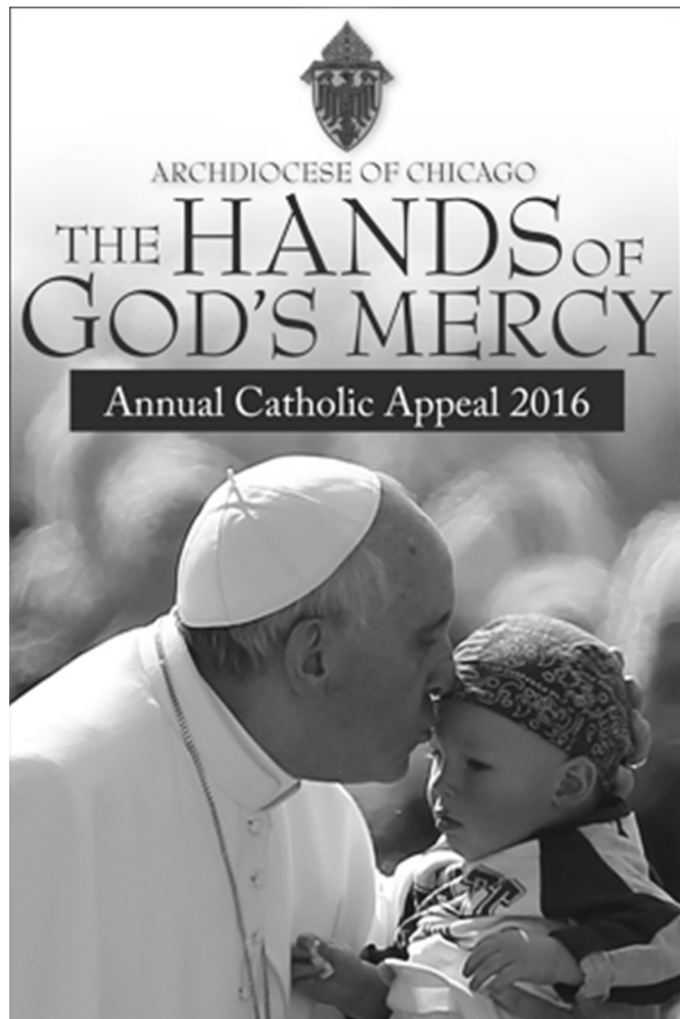

From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This weekend, the parishes of the Archdiocese of Chicago are conducting the in-pew phase of the 2016 Annual Catholic Appeal: *The Hands of God's Mercy*. Thank you for your support of Church in Cook and Lake Counties.

January 31 is the start of Catholic Schools Week. Contact the individual schools to learn more. The Archdiocese of Chicago lists twenty-four elementary schools within a five mile radius of the 60534 zip-code. www.archchicago.org

Tuesday is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. February 2, forty days after Christmas, has been given the name *Candlemas* since one tradition associated with this feast is the blessing of candles used in prayer. Parishioners are invited to bring candles used for devotional purposes to the 10:30am Mass. These will be blessed together with the candles that we use in church.

Since 1997, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord has been recognized as the World Day for Consecrated Life for women and men in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples.

The international Year of Consecrated Life which began Advent 2014 concludes on Tuesday.



February 3 is the optional memorial of Saint Blaise/Blase. Using unlit candles that were blessed the previous day, Wednesday's celebration includes the blessing of throats. We will invoke the intercession of the martyred bishop following the homily at the 10:30am Mass. This is also the baptismal name-day of Archbishop Cupich; pray for him.

Lent is coming. February 10 is Ash Wednesday. Ashes will be distributed during the 10:30am Mass and at Prayer Services at 4:00 and 7:00pm.

Next week's bulletin will have details about Lent:

- Fasting and abstaining from meat
- Stations of the Cross on Fridays
- Catholic Relief Services' *Operation Rice Bowl*
- Jubilee of Mercy and additional opportunities for Sacramental Penance (Reconciliation)
- Rites for those preparing for Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil and during the Easter Season.

Since 1993, the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes is recognized as World Day of the Sick: a special time of prayers and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and reminding us to see in our sick brothers and sisters the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of humankind. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated during the 10:30am Mass on Thursday February 11. Kindly make this communal celebration known to those who would benefit from receiving this sacrament at this time.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

The number of unaccompanied children apprehensions at the US-Mexico border in October-November increased from 5,129 (2014) to 10,588

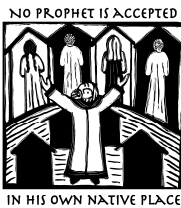

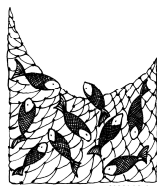

A communal celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be part of the 10:30am Mass on Thursday February 11 - the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes and World Day of the Sick.

Jubilee of Mercy: December 8, 2015 - November 20, 2016



Rave reviews greeted Jesus' first hometown homily proclaiming a year of God's mercy, but the mood turned violent when he went on to declare that God's mercy embraces outsiders; it rejects distinctions between citizen and foreigner, acceptable and unworthy, even sinner and saint. Far from being anyone's personal possession, God's kingdom is open to everyone, God's love unconditional, God's mercy boundless. By this Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis repeats Jesus' challenge in today's Gospel to broaden our horizons until our vision matches Jesus' vision of every sinner as a potential saint, and each suffering stranger as our neighbor. Jesus, says Pope Francis, continually went beyond the law, keeping company with public sinners and even sharing meals with them to demonstrate that God's mercy is "the beating heart of the

Gospel" (Misericordiae Vultus, 12). To be truly Jesus' disciples, such unconditional love and boundless mercy must also be at the center of all we say and do.

Presentation of the Lord by Paul Turner

The Presentation of the Lord pulls many favorite mementos from the Catholic cupboard: candles, blessings, Christmas and church. The Mass of February 2 begins with a blessing of lighted candles held by the faithful, who glow with the memory of the birth of Jesus.

The origins of the feast lie in ancient Jewish custom.

On the 40th day after childbirth, parents brought the infant to the temple to present him/her to the Lord and to purify the mother. St. Luke tells us that Joseph and Mary sacrificed two birds for the occasion after the birth of Jesus. Count up 40 days after Christmas and you'll come to February 2. Until the 1960s, we used to call this day "The Purification of Mary." The title changed for several reasons. We no longer believe that women who give birth need purification, and the true significance of the feast concerns Jesus coming to the Temple. He is the Promised One, whose light will shine, beaming rays of hope to all the world. Also on the old calendar, this feast closed the Christmas season. Now we end the Christmas season with the Baptism of the Lord. So, even though the date for the Presentation still depends on Christmas, it has become a feast of ordinary time. Since it is a feast of the Lord, it takes precedence even when it falls on Sunday.

The candles you hold for the blessing may come from your parish, or you may bring your own from home. If you like to use blessed candles for household prayer throughout the year, here is your chance to get them. On the day following this feast, our calendar permits the option of commemorating St. Blase, a bishop and martyr of the early church. Legend has it that he once freed a child from choking, and while imprisoned under persecution he received light from friends who visited his cell with candles. Our church still uses candles from the Presentation of the Lord in the blessing of the faithful's throats on St. Blase's Day. Blessed candles in our churches and homes signify the living presence of Christ in our community. With Christ as our light we warm a lost and wintry world. Treasures from our tradition

For the first four centuries or so, there seems not to have been a sense of marriage as a church institution. Christians followed civil law, which kept the wedding in a family setting. Bishops wanted people to be good citizens insofar as possible, and so they recognized the government's role in marriage. In general, they expected Christians to know that marriage was good, that marriage to other Christians was best, and to take it easy on the wild wedding parties. They agreed that marriage was a divine institution, that Christ blessed it especially, and they loved referring to the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana. Still, even when Christianity became the official religion of the empire in 380, marriage remained a family matter.

On wedding days people gathered in the bride's house, where the father would "give her hand" to her husband, draping a garland of flowers over the couple. There were no official words to say, there was no blessing to be given. Everyone walked in procession to the bride's new home for the concluding rites and the feast. In the Eastern Empire, it soon became customary to invite a priest or bishop to give a blessing at the meal or the day before. It was a nice thing to do, completely optional, but had a "photo-op" feel to it that was widely emulated. Before long, at least in the East, it looked as if the priest were joining the couple in marriage and blessing the union.

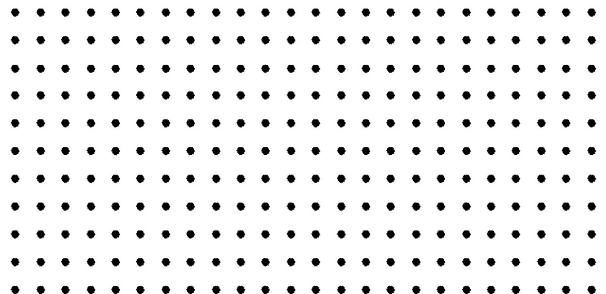
