

On Monday May 21, I will celebrate my thirtieth anniversary of priesthood ordination. All are welcome to a breakfast reception following the daily 10:30am Mass: the inaugural Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church.

To commemorate another decade as I priest, I am planning a trip to Uganda with the Comboni Missionaries. Father Chris Aleti, MCCJ will lead a group of eight of us through his homeland May 30-June 13. We will join nearly a million pilgrims for the Feast of the Ugandan Martyrs (Charles Lwanga and Companions) on Sunday June 3. In addition to visiting MCCJ ministry sites throughout the country, we will also visit Lake Victoria, the source of the Nile River, and the Murchison Falls National Park.

This time away from the parish will initiate some of the anticipated and necessary pastoral transitions - including my surrendering the duty of bulletin editor. I have enjoyed this responsibility and am pleased with our efforts to enhance parish communications. Beginning with the June 3 issue, you may address all your bulletin related thoughts, suggestions, corrections, and comments to Christine Alfred at the parish office. The virtue of patience is most appreciated in all transitions.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

No, we have one God who is over all and in all. The Spirit has been active in all ages. The prophets were empowered by the Spirit to proclaim God's word to Israel. Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was filled with the Spirit as he preached and worked miracles. Then at Pentecost the disciples were filled with the Spirit.

The Spirit's gifts are meant to be shared. The prophets could not help proclaim God's message. Jesus shared all he knew with his disciples. The disciples went out to the world to spread the news of Jesus' death and resurrection. So we, too, are given gifts to be shared.

As we come to realize how much God has done for us and how close he is to us, we will want to share that with others. Obviously, we can't make everyone believe in Jesus. But how sad would it be if someone we know was looking for the truth and we neglected to offer it?

May 25. Saint Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi is known as the "ecstatic saint" because of her unusual gifts from God. To safeguard the authenticity of her visions, her confessor had her dictate them to fellow sisters. The result was five volumes encompassing ecstasies, letters, and inspirational sayings.

May 26. For many years Saint Philip Neri lived as a layman engaged in prayer and apostolic works in Rome. After ordination, he became a noted confessor and eventually founded the Oratory, a religious institute, with some of his followers.







Vangie Price is St. Hugh Woman of the Year

for St. Hugh, its parishioners, and our society. Vangie is a longtime supporter and volunteer with our society and a friend to all, reaching out with a kind word or gesture when it's most needed.

Vangie has been a member of St. Hugh Parish since her mother first carried her to church as a baby. She attended St. Hugh elementary school and graduated from Trinity High School in River Forest in 1948. One of Vangie's jobs was at Material Service Corp. in Lyons. The company's vice president insisted that Will Price, call Evangeline for a blind date, or both would lose their jobs! To get the boss off their backs, the pair went dancing. Vangie said, "It was love at first sight." Inspired by Vangie, Will surprised her by becoming Catholic, and they were married in October 1951 while he was on leave from the Korean War.

Their children Johnny and Sheila graduated from St. Hugh school. Both Vangie and Will were active in the local school system. Vangie worked with special-education students, first at Washington school and then for 17 years at Morton East H.S. Today, they live in the same yellow brick bungalow Vangie and her family moved into 84 years ago.

Vangie is an idea person. Many of her suggestions have come to life at St. Hugh. Then-pastor Father Tom Moran took up her suggestion to create a prayer garden of bricks that parishioners could donate to memorialize loved ones. Vangie also came up with the idea of naming the parish hall after beloved former pastor the Rev. James Keating.

In her unassuming way, Vangie readily offers her support and help. Her flair for baking has benefited our Christmas Bazaar for years. She organized and ran a book booth and helped in many other ways. Vangie is a loyal friend and parishioner, a fun-loving, giving person who is welcoming to everyone. Despite losing her mother at age 3 and father at age 5, she cherishes her happy childhood with her aunt, uncle, and brother, and in her words "my happy life." She said: "I am happily married 67 years to Will. We still play jokes on each other. Thank God I have this kind, gentle, courteous man! God has blessed us with two children, three grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren. They all have made us happy."

Today as we celebrate Pentecost the Holy Spirit wants to make us advocates of God's presence to bring new life to others, especially those who do not know the love of God in their lives. Stewardship thought

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

- 1 CORINTHIANS 12:4-6

All of us are blessed, regardless of our own individual circumstances; God has given each of us many gifts. How we use those gifts is our gift back to God. For God's plan to work, each must do what we are called to do and guess what – we are not all called to do the same thing!

Treasures from our tradition

The disciples gathered on the fiftieth day after the Resurrection were not keeping their first Pentecost. For them, Pentecost was the fiftieth day after Passover, a feast of the first fruits of the harvest. It was the second most important feast of the year. Today, Jews gather on the eve of the feast to study scripture and the law, and after the feast begins at sundown, spend the day in joyful social gatherings. The meaning of the celebration is the giving of the law on Mount Sinai, so for Christians the connection to the gifts of the Holy Spirit is obvious. In Sicily and in the Pantheon in Rome, today the descent of the Holy Spirit is enacted with a stunning ritual. Some churches there have an "eye" in the roof open to the sky, called an oculus. After the Gospel today, thousands of rose petals fall from the oculus onto the assembly. Churches and homes are decked in greenery and flowers to express the new life the Holy Spirit brings on this, the "birthday of the church."



Baptism

Infants are baptized at the parish where their parents are active members - usually on Sunday after the Mass. Contact the Pastor to schedule.
