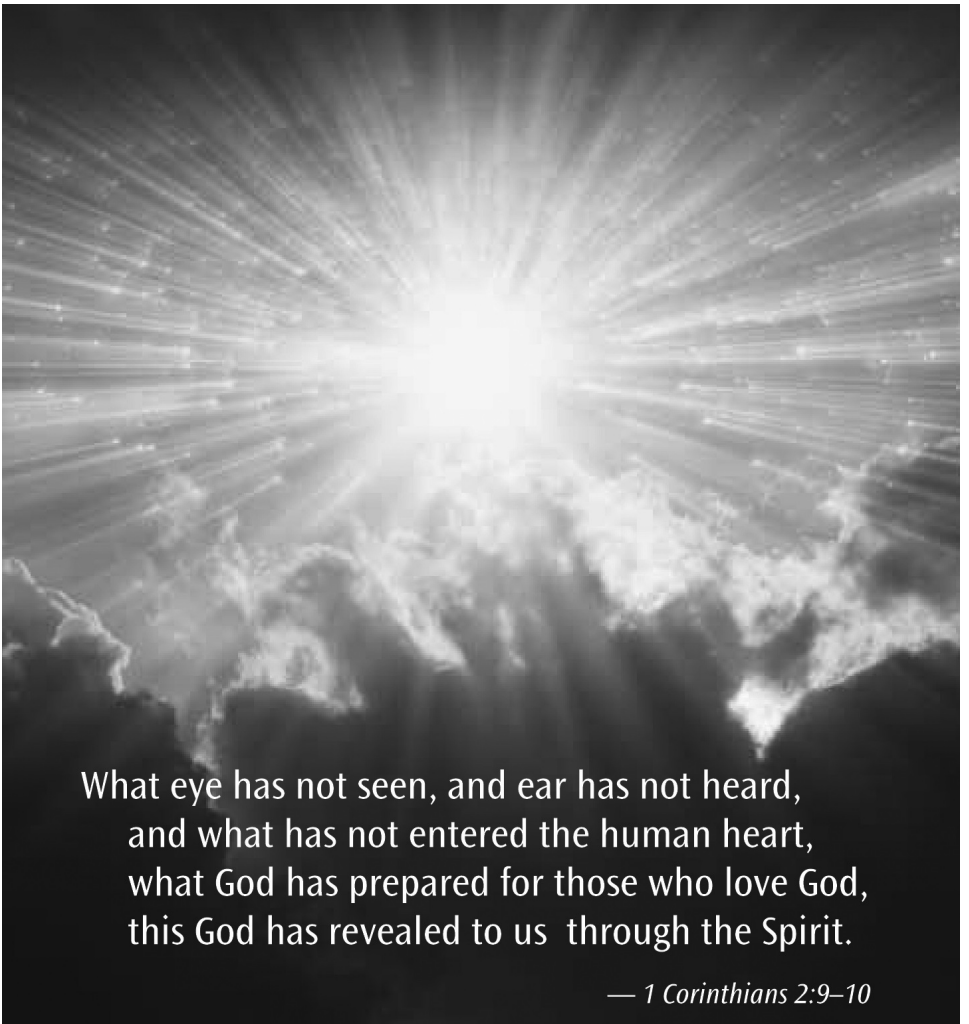

## From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. As the Sunday on or before Valentine's Day, the second Sunday of February is recognized as World Marriage Day. February 12 is the birthday of Illinois' favorite son, Abraham Lincoln. Those of us of a certain age remember when the birthday of the sixteenth president and the birthday of our first president, George Washington (2/22), were both celebrated in the Land of Lincoln. Since 1971, Presidents' Day has been celebrated on the third Monday of February. Note that the parish office will be closed on February 20 for the national holiday.

In April 2014 we were invited to make a pledge to the To Teach Who Christ Is (TTWCI) capital campaign of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The TTWCI case for Saint Hugh addressed three parish needs.

We first addressed safety needs with improvements that included resealing and restriping of our parking lots.

Then, we addressed communication needs with an updated phone system and improved WiFi.

Now, with the TTWCI pledge period winding down and with the approval of our parish finance committee, we are making the needed improvements to our worship space: including the repairing and the repainting of all painted surfaces in the church and replacement flooring under the pews.

The painters were scheduled to begin working on February 6 and are to complete their work by February 24. The flooring is scheduled to be installed over this weekend and next. Our parish website will have updated information.

Despite the inconveniences for a few weeks, this third and final phase of TTWCI is intended to benefit our worship by enhancing that sacred space where we come to know, in Word and Sacrament, who Christ is.

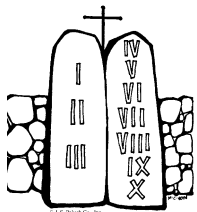

## Treasures from our tradition

By the early 1950s some scholars were calling for the restoration of Communion of the faithful on Good Friday, since by then only a priest received, consuming the host from the Holy Thursday repository. In 1955 the new Good Friday liturgy was timed to begin at three o'clock everywhere, and included the option of Holy Communion, but without the Precious Blood that had originally been part of the liturgy. Today, there is increasing debate among theologians. Some feel that it would be better to fast from the Eucharist on Good Friday, focusing on the mystery of the cross and highlighting the Easter Communion. Others say that this Communion infuses the sadness of the day with awareness of Christ's victory. It is not a day of mourning, of course, and the Passion according to John grounds the liturgy in a sense of Christ's victory over death and the triumph of the cross. The tradition is rich and varied, and we are still in the early stages of recovering an ancient way of doing things.

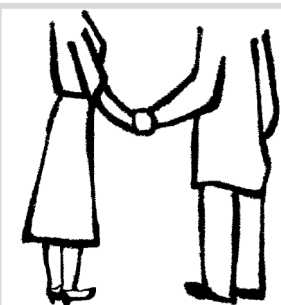
Why do we call the day "good"? The English and Dutch languages share this name, and its origin stems from the name "God's Friday." The traditional name for the day in Latin is *Feria VI* in *Parasceve*, which translates as "The Sixth Day of the Week of Preparation." Other languages make do with "Holy Friday." In another part of England, as in Denmark, the people used to call it "Long Friday," a good description for a quiet day without work and no chance for play or a good meal!

## Simple Catholic Wedding by Paul Turner

A Catholic wedding can be a simple affair. When people think of a Catholic wedding, they often imagine an extravagant event with expensive clothes, multiple attendants, many ministers, and an elegant ceremony. Many beautiful weddings have happened that way. Others are done more simply.

Sadly, some couples who are otherwise ready for marriage put off the wedding because they cannot

afford the ceremony, the reception, and other societal expectations. They may even be tempted to choose a civil ceremony at a courthouse just to avoid the complications of a Catholic wedding.

But a Catholic wedding does not have to be big or expensive. The ceremony can be conducted as simply as a typical daily mass or prayer service in a parish church. Special clothes and a procession are not necessary. There should be Scripture readings, the exchange of consent, the blessings, and some prayers. A little music would be nice, but even that is not essential. The ceremony should take place at church.

A Catholic wedding does not demand the participation of a large number of people. Just a bare minimum must be there: a priest or a deacon must witness the exchange of the couple's consent, and two other witnesses must be present, but that's all. Even in the smallest of ceremonies, some family members and close friends will want to attend, but the event can be kept very small.

A wedding is an important occasion for the couple, their families, the church, and the society that will know them as husband and wife. For that reason, most weddings require the coordination of many complicated demands. But for good reasons, the ceremony can be done more simply, and it is still a Catholic wedding.

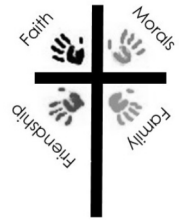
