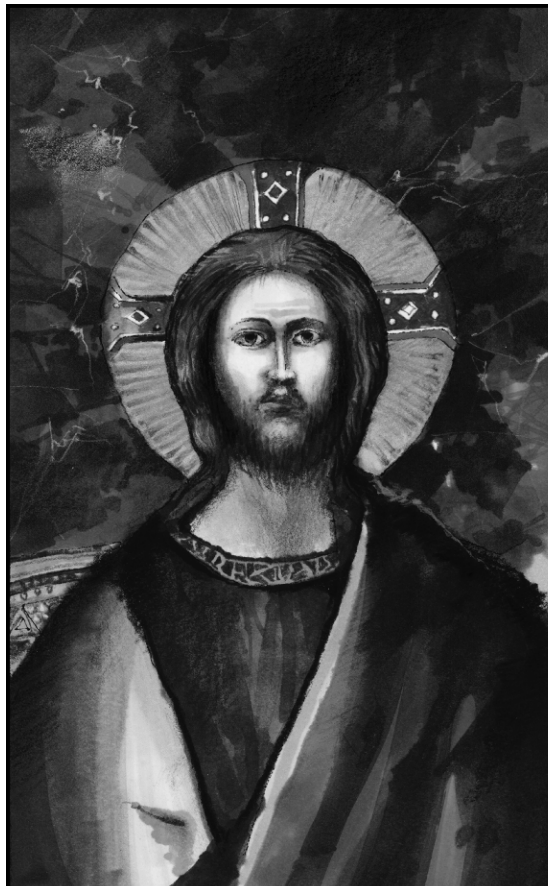

From the Pastor's Desk

Today, the final Sunday of the liturgical year, is celebrated as the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. A new year of Grace begins with the First Sunday of Advent, next weekend.

Founded in 1969, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) is the official anti-poverty program of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. Our bishops wanted to create an intentional response that would help lift communities out of poverty through community-controlled self-help organizations and educate Catholics on the conditions and causes of poverty. CCHD works to break the cycle of poverty by supporting low-income people as they participate in decisions that affect their lives, families and communities. Through this weekend's collection, Catholics throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago have the opportunity to invest in groups that animate the Social Teachings of the Church in the public arena. On Sunday November 22 we institute a weekly Holy Hour at 4:00pm. Our deacon Frank Mamolella offers this prayer opportunity which includes adoration before the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction. He will incorporate readings, prayers and responses following the format used daily by the Missionaries of Charity.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church.

From the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (no. 2628):

Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory," respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications.

Thursday November 26 is a national holiday. To my thinking Thanksgiving Day is a holy day. The obligation in this case is personal. Because Mass on Thanksgiving Day has always been part of my family's holiday tradition, I cannot imagine not going to Mass on Thanksgiving Day. I strongly encourage you to include the Eucharist as part of this national day of gratitude. If you are celebrating locally, please make plans to give thanks to God at the 10:30am Mass here at Saint Hugh. If you are traveling this upcoming holiday weekend, consider worshipping in the parish of your relatives or friends.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

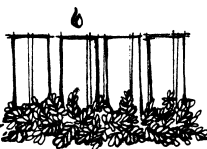

God's Word Today



Thanksgiving Day by Paul Turner

Thanksgiving Day may be observed with a special Mass at Catholic churches throughout the United States of America. The day is a secular holiday with strong religious roots. This day implies that there is a God, that God is provident, that we recognize what God has done, that we can address God about our blessings, and that the best thing we can say is "Thanks."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops includes this day on the liturgical calendar for the country as an optional memorial. Parishes are therefore not obliged to observe it. They may celebrate whatever weekday Mass would otherwise fall on that day this year. But most parishes choose to make this a special Mass of thanksgiving. If anyone knows how to give thanks to God, the church should know how to do it best. The very word eucharist means "thanksgiving." There is no more fitting way to celebrate this feast than to join in prayer at the table of the Lord.

The Roman Missal offers a set of prayers that the priest may use for a Thanksgiving Day Mass, including a special preface to open the eucharistic prayer. Readings may be taken from the lectionary's Mass "In Thanksgiving to God." There are several choices here, so the readings you hear may change from year to year.

Some churches observe other customs. There may be a food collection at Mass so that those who have trouble paying for groceries will benefit from the generosity of the faithful. Or parishes might invite you to bring some of the food you will eat at your own table this day. In that case, you may hear the Blessing of Food on Thanksgiving Day from the Book of Blessings.

Treasures from our tradition

For good reason, Americans have been ambivalent about "kings" for many years, even long before George III's troops were sent packing in 1776. To say Christ is our King is to make a statement not about our politics, but about the dignity of our own identity. At our baptism, the crown of our head was once slathered (or at last dabbed) with oil while the Church prayed "as Christ was anointed priest, prophet and king, so may you live always as his body." To celebrate Christ's kingship, then, is to claim our own identity.

Your head was anointed just as Samuel poured oil over David's head. David had his gifts, but he was no prize, and perhaps that might comfort you as you think about your call, out of the messiness of your own life, to stretch into a lifestyle that is marked by worship, by prophetic speech and deeds, and the kingly ability to fashion a world (or at least a patch of it) where relationships are marked by justice, mercy, and cultivation of the good. It is precisely because of this kingly role that our faith community has something to say about the environment, about the dignity of human life, just wages, access to health care and education, the building of peace, and avoidance of war. In a few weeks' time we will hymn the coming of the "newborn king," but today we sketch out the meaning of his reign, and our own incorporation into his work for the life of the world.
