

From the Pastor's Desk

While the liturgical calendar returns to Ordinary Time (think Green) following Pentecost, the two Sundays following Easter are given to a pair of so-called feasts of devotion. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and next weekend is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Since what we are celebrating is not a specific event in the life of Jesus, these are sometimes referred to as idea feasts. Today's solemnity was declared a universal observance by Pope John XXII in 1334.

I am commemorating my thirtieth anniversary by traveling to Uganda with the Comboni Missionaries. Father Chris Aleti, MCCJ will lead a group of us through his homeland May 30-June 13. Sunday June 3 we will join a million pilgrims for the Feast of the Ugandan Martyrs: Charles Lwanga and Companions.

This time away from the parish will allow us to initiate some changes necessitated by pastoral transitions. This includes my surrendering the duty of bulletin editor. I have enjoyed this responsibility and am pleased with our efforts to enhance parish communications. This is my final issue as editor.

Beginning with the June 3 issue, you should address all your bulletin related thoughts, suggestions, corrections, and comments to Christine Alfred at the parish office. Remember that patience is a virtue and that it is appreciated in all transitions.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

REMEMBRANCE

honor our dead. It was officially proclaimed by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic: *The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land.*

The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle.

On the first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there. By 1890 it was recognized by all of the northern states. The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I - when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war. It is now observed in almost every state on the last Monday in May.

The Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of Chicago offer Field Masses on Memorial Day usually at 10:30am. Verify time and location at: catholiccemeterieschicago.org

Three-in-One Love

When I was much younger, I used to think that God was totally invisible, not to be experienced as the people in the bible did. After all, they heard God's voice in the fiery cloud; they saw the waters parted so they could pass through--all the things that Moses talks about in the first reading. But then I ask myself, do I want my faith to be based on special effects? Do I want to be like the people who believe in extraterrestrials because they saw a light in the sky that they could not explain? Or do I want to trust Jesus, who told Thomas, "Blessed are they who have not seen and have believed." (Jn 20:29)

Jesus was referring to his resurrection appearances, but it also applies to the Holy Trinity. When we see a newborn child, she can remind us of God the Father creating the earth and all living things. When we see the cross, we recall Jesus saving death and resurrection. When we share our faith with someone, we know that it is the Holy Spirit who gives us the words to speak and the courage to speak them. Without seeing the pillar of fire that lead the Hebrew from Egyptian slavery, nor the wounds in Jesus' hands after his resurrection, nor the tongues of flame over the apostles at Pentecost --we can still experience God in Three Persons.

The three are not just equal parts of God, one-third of God each. No, they each are totally God. That is why we say God is love: Three infinite Persons are united in one substance or being, so the love they have for each other is infinite. The actions that show each Person's qualities are not done by that person alone. Everything God does is done by all three Persons. So you could say that everything the Trinity does, is done out of love.




Treasures from our tradition

One of the great treasures of the Eastern tradition is the icon of the Holy Trinity created by the Russian iconographer Andrei Rublev in the 1400s. The Trinity is symbolized by the three travelers to the tent of Abraham and Sarah. They are seated at a table blessing a cup of wine, under the oak of Mamre. If you look closely, you will see a sacrificed calf in the chalice, reminding the viewer of the cross. The table, prepared for eating and tilted toward the viewer, is an invitation to the Eucharist. From left to right, each figure is keyed to a person of the Trinity. Like all icons, this image is theology in art. The persons are equal in proportion and dignity, they all carry staffs to symbolize their power, and are shown with golden wings and halos. Today, the best place to see Rublev's work is the Holy Trinity Cathedral, at the heart of the vast Holy Trinity monastery about an hour from Moscow. After decades of persecution, it is now once again a living monastery, a world heritage site, and the spiritual home of Russian Orthodoxy. A Google visit is highly recommended today!


