1. The Eucharist (Holy Communion) is one of the Sacraments in the Roman Catholic Church!

We believe that during the transubstantiation moment on the altar, the bread changes into the real Body of Christ and the wine changes into His real Blood.

That is the gift that Christ wants us to receive often during our lifetime.

We relive the last Supper every time when we come to the Mass. We truly are participating in that particular moment when we receive Christ in the form of the Eucharist! It is really HIM, it is HIM alive. (Matthew 26:17-30)

We will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our Church before 4 pm Saturday Vigil Mass this Coming Advent.

And ...more opportunities will come later in the new year.

More details will be available before that season.

By adoring Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, we can ask for so much and we also can say "Thank You" for all the Lord does for us here at St. Hugh.

2. I would like to offer to all who require home or hospital visits an option of being on my "First Friday List." It is an old tradition that encourages all the people who cannot physically visit the Church anymore (either permanently or temporarily), to be visited by the pastor once a month on the First Friday. I will come to your home.

Usually the visit includes distribution of Holy Communion, Confession, counseling and more.

For those who are interested, please call the office so the First Friday List can be created. I would like to start my visits in the month of August.

Of course, we also have Ministers of Care who serve in this parish when needed to help with Holy Communion distribution. I just would like you to know that one more option will be available.

The Prophet's Profit

If you want to compare miracles in the first reading and the gospel, Elisha did his first, but Jesus did it better. Elisha had a hundred people to feed with twenty barley loaves and a handful of fresh grain. Jesus had five thousand people and only five loaves and a couple fish. So was Jesus trying to show up Elisha?

Neither Jesus nor Elisha ever did a miracle for their own benefit. When Elisha cure the kings servant, he refused to accept a gift, because it would imply that Elisha did the miracle, while the prophet knew that God had cured him. Jesus refused to let the crowds make him a king.

The miracle of feeding the five thousand was not done just for the crowd. He was using it to teach the disciples something important. He knew there would be times when they felt overwhelmed, so he showed them what God can do with our meager abilities.

There are millions of people hungry for the good news that Jesus brings to the world. Remember the miracle of the loaves when you only have a few dollars to give to the missions, or when you're not sure you know enough to teach someone about Jesus. And remember that you do those things, not to make you look holy, but to let God show his loving power.

Saint of the Day



July 29. Saint Martha had the privilege of being a personal friends of Jesus. She also expressed her deep faith in Jesus at the time of her brother's death. Friends are there for us in happy times and sad.

July 30. Blessed Solanus Casey became one of Detroit's best-known priests, even though he was not allowed to preach formally or to hear confessions. Difficulties with studies led to his being limited in some areas of ministry, but he certainly shone in others. This well-beloved friar is a modern day example of humility and perseverance.

July 31. Founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Saint Ignatius of Loyola, like Saint Francis of Assisi, had a conversion experience while recuperating from a serious illness. Being a military man, the Rule of Life that Saint Ignatius wrote for his followers shows the discipline and rigor of a soldier, but a soldier of faith with the mercy and compassion of the Gospel. The method of discernment developed by Saint Ignatius is used to this day by many in the Church.

August 1. Saint Alphonsus Liguori was a great moral theologian as well as the founder of the Redemptorists. He suffered at the hands of some Redemptorists who betrayed his dream. Even the saints have difficulties in this life.





Treasures from our Tradition

Last Wednesday, the greatest pilgrimage in our tradition ended with the feast of Saint James at his shrine in Compostela, Spain. Every year, as many as a hundred thousand persons walk a portion of the medieval way of the pilgrim, earning the right to wear the scallop shell symbol of this journey of faith. In legend, this city on the northern coast of Spain is the final resting place of the apostle, and the full name of the cathedral is "Saint James of the Field of Stars." There is a tradition that Saint James the Great preached there.

In the Roman Catholic tradition, the pilgrimage, like any procession, is a symbol, life's journey distilled, a powerful sign of our journey toward a certain goal. The perils of the road, the support of companions, the contemplative slower pace of life, have the potential to transform and renew the pilgrims in ways that last a lifetime. Along the way, the distinctions between rich and poor fall away, and everyone shares humble rustic food and stops for the night in hostels or under the stars. After a long walk, the experience of entering through the great doors into the vast cathedral filled with incense, light, and song is a foretaste of heaven.

The pilgrims often say that their whole lives are redirected toward that moment of entry into the heavenly Jerusalem. The most memorable feature of the cathedral is called the botafumeiro, an incense burner on pulleys and chains that sweeps through the cathedral in immense circles, swirling clouds of sweet-smelling incense around the vast nave.
