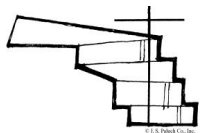

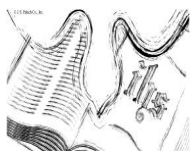

## Mothers' Day Proclamation: Julia Ward Howe, Boston, 1870:

Arise, then, women of this day! Arise all women who have hearts, whether our baptism be that of water or of fears! Say firmly: "We will not have great questions decided by irrelevant agencies. Our husbands shall not come to us, reeking with carnage, for caresses and applause. Our sons shall not be taken from us to unlearn all that we have been able to teach them of charity, mercy and patience.

We women of one country will be too tender of those of another country to allow our sons to be trained to injure theirs. From the bosom of the devastated earth a voice goes up with our own. It says "Disarm, Disarm! The sword of murder is not the balance of justice."

Blood does not wipe our dishonor nor violence indicate possession. As men have often forsaken the plow and the anvil at the summons of war, let women now leave all that may be left of home for a great and earnest day of counsel. Let them meet first, as women, to bewail and commemorate the dead.

Let them then solemnly take counsel with each other as to the means whereby the great human family can live in peace, each bearing after their own time the sacred impress, not of Caesar, but of God.

In the name of womanhood and of humanity, I earnestly ask that a general congress of women without limit of nationality may be appointed and held at some place deemed most convenient and at the earliest period consistent with its objects, to promote the alliance of the different nationalities, the amicable settlement of international questions, the great and general interests of peace.



### First Letter of Peter by Paul Turner

You will hear passages from the First Letter of Peter at Sunday Masses of the Easter season during Year A of the three-year lectionary cycle. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults says that the Easter readings of Year A are particularly suitable for continuing the formation of the newly baptized. One reason is that Year A features the First Letter of Peter. It serves as the second reading at Sunday Mass for well over a month.

The letter was written for newly baptized Christians of the first century. It explains the meaning of their baptism, helps them establish their Christian identity, reviews the ways they should now behave, and points to their eternal life in Christ. These themes still help newly baptized Christians today reflect on their identity, and they form a good review for more experienced Christians as well. The teachings of this letter draw from the Scriptures and from the liturgy of baptism. They show how the plan of God is being fulfilled, how our rituals express our belief, and what they demand in the way we treat others. The First Letter of Peter models the catechesis that Christians still offer and receive.

The excerpts we hear at Mass make these key points. We praise God who has given us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. The blood of Christ redeems us. The suffering of Christ instructs us. We have become a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people possessed by God, who called us out of darkness into light. ## Treasures from our tradition

In many parish churches, more rarely in monastery churches and cathedrals, the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament is visible from a doorway or aisle in the church. Normally, a person is to give the proper sign of reverence, a genuflection, when passing in proximity to the tabernacle. The word "genuflect" comes from Latin roots meaning bending (or flexing) the knee. A common-sense exception to the rule is for a sacristan who is taking care of the church and can't be genuflecting every thirty seconds during a vacuum run. Also excepted are persons in procession entrusted with important symbols of the Lord's presence. So, a crossbearer or a minister carrying the Gospel book, or ministers on their way to their Communion stations do not genuflect. For everyone else, the usual sign of reverence for the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament is to genuflect on the right knee.

The oldest form of reverence during prayer in our tradition is standing; kneeling or genuflecting is a sign borrowed from old civic practice. The posture of kneeling, even on one knee, is a sign of submission. Servants would take this position before their masters in the ancient world. It said: I'm not running away, I'm yours, I'm here for you. This is what your genuflection says when you enter a Catholic church where the place of reservation of the Blessed Sacrament is visible to you: I'm yours.

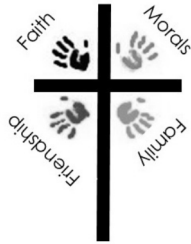

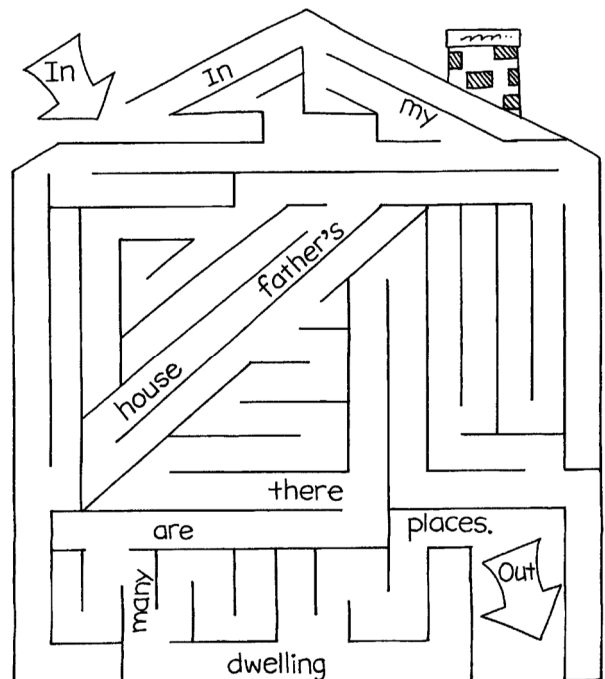
