From the Pastor's Desk

Today, with palms, we begin our Holy Week. The *Triduum* (three days) are at the climax of our liturgical year. Remember that we are counting days beginning at sunset: Thursday night into Friday - Friday night into Saturday - Saturday night into Sunday. Therefore both the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday night and the Easter Vigil on Saturday night will begin at 7:00pm.

Because of the importance of these three days, only the Triduum services are permitted. There will be no morning Masses, funerals, confessions, or other rites celebrated.

7:00pm - Mass of the Lord's Supper (includes the presentation of the oils blessed at the Chrism Mass, foot

washing, and Eucharistic procession to the altar of repose). Following Mass we will have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 9:00pm.

There is a custom of visiting other Catholic worship sites with adoration on Holy Thursday. If you plan to do so, I suggest that you call ahead or visit their websites to learn their hours.

Hospitality this Holy Week

Those of you who are here Sunday after Sunday can be a welcoming presence to those who come to church this week. Our hospitality can be a powerful way of saying "We are glad that you are here. Please join us every Sunday for worship." Here are some suggestions for extending hospitality:

- Before Mass: Greet one another. Introduce yourself. Move toward the center of the pew so that it is easier for others to enter. Silence your phone. Smile.
- During Mass: Actively participate. Sing. Take the initiative at the sign of peace. Pray with and for each other. Smile.
- After Mass: Return two copies of *Breaking Bread* to each book rack. Return the Order of Service card to the hat clip with the word WELCOME being the first thing that the next person will see. Put the kneelers up so that it is easier for the next person to enter. Remove whatever you have brought into the pew including the bulletin, tissues, diapers, papers, and water bottles. Smile.

Stewardship thought

As they were marching out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they pressed into service to carry his cross. MATTHEW 27:32

The Lord calls us to love God and to love our neighbor. Every day we are presented with opportunities to love our neighbor and help him "carry his cross". These opportunities aren't usually big events, they are usually ordinary occurrences like helping someone carry their groceries or holding the door open for them. The key is putting the other person's needs before our own and not expecting anything in return.

Treasures from our tradition

Now we have come to the center of the Christian year, beginning with today, Passion Sunday, Holy Week, and culminating in the Pasch, the Sacred Triduum. Some have called the culminating event in this week's journey of faith "The Three Days of Easter." The origins of many of our observances, including today's blessing of palms and solemn entry into the church, harken back to old Jerusalem.

In the late fourth century, a woman living a consecrated life in southern France made a four-year pilgrimage to Jerusalem. There, she encountered the rich liturgies of the city, bursting with Christians. She was a keen observer, and fortunately for us wrote vivid letters of her experience to a circle of women friends she calls her sisters. By the time of her journey, it is clear that even some catechumens were undertaking the dangerous journey so that they could be formed at the very site of the events of Christ's passion and rising. At the heart of the pilgrim experience were processions, such as today's joyous procession to the Mount of Olives, and brilliant catechesis from the bishop every day, as well as intense fasting and prayer. When you resolve to keep this week holy in your own life, and especially when you commit to participate in the full Triduum with worship in church and fasting at home, a very ancient tradition is within your grasp.

Good Friday by Paul Turner

The church solemnly observes Good Friday with a special liturgy called the Celebration of the Lord's Passion. It should take place at 3 p.m., but another time may be chosen. It is not a Mass, but the priest and deacon vest as if it were. The altar should be bare—no cross, candles, or cloth should adorn it. Musical instruments should be used sparingly, only to accompany singing. No bells are rung. The service begins

as ministers enter the sanctuary and lie prostrate, face to the floor. Or they may kneel. The highlight of the Liturgy of the Word is the proclamation of the Passion according to St. John. One or three persons may read or sing it; the assembly may take part. All kneel for a time of silence when the narrative tells of the death of Jesus.

The liturgy continues with solemn prayers for the church and the world. Then a cross is unveiled or carried in procession. All may adore the cross however they wish. The priest may remove his chasuble and his shoes. Music during this time may include the Stabat Mater. Bread consecrated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper is then brought to the altar, and all may share communion. Whatever remains goes to a tabernacle, preferably outside the church.

As the service ends, the cross is placed on the altar between two or four candles. When leaving the church, people should genuflect to the cross.

Throughout the day the faithful should observe the laws of fast and abstinence. They may confess their sins or receive the anointing of the sick, but no other sacraments may be celebrated. Only the sick may receive communion apart from the Celebration of the Lord's Passion.

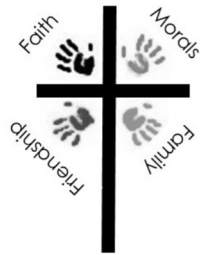

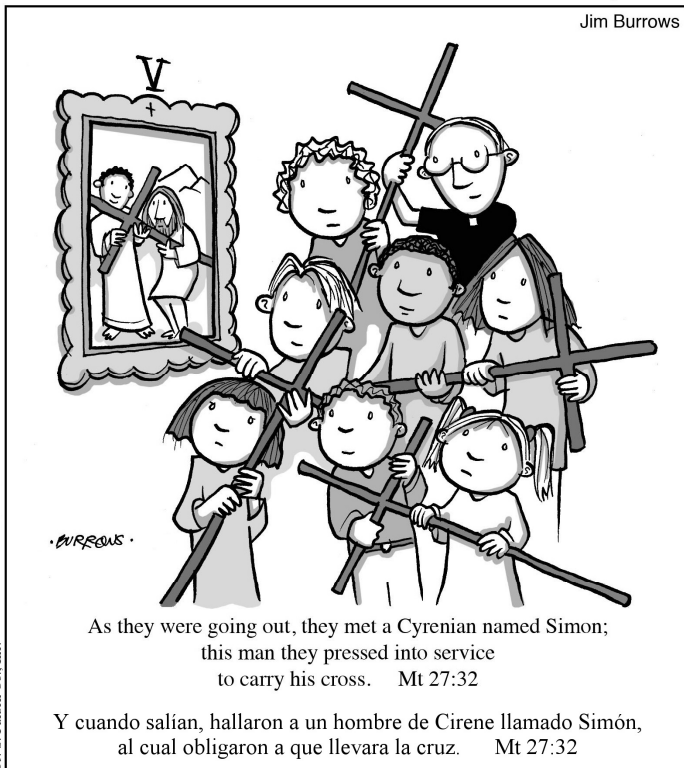

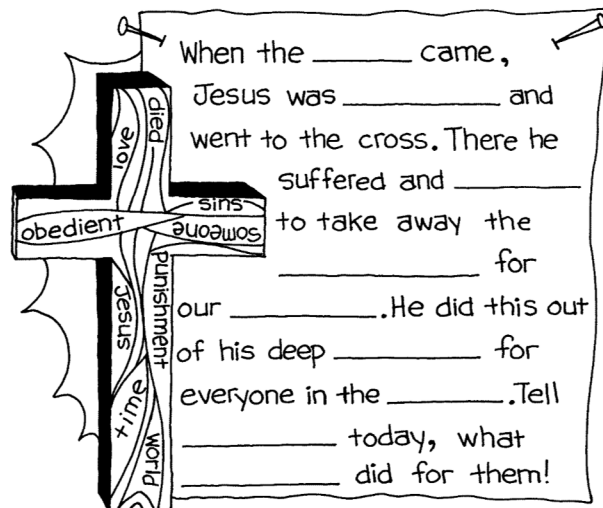
