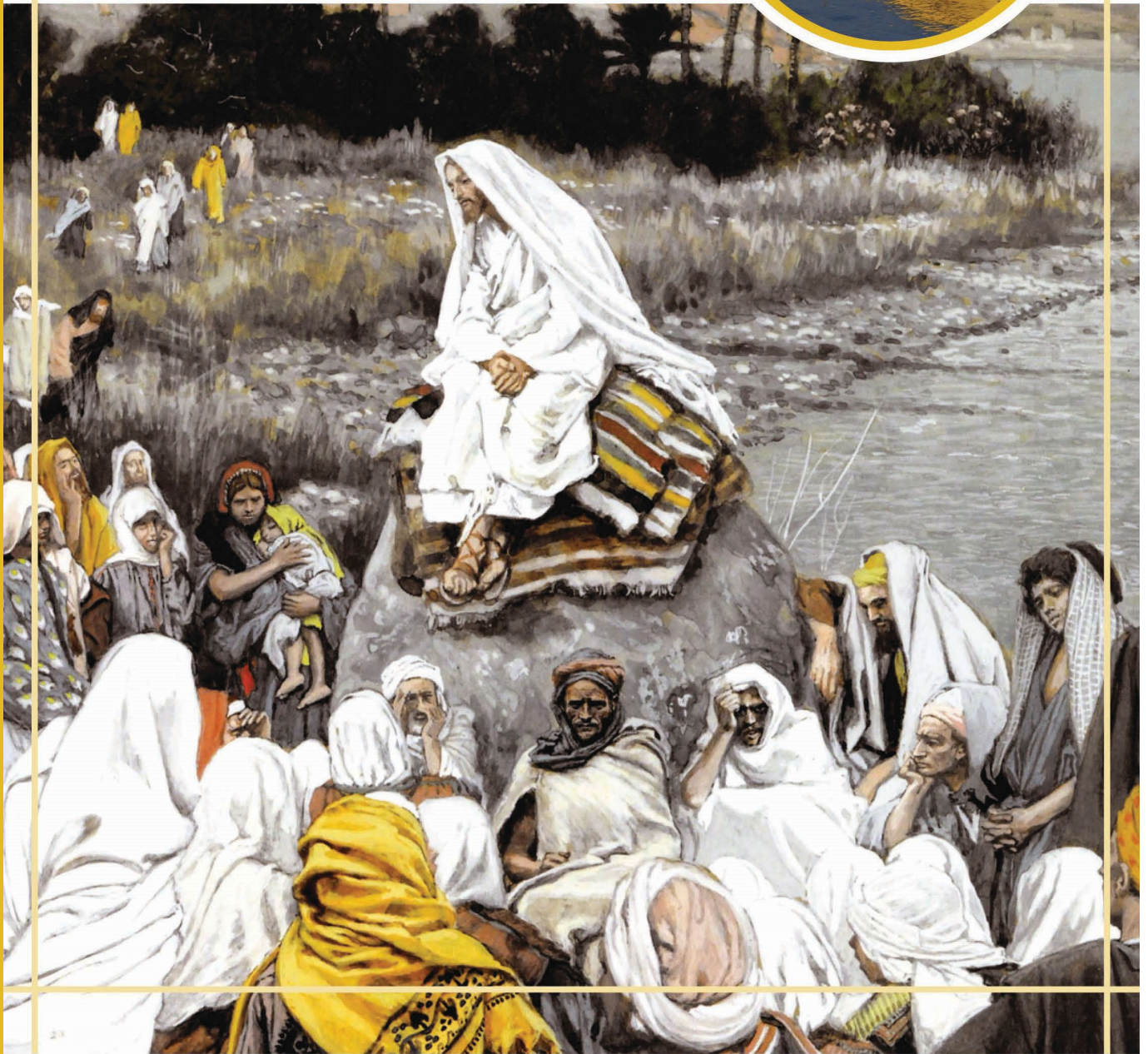

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners!

I have been quoting Matthew Kelly several times during my homilies already. You probably remember his standing on stewardship in the Catholic Church. It simply has to happen when we want the Church to do what Christ wanted it to. (We often talk about the Church as The Bride of Christ. Christ want us to take care of HER, by taking care of the Church; we follow Christ.)

When we specifically talk about St. Hugh Church, we must look at it from the spiritual and other perspectives. All have to be covered. St. Hugh has many needs that you all are aware of. It is like having a house, but for many families who come here to be nourished in so many ways.

I am aware of the 90-plus year parish history. So many have come here to be served, and hopefully they always have found what they needed. Today we continue the many traditions of the past; and we look forward to the future that that we are creating now. My wish is that this place will always be the "rock" that brings people closer to Christ.

There are many blessings that are present at St. Hugh. So many people are becoming new Catholics here. So many Sacraments happen here. So many social functions are being held here. But this is still Earth, 2018! Things within our church and the other parish buildings break, age, and need attention. The cost of energy and other regular services are not low. Regular life happens 24/7! Within your household you always find something to do, but also something to fix. The same demands hit St. Hugh Parish. St. Hugh is a larger household that needs attention daily. These days, many other Catholic Churches observe very similar needs! I am aware about some needs that need to be taken care of in the near future. I will talk about them a little later in the year. My main concern for today, is the gap in St. Hugh finances!!!

The parish is paying bills but the difference between what comes in and what is needed is substantial at the moment. Our income does not cover the regular parish expenses. Chris, our business manager has prepared some numbers for you to look at. Please look at these carefully!

To help the parish to meet our financial demands, I would like to ask you to increase your donations. Please consider adding between 10-25% (**or very minimum of \$5 per week**) to your "Sunday offerings." Please try to give at least \$5 per week more. In this case use the "heart method." So if possible, use your heart to ask yourself,

1. "How much can you add to your regular giving?"
2. You should be comfortable to do this increase! I am aware that you have to meet many life demands as well. Always plan it in your budget!
3. It is always a good idea to talk to your spouse or anyone who lives in the same household as you do. No rush!
4. Remember that giving "from the heart" is not supposed to be regretted later, but enjoyed.

Yes, it is a financial decision; but it builds a bridge between today and tomorrow! The Church will count on it as an "in the long run" or "long range" commitment.

I understand that many of you have been giving generously for years. Some families have been parishioners here for generations! Thank you so much for your kindness and generosity!

May the Good Lord continue His Blessings upon you and your Families.

Treasures from our Tradition

The American Revolution cleared the way for freedom of religion in the former colonies, since the colonies had always been a more religiously tolerant place than the old country. Even so, colonial laws restricted the practice of the Catholic faith, and just as in England, Americans who desired to be priests or nuns had to go to the Netherlands or France. As political storm clouds gathered in France, an American woman, Mother Bernardina Matthews, the prioress of the Hoogstraeten Carmel in Holland, made a brave move. With two other American nuns, her nieces, and a Dutch sister, she came to Port Tobacco, Maryland, in 1790. Within twenty years the community had grown to twenty, although by 1823 their farm failed and they had to move to Baltimore and open a school. The Carmelite order requires contemplation and cloister, so in time the school was closed. The Port Tobacco land had long since been sold, but in 1976 a community of nuns was able to return thanks to loyal neighbors who had worked for forty years for their restoration. Today, our original American convent is fully alive in prayer, hard work, and strong community.
