# From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The penitential season is marked by the three traditional disciplines: fasting, prayer, and almsgiving.

At the 10:30 Mass - Bonnie Vins, Christie Finnigan, and Leticia Ibarra will participate in the third of three scrutinies as part of the RCIA: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Our *Book of the Elect* is displayed near the baptismal font as a visible reminder for us to pray for all those preparing for sacraments of initiation this Easter including the students in our Religious Education program who will receive their First Holy Communion on May 7.

Each year during Holy Week the local bishop consecrates the chrism and blesses the oils that are used in the parishes of his (arch)diocese during the Chrism Mass. On Tuesday April 11 our local bishop, Cardinal Blase Cupich, will preside at the Chrism Mass at Holy Name Cathedral. The oils for use at Saint Hugh will be presented at the start of the parish Mass on Holy Thursday. I call your attention to the articles by Father Turner on this page and on page four.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

## Chrism by Paul Turner

Chrism is the most special of all the oils used for Catholic sacraments and rituals. Traditionally, it is olive oil enhanced with balsam, a perfume. Today, other oils and perfumes may be used, especially in regions where the traditional ingredients are difficult to obtain. No matter the formula, chrism should have a pleasing aroma.

Chrism is the oil used for the three sacraments that may be received only once in a lifetime: baptism, confirmation, and ordination to the priesthood. It carries a strong association with the Holy Spirit, who consecrates the faithful for service according to the sacrament they receive.

Only the bishop may consecrate chrism. If the parish supply begins to run low, the local priest may not create more. He must obtain it from the bishop. The bishop consecrates this oil only once a year at the Chrism Mass, shortly before the paschal Triduum begins. This tradition began so that chrism could be fresh and abundantly available for the celebration of the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. After the Chrism Mass, portions of the oils are distributed to parishes for their use throughout the year. Oils are typically stored in bottles bearing the year of consecration.

When a new altar is dedicated for a church, the bishop smears its top with chrism. When a new church is dedicated for the purposes of worship, its interior walls are anointed with chrism in the form of many crosses. A church and altar are thus consecrated by the Holy Spirit for forms of service. As with the sacraments, once chrism is used on an altar and walls, its effects are permanent.

## Stewardship thought

Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' JOHN 11:40

Many of us say that we believe in God. We go to church on Sunday. We volunteer for events at our parish. But when life gets hard, the pressure is on, things aren't going our way, do we really believe, do we really put our trust in the Lord? When we live a life of gratitude, being thankful for the gifts we have been given, we really do see that God is providing all that we need.

## Treasures from our tradition

Not until the thirteenth century do we find a mention of a locked tabernacle. There's some evidence for eucharistic towers also, but often these were in an obscure corner of the church, or even in the off-limits sacristy. Many of us grew up "making visits" to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, but it's clear this would raise some medieval eyebrows in confusion! To the present day, the Eucharist is always reserved only in a side chapel in many cathedrals. The principal focus in a cathedral is always on the altar, symbol of Christ, and on the cathedra, symbol of the pastoral ministry of the bishop.

In your parish church there is probably a "sanctuary lamp," a permanently lit candle or oil lamp indicating the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Sometimes it's in a red glass, not for any particular reason except that it's easy to find. There is a story of a bishop missioned to Papua New Guinea who was distressed to find no sanctuary lamps burning in his new diocese. The people patiently explained that their churches were woven of grass, and that they decided to place a chief's standard, a trident, in front of the tabernacle. That was a sign in their culture that the "chief" was at home, like raising the flag over Buckingham Palace. The bishop, an Irish import, didn't appreciate the British reference, so he ordered the candles back. The first church to burn to the ground was the cathedral, and after two more, the chief's tridents returned.

## Holy Thursday by Paul Turner

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday ends the season of Lent and begins the Triduum, the sacred three days when we commemorate the Passion and resurrection of Christ. The church looks different: The tabernacle is completely empty; its doors may be opened and the sanctuary lamp extinguished. The altar may have moderate floral decoration. At Mass, bells ring during the

Glory to God, but then they remain silent until the Easter Vigil. Musical instruments should not play solos. The washing of the feet may follow the homily. Contributions for the poor are included in the procession of the gifts. The eucharistic prayer recalls that this is the night on which Jesus was handed over and on which he handed over his Body and Blood to us. After communion the leftover consecrated bread is placed in a vessel on the altar and incensed. The priest picks up the vessel with the humeral veil and processes through the church to a side altar or a separate chapel suitably decorated. The Blessed Sacrament is incensed again and closed inside a tabernacle.

No other Mass is celebrated this day—not even in the morning—without permission of the bishop and only for serious reasons. Holy communion may be given to the sick, but no one else may share in communion outside of Mass.

After Mass the altar is stripped, and the crosses in the church are removed or veiled. The faithful may begin the paschal fast, which is obligatory on Good Friday but urged on Holy Saturday as well. They are encouraged to pray before the Blessed Sacrament sometime before midnight, remembering how Jesus asked Peter, "Could you not stay awake with me one hour?" (Mt 26:40).
