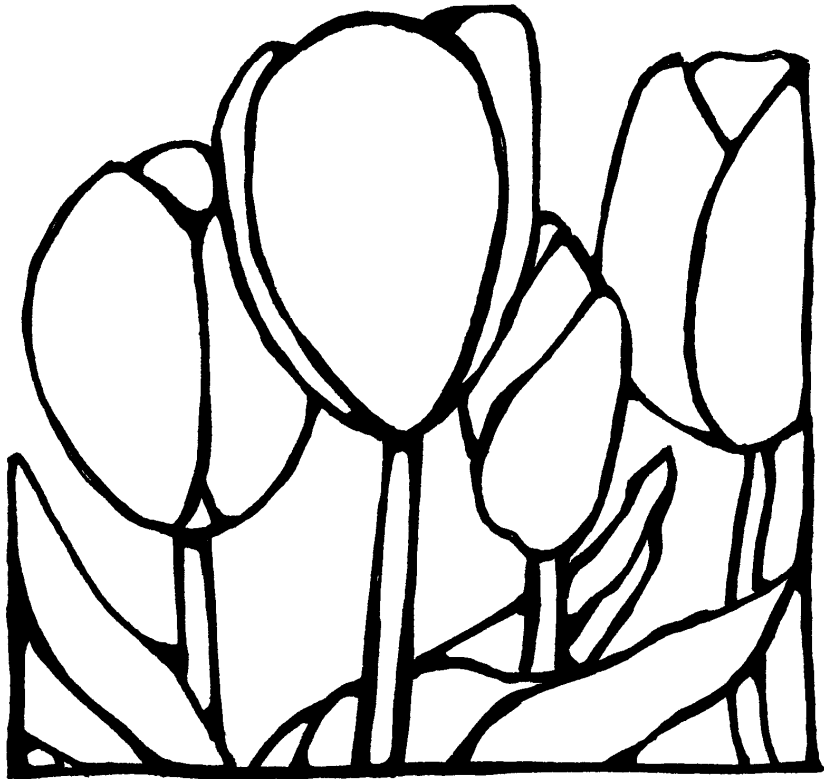

Ozanam Sunday

Blessed Frédéric Ozanam was born on April 23, 1813. On April 23, 1833 Frédéric and six companions founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Also, St. Vincent de Paul was born on April 24, 1581. To commemorate these events the Society in the United States celebrates the last Sunday of April as Ozanam Sunday.

Frédéric Ozanam left his home in Lyon, France in 1831 to register in the School of Law at the Sorbonne, University of Paris where he collaborated with Emmanuel Bailly, editor of the Tribune Catholique, in reviving "The Conference of History." The group met on Saturdays to discuss various topics, everything but politics.

At one of their meetings, a student challenged Frédéric and the practicing Catholics. He admitted that the Catholic Church had done much good work in the past, but "what do you do now?"

On his twentieth birthday, Frédéric called a meeting of five of his friends. Inspired by their words, Ozanam founded the "Conference of Charity" to assist the poor. Emmanuel Bailly, a married layman, was chosen by the six students as their first President. In a short time, they changed their name to The Society of St. Vincent de Paul in honor of their patron.

In his homily at the beatification Mass at Notre Dame Cathedral, John Paul II noted that Frédéric Ozanam observed the real situation of the poor and sought to be more and more effective in helping them in their human development. He understood that charity must lead to efforts to remedy injustice. Charity and justice go together.

Today, the Society numbers about 700,000 in 142 countries with a Conference here at St. Hugh Parish composed of volunteers dedicated to helping those in need in our community.

To whom do I need to show mercy this week? How?

Jubilee of Mercy: December 8, 2015 - November 20, 2016



This Sunday's "Youth Jubilee" previews July's World Youth Day in Krakow. Its theme from Matthew 5:7, "Blessed are the merciful," echoes Pope Francis' warning that "the practice of mercy is waning in the wider culture." In countercultural witness, therefore, "the time has come," says Francis, "for the Church to take up the joyful call to mercy once more. It is time to return to the basics and to bear the weaknesses and struggles of our brothers and sisters." Jesus affirms the same in today's Gospel. "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (John 13:34). Francis concludes, "The Church's very credibility is seen in how she shows merciful and compassionate love." Jesus too asserts, "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). Thus mercy "makes young" the Church, the

Treasures from the tradition

The French Revolution swept the church
in France away in an astonishing way,
stripping the nation of every possible
vestige of the faith, not merely
shuttering churches, but using them as
staging areas for pagan raves and
romps. While millions of faithful simply
went underground and hung on for the
ride, even the seven-day week was
demolished along with the names of the
months. What emerged from the chaos
was the Napoleonic Code of 1792
governing church life, and therefore
marriage law in France, French
Canada, and elsewhere. The code
makes civil marriage mandatory for all
citizens.

In practice, when the faithful marry,
they go first to the City Hall. There, the
mayor performs the civil marriage,
usually accompanied by a patriotic
speech about the duties of the citizen,
particularly in the rearing of children.
Then, typically after a lunch, everyone
goes off to change into more festive
attire for the wedding liturgy, featuring
consent, the exchange of rings, and the
nuptial blessing. Sadly, only a minority
of citizens today celebrate even the
civil form of the rite, and a fraction of
those continue on to the church. For
those who do celebrate the liturgy of
marriage, however, there is near
certainty that the spouses are active
worshippers, and that they will later
present their children for baptism.

First Communion Requirements by Paul Turner

To share in communion for the first time children must have
"sufficient knowledge and careful preparation so as to
understand the mystery of Christ according to their
capacity" (Code of Canon Law 913). They must also be able
to receive communion "with faith and devotion" (913).

Our church expects a child to discern ordinary food from the
eucharistic bread. That ability comes at the age "of the use of reason." We
generally place that at about age seven, but it has never been defined because
children mature so independently. If children cannot make the distinction, they
should not come to the eucharistic table. However, infant communion is common
among other Christian churches.

Children should understand the mystery of Christ "according to their capacity."
They need not comprehend the total mystery. (Who of us can?) They should come
to the table with a spiritual disposition. Communion requires not just using reason
but having faith as well. Formerly, children were expected to adore the host.
That requirement fit an age when the faithful received communion infrequently
and attended Mass to adore the host more than to share in communion.

Citing a different canon (914), the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says,
"Children must go to the sacrament of Penance before receiving Holy
Communion for the first time" (1457). Even so, it is difficult to argue that every
child must confess sins before receiving communion because the church obliges
the confession of serious sins but recommends the confession of venial sins (canon
988). Forcing a child to confess before communion might affect the disposition
required for the celebration of the sacraments.

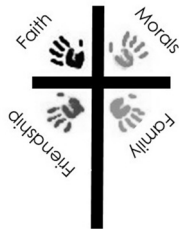
