



## THE PROCESS OF SELECTING A NEW PASTOR FOR SAINT HUGH PARISH

The process of determining where a priest will serve as a pastor in the Archdiocese of Chicago is prayerfully and carefully facilitated by the Cardinal, the Vicar Bishops of each Vicariate, the Deans, a priest who coordinates priest placement activities full-time and the Priests' Placement Board which consists of eight Archdiocesan priests. Members of the Priests' Placement Board meet weekly from September through June to assess the needs of parishes in light of placing pastors and associate pastors at parishes. Careful attention is given to determine how the Holy Spirit is calling particular priests to serve the needs of specific parishes in the Archdiocese. The process is focused on assessing each prospective pastor's talents and skills and matching them with the needs of specific parishes. The input of the staff, lay leadership and parishioners of each parish is extremely valuable to the process.

### The process is outlined in brief below:

1. A Parish Consultation has been scheduled at Saint Hugh Parish for **Thursday, November 30, 2017**. Two members of the Priests Placement Board, the Bishop, and the Dean will have three separate meetings with the following groups in your parish to gather input about the qualities needed in your new pastor:
  - a. 4pm – meeting with the Parish Staff and Permanent Deacons.
  - b. 6pm – meeting with parish leadership (members of Parish Council, Finance Committee, etc.)
  - c. 7pm – meeting with all interested parishioners in a Town Hall format to discuss the strengths and challenges of the parish and the qualities needed in their next pastor. Input from parishioners is very important in the process. The present pastor and current staff members are asked not to attend this session so as to allow people to express their opinions openly.
2. A Parish Profile is compiled from information received at these parish meetings along with information regarding the parish's mission statement, ministries, finances and other facts about the parish. Prospective pastors who are interested in the parish get a copy of this parish profile to help them in their discernment.
3. Priests who are pursuing a pastorate complete a profile outlining their specific talents and skills and how the Holy Spirit is calling them to serve at their next assignment. Members of the Priests Placement Board will interview specific prospective pastors to determine their eligibility for being pastor of Saint Hugh Parish.
4. After sessions of formal prayer and several weeks of discernment the Priest Placement Board will make a recommendation to Bishop Manz and Cardinal Cupich on which priest they recommend to become the next pastor of Saint Hugh Parish. In a consultative manner, Cardinal Cupich will make the final decision about who he will appoint as the next pastor of Saint Hugh Parish. This will happen in the Spring.

## From the Pastor's Desk

Throughout November we pray for those who have gone before us. Our Book of Remembrance is near the baptismal font and Paschal Candle.

Thursday November 23 is a national holiday. To my thinking, Thanksgiving Day is a holy day. The obligation in this case is personal. Because Mass on Thanksgiving Day has always been part of my family's holiday tradition, I cannot imagine not going to Mass on Thanksgiving Day. I strongly encourage you to include the Eucharist as part of this national day of gratitude. If you are celebrating locally, please make plans to give thanks to God at the 10:30am Mass here at Saint Hugh. If you are traveling this upcoming

holiday weekend, consider worshipping in the parish of your relatives or friends.

The bulletin cover has your formal invitation and an explanation of the process to find the eleventh pastor of Saint Hugh Parish. You are strongly encouraged to participate in the process, expressing your ideas and suggestions about the qualities you deem important in my successor. At the same time, I invite you to pray for the priests in this transition process. We are relying on the Holy Spirit to direct us to pastorates that best serve the needs of the local church as the parishes of the Archdiocese move ahead with *Renew My Church*.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

### Prayer (Luke 16:19-21)

**Cremation** by Paul Turner  
Catholic Church law used to forbid cremation, but it now makes allowance for the practice. The church recommends that the bodies of the faithful be buried, but it permits cremation if the reasons for choosing that method are not contrary to Christian teaching.

Viewing the body of the deceased naturally recalls the person's deeds of kindness and testimony of faith. It brings to mind our belief that the human body is a temple of the Holy Spirit and the heir to glory at the resurrection of the dead. Because of the reverence owed the body, the Catholic Church still prefers its burial at the time of death. When cremation is chosen, the remains merit the same respect accorded to the body. They deserve a worthy vessel and a respectful means of transport.

There are several options for the funeral liturgy. For example, the liturgy may take place before cremation, so the community may pray in the presence of the body. In that case, the rite of committal would follow cremation. In other cases, cremation and committal may precede the funeral Mass. The funeral liturgy may also happen in the presence of the cremated remains, if permitted by the diocesan bishop. In that case, the Mass proceeds as usual, but covering the remains with a pall is omitted.

The church strongly recommends that cremated remains be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium rather than scattered or kept in a private home. Public cemeteries call to mind the resurrection of the dead and focus our prayer for the deceased.

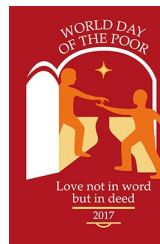

## Treasures

### from our tradition

Earlier this autumn, we looked at how our Eucharistic Prayers have been enriched by the approval of several new prayers to augment the old Roman Canon. For us, there are the four standard prayers, three for Masses with Children, and the most recent addition, the former Swiss Eucharistic Prayer with four alternative forms (now known as the Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for Various Needs and Occasions).

We also have two Eucharistic Prayers for Masses of Reconciliation. The source for these two prayers is the request by many bishops for a special prayer for the "Holy Year" of 1975. Originally, the committee in charge was commissioned to write a single prayer, but the theme proved so rich that it gave rise to two. The first is based on and develops biblical texts on reconciliation. The second starts with the experience of living in today's fractured world, and how the Spirit calls us to reconciliation and peace. Not everyone was happy with all this creativity, saying that if too many were published, it would be difficult for the Vatican to control further requests. Everyone thought the pope would put strict limits on the prayers, but in the end he said he was willing to open doors that had long been closed. Although he approved them for a period of only three years, they were never formally removed from the Sacramentary and have been incorporated into the new Roman Missal.
