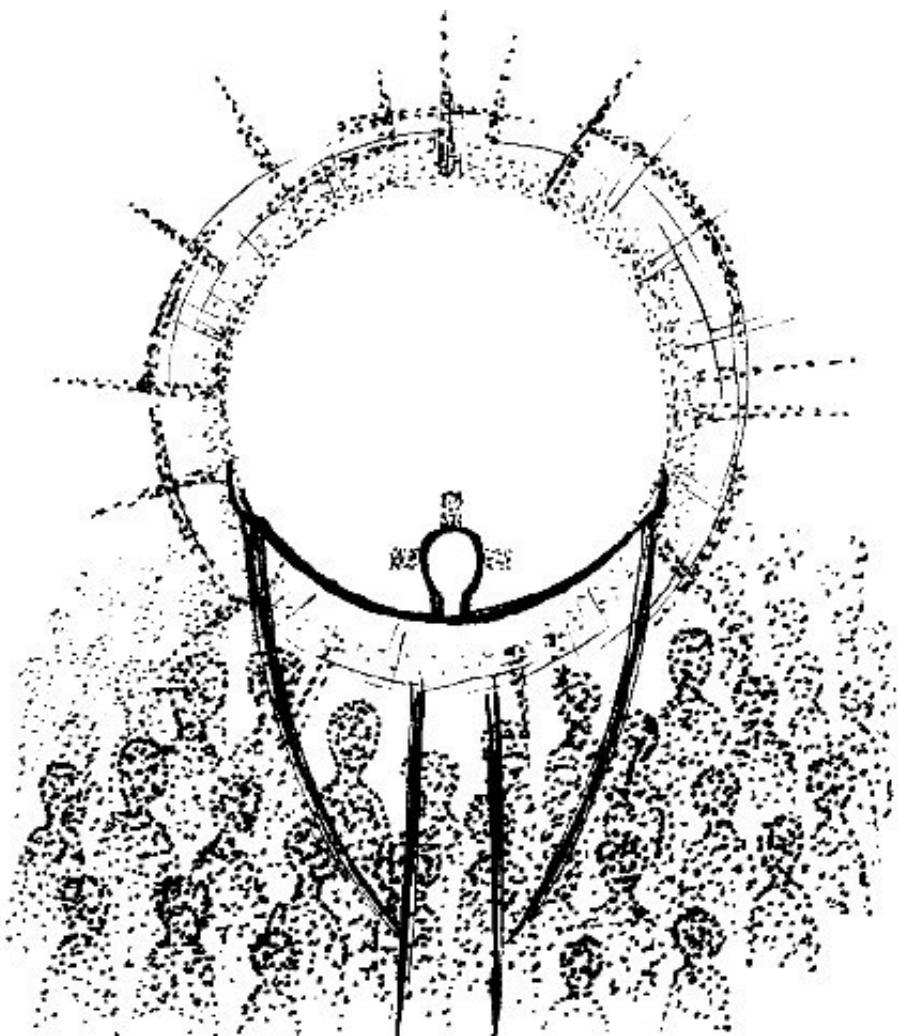

Congratulations to Saint Hugh Woman of the Year SUSAN KAHLER

St. Hugh Society of Catholic Women (SCW) is pleased to honor Susan Kahler as its 2017 Woman of the Year! Sue met her husband, Ron while students at Aurora College. They were married at Mater Christi Church in 1980 and live in Riverside with their dog and three cats in a Victorian home they renovated.

She works for the American Veterinary Medical Association as the senior news editor with a staff of five reporters and has written stories ranging from veterinarians in space to her "pet" issue – homeless dogs and cats.

Sue became a member of St. Hugh in 2002 and a few years later joined our SCW. Since 2008, Sue has run the Hooligan game at our annual Christmas Bazaar. She has co-chaired the Christmas Bazaar, Spring Luncheon, and organized our SCW bunco party to benefit the missions. Sue was the SCW's Secretary from 2010 – 2014. In 2014, she became our Vice-President. As the chair of our Faith Commission, she arranged last year's tour of the National Shrine of St. Therese in Darien. This year, Sue is planning monthly observances to honor the 100th anniversary of the Marian Apparitions in Fatima, Portugal.

She coordinates and volunteers to launder the altar linens. Sue says, "St. Hugh is such a welcoming parish, and our SCW is a sisterhood of junior to senior women who make supporting the parish fun."

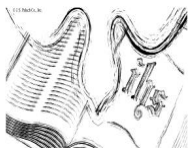

of having their Temporary Protected
Status (TPS) terminated by the
Department of Homeland Security

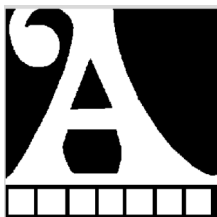
Treasures from our tradition

The custom of genuflection is not found everywhere in the Catholic Church. In fact, it is a bit of breach of etiquette to genuflect in most Eastern Catholic Churches. If you're visiting an Eastern Catholic or an Orthodox church, the "when in Rome" rule should be adopted. Watch what the home team is doing! Usually, Eastern Catholics and Orthodox reserve a small portion of the eucharistic bread for the dying in a cupboard or eucharistic dove, but it is not a center of attention or devotion. The rule is to make a profound bow, called a "metasis," toward the altar--bowing deeply while making the sign of the cross.

East and West split years before we Westerners began to reserve the Blessed Sacrament prominently in our churches. Thus, the East never changed the original custom of bowing toward the altar. Increasingly, as tabernacles became more widespread in the West and moved into prominent placement within churches, we replaced the bow toward the altar with a genuflection toward the Blessed Sacrament when its place of reservation is visible.

In a church where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in a special chapel or off the main axis of the building, normally you should bow toward the altar when you enter your pew, because the eucharistic table is the principal sign of Christ's presence in the church building. If you have ever participated in the liturgy of Dedication of a Church and Altar, there is no mistaking the altar's significance: it is first slathered with chrism and then adorned with a brazier billowing clouds of incense that fill the whole church as a sign of prayer and presence!

Ascension on Sunday by Paul Turner

The Ascension of Christ, which traditionally falls on a Thursday, may be celebrated on a Sunday in certain parts of the world.

The Ascension originated as a Thursday celebration because of the story of the event from the opening of the Acts of the Apostles. There, Luke says that Jesus rose from the dead, appeared to believers for 40 days and then ascended to the heavens. Even though the accounts of the ascension in the Gospels suggest it took place after a shorter period of time, the liturgy of the church has honored the chronology from Acts by celebrating the Ascension on Thursday of the sixth week of Easter.

The Solemnity of the Ascension is one of 10 days that may be a holy day of obligation. Not all countries have the same holy days. In those countries where the Ascension is not a holy day, the solemnity is transferred to the following Sunday. The United States is so large and its needs so varied that Rome has granted it permission to decide by region on the date of this one solemnity. It is possible within the United States for Ascension to be on a Thursday in one state and on a Sunday in another. Travelers are expected to honor the custom of the place where they are that week.

Those celebrating Ascension on Sunday will miss the Mass texts of the Seventh Sunday of Easter, filled with anticipation for the Spirit of Pentecost. The second reading and the Gospel of the Seventh Sunday of Easter may replace those usually heard on the Sixth. Those attending weekday Masses may notice that the responsorial psalm on Friday and Saturday of the Sixth Week of Easter is a seasonal psalm for the Ascension, even if their community will not celebrate the solemnity until Sunday.

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At Saint Hugh: Since 1999, the Archdiocese of Chicago and the Province of Illinois have transferred the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord to the Seventh Sunday of Easter. In the US, only the provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Omaha, and Philadelphia continue observing Ascension Thursday as a Holy Day of Obligation.
