

## From the Pastor's Desk

This Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time is the follow-up weekend for the 2018 Annual Catholic Appeal. Those who were unable to make an in-pew pledge last weekend are asked to do so today. The ushers have the needed pledge forms and pencils. Thank you for supporting the work of the larger church.

As the second Sunday of February, today is also celebrated as World Marriage Day. A prayer *For Our Marriage*, provided by Worldwide Marriage Encounter, is found on page five of this bulletin.

For the past twenty-five years, February 11 (when not a Sunday, the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes) is designated as World Day of the Sick:

*The Church's service to the sick and those who care for them must continue with renewed vigor, in fidelity to the Lord's command and following the eloquent example of her Founder and Master. The theme for this year's Day of the Sick is provided by the words that Jesus spoke from the Cross to Mary, his Mother, and to John: "Woman, behold your son ... Behold your mother. And from that hour the disciple took her into his home".*

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday February 14. This is a day of fasting and abstaining from meat. The complete Lenten regulations appear below. As a sign of the start of this penitential season, ashes will be distribute during the 10:30am Mass on Wednesday and during a 4:00pm Prayer Service.

The schedules for ashes at the parishes in our Renew My Church grouping appear on page four.

The Church provides this description: *The annual Lenten season is the fitting time to climb the holy mountain of Easter. The Lenten season has a double character, namely to prepare both catechumens and faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. The catechumens, both with the rite of election and scrutinies, and by catechesis, are prepared for the celebration of the sacraments of Christian initiation; the faithful, ever more attentive to the word of God and prayer, prepare themselves by penance for the renewal of their baptismal promises.*

The forty days of Lent focuses on three traditional disciplines:

**Prayer:** Eucharist (Sunday, daily, RCIA), Penance (communal service 7:00pm on Tuesday February 27), Stations (Fridays at 7:00pm).

**Fasting:** (regulations below)

**Almsgiving:** CRS Rice Bowl, Saint Vincent DePaul Society, and other acts of kindness or charity.

### Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

## Treasures from our tradition

Today's Gospel centers on the plight of a leper and Jesus' response of healing. In Hawaii, the bacterium that causes leprosy probably entered from China in the mid-1800s, and the native islanders were susceptible to the dreaded disease. In 1866, the government literally dumped the sufferers on a remote and virtually inaccessible island peninsula with towering cliffs. Thrown off ships into the sea, the sick people were told to swim for the beach and head for caves, and for seven years the only supplies were similarly cast into the sea to drift ashore. It was then, 1873, that a thirty-three-year-old Belgian priest, Damien de Veuster, went voluntarily to Kalaupapa. Before long, he cajoled the government into funding his mission and its hospital, built a village with proper homes and sanitation, and recruited Mother Marianne Cope to bring sisters from Syracuse, New York, to nurse the sick. Damien, who eventually died of leprosy, has been canonized, and Mother Marianne as well.

Although leprosy has been curable since the 1940s, today a few patients remain in their lifelong home, now a national historic site. The peninsula is still utterly isolated from the outside world, and the speed limit for the few cars there is 5 mph since there's nowhere to go! The hospital is still well-staffed and equipped, but access is regulated and visitors must take an official tour, often involving a descent down the cliffs by "Molakai mule." There are few places on earth that evoke the healing power of Jesus, or our call to follow the Healer, more than Damien's beloved island mission.
