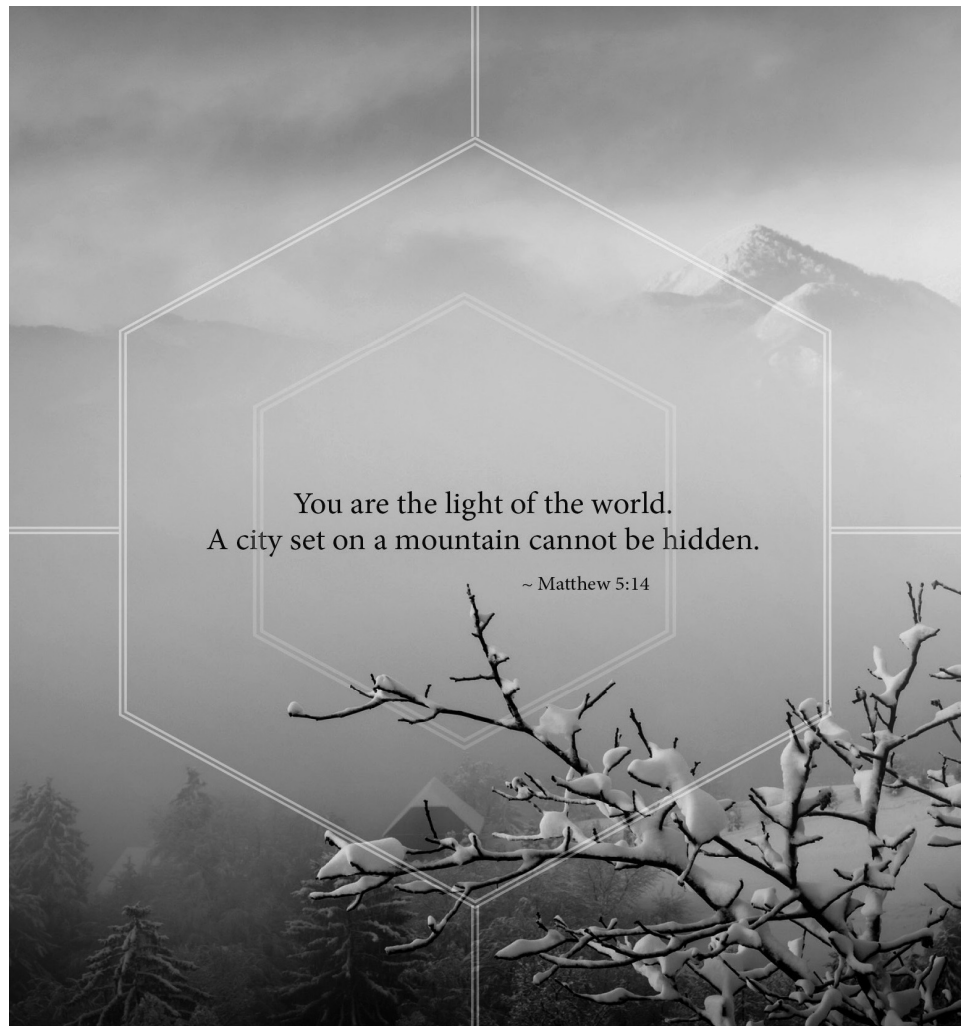

From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Not that it matters, but I will be cheering for the Falcons over the Patriots in the Super Bowl.

Now for something that does matter...



In April 2014 our parishioners were asked to make a pledge (for up to three years) to the To Teach Who Christ Is (TTWCI) capital campaign of the Archdiocese of Chicago. As you may recall, Barbara and Ray Blazina chaired this effort for the parish. The TTWCI case for Saint Hugh addressed three needs.

First, in September 2014, we addressed safety needs with improvements that included resealing and restriping of our parking lots.

Then, in September 2015, we addressed communication needs with an updated phone system and improved WiFi.

Now, with the TTWCI pledge period winding down and with the approval of our parish finance committee, we are now ready to begin the needed improvements to our worship space.

This project will include the repainting of all painted surfaces in the church. While the pews are removed we will also make improvements to the tile flooring. As I write, the final details are still being worked out, but know that this will be happening soon.

During the course of this work, we will need to find alternative spaces on our

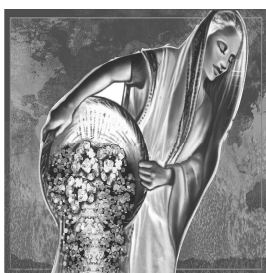
campus for worship. For likely two (no more than three) weekends, Masses will be moved to Keating Hall. Daily Mass will be moved to one of the classrooms. Our parish website will have updated information.

Despite the anticipated inconveniences, this third and final phase of TTWCI is intended to benefit our worship. This was the promise that we made to one another in the spring of 2014 when we made our pledges to this campaign. More than paint and flooring, this is about enhancing that sacred space where we come to know, in Word and Sacrament, who Christ is.

If you still have a balance on your TTWCI pledge, please continue to honor that commitment. If you have fulfilled your pledge or if you were not part of TTWCI but would now like to make a donation specifically for the restoration and renovation of our worship space, please use the Major Repair envelope (buff colored) in your packet. 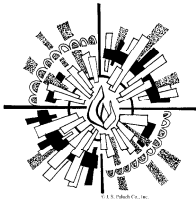

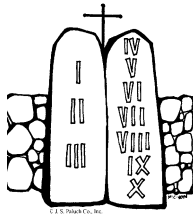

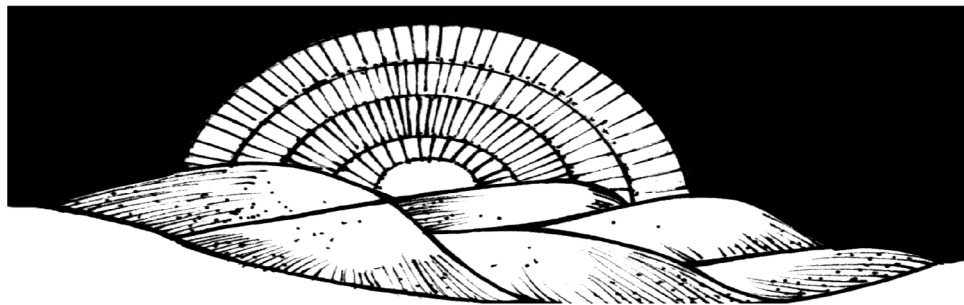

Stewardship thought

Oil of the Sick by Paul Turner

The oil of the sick is used for a sacrament in the Catholic Church. Traditionally it is olive oil, but any vegetable oil will suffice. The bishop blesses fresh oil each year, but in case of necessity any priest may bless the oil for this sacrament. In the distant past lay people anointed the sick, but today only a priest or bishop may administer this sacrament.

The sick were anointed even at the time of Christ. In Mark 6:13, Jesus sent the disciples out to anoint the sick. James 5:14 urges the sick to send for the elders of the church for an anointing. The custom of anointing the sick continued, but for several hundred years only the dying were anointed. The priest prayed for their forgiveness and anointed them on seven different parts of the body.

The custom of blessing oil is ancient. One such prayer dates to fourth-century Egypt. In the Roman Rite the oil came to be blessed at a Mass with the bishop. That Mass, established for the consecration of chrism before the initiation rites at the Easter Vigil, attracted the blessing of the oil of catechumens and the oil of the sick. Today, a bishop blesses all three oils at the chrism Mass, held shortly before Easter each year in every diocese.

The priest anoints the forehead and the palms of the sick, while praying that God will save and raise them up. The anointing accompanies a prayer for physical and spiritual healing.

The oil of the sick is sometimes kept in a container marked OI for *oleum infirmorum*, the oil of the sick. Almost every priest carries some in his car.

Treasures from the tradition

When the custom of the stationary liturgies was revived in the city of Rome in the early days of the twentieth century, the papal liturgy for Good Friday was appropriately housed in the stationary church of Santa Croce in Gerusalemme, the Holy Cross of Jerusalem.

The church is off the tourist track today, but true pilgrims would never miss it. It stands on the grounds of the Sessorian Palace, the home of the Empress St. Helena, mother of Constantine. She dedicated her life to finding the true cross of Christ in Jerusalem, and desired to found a church in Rome for people who could not make the long and dangerous trip to the Holy Land. Eventually, it came to house relics of the cross. When the pope fled the city of Rome for Avignon, the religious institutions of Rome collapsed and the church was abandoned. Centuries later it was given into the care of monks. Amazingly, it concealed a forgotten treasure. In 1492 repairmen took down a brick wall and discovered a niche with the inscription "Title of the Cross," and within, an ancient wooden tablet on which was carved the inscription dictated by Pilate for the cross of Christ in Hebrew, Latin, and Greek. No one is certain that this is authentic, although its discovery was enough to give the church great prestige among pilgrims. The veneration of the relic of the cross located here was a factor in shaping our restored Holy Week.

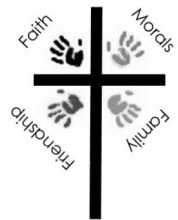

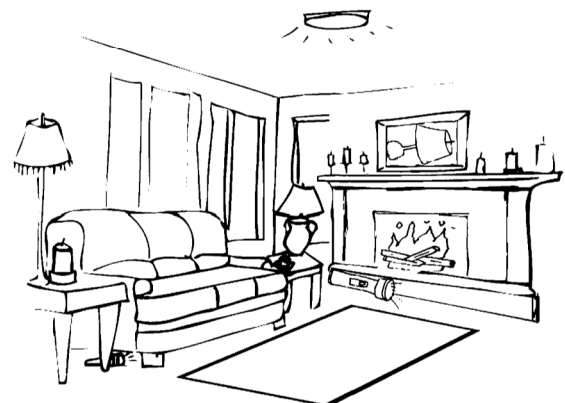
