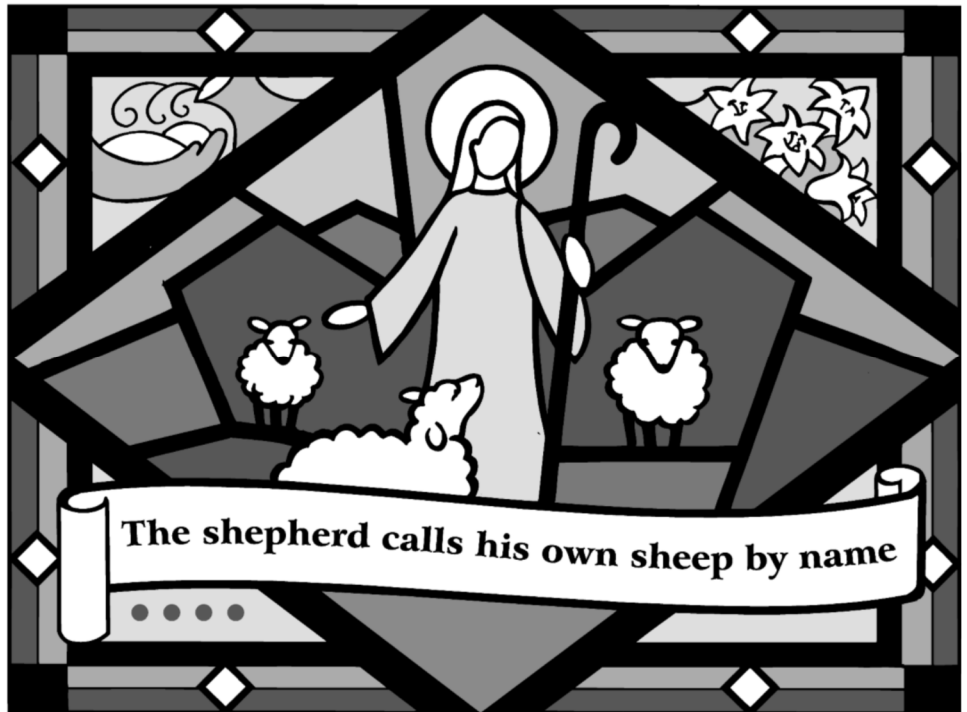

Blessings and joy as the Easter season continues. Our fifty day festival of resurrection culminates with Pentecost, the so-called *Birthday of the Church*, on Sunday June 4.

What God wants for our lives

I recently attended an archdiocesan workshop on the importance of parish vocation ministry. Rhonda Gruenewald spoke of ways to foster a culture of vocations. Currently I am reading her book, *Hundredfold*, containing 57 activities for planting the seeds of vocations within our Catholic parishes.

It is up to us to reach out with an invitation to grow the number of young people answering God's call to priesthood, married life or consecrated life. Paying attention to behavior which suggests a spiritual relationship with Jesus can lead to a conversation about how God is acting in a young person's life. Learning possibilities for further study or sharing with others also discerning God's call is necessary to help guide those we meet.

Asking for prayers is a first step in forming a group who know the power of prayer.

I had a table at the SCW Spring Luncheon with materials from the vocation workshop and six people signed-up to pray for vocations. Contact me if you wish to learn more. Soon we will meet to encourage each other to continue praying.

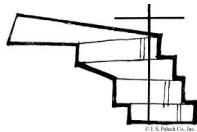

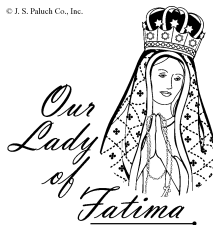

Easter First Readings by Paul Turner

At Sunday Mass the first reading usually comes from the Old Testament. This custom changes, however, during Easter Time. For seven weeks from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, the first readings all come from the same book: the Acts of the Apostles. Thus the three readings at

Sunday Mass and the two readings at daily Mass all come from the New Testament throughout Easter Time.

Easter makes everything new. The resurrection so changes human history that we immerse ourselves in the New Testament to seek more deeply the meaning of this mystery.

The Acts of the Apostles tells of the beginnings of the church. It opens with the ascension and Pentecost, recounts the spread of the faith in peace and persecution, and concludes with the missionary activity of Paul. This book bridges the gospels with the rest of church history. The Gospels culminate in the resurrection of Jesus, which inspired evangelization. Each Easter our church announces the resurrection through the Scriptures and increases its membership through baptism. We witness evangelization today as we recall its origins in the Acts of the Apostles.

The Old Testament is not completely absent. The Liturgy of the Word throughout the season still includes a responsorial psalm. The Mass for the Pentecost Vigil includes one or more readings from the Old Testament, foreshadowing the gift of the Spirit.

When planning other liturgies for Easter Time—funerals, weddings, penance services, or baptisms, for example—the first readings for those celebrations best come from the New Testament. No matter the occasion, our Scripture readings set this season aside from all others, because it ranks above all others. Easter announces new life in

Treasures from our tradition

The fact that many monastic churches do not have a prominent tabernacle shapes the patterns of liturgical prayer. Monastic communities often protect the ancient value of "receiving from the same sacrifice," meaning that the communicants are assured that what they eat and drink in the Holy Mysteries actually comes from the same celebration. It surprises many to learn that the Church does not foresee, nor does it provide for, Communion of the faithful from the reserved Sacrament. Liturgical laws have long defended your right to receive from the same sacrifice, the same Mass, that you attend.

At one time, of course, the bread for the Eucharist was the ordinary bread of the day, except unleavened, probably prepared at home. It was broken and distributed to the faithful. Early on the loaf itself was referred to as the hostia in Latin, meaning the "sacrifice," the same word for the sacrificial animal in Jewish worship, and for Jesus as the Lamb of God. By giving his life on the cross, Jesus became the hostia for us. To this day in the Greek Church, one of the tasks of the priest's wife is to bake the bread for the Divine Liturgy, sometimes in a bakery oven dedicated to that purpose and called a "Bethlehem."

Today's familiar individual hosts first appeared in the eleventh century at about the time when tabernacles were coming into use. The turn away from "bread" bread allowed the hosts to be reserved since they did not spoil like regular bread, and made the annual "Easter duty" counts easier. -Rev. James Field, Copyright (c) J. S. 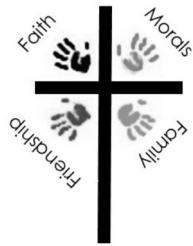

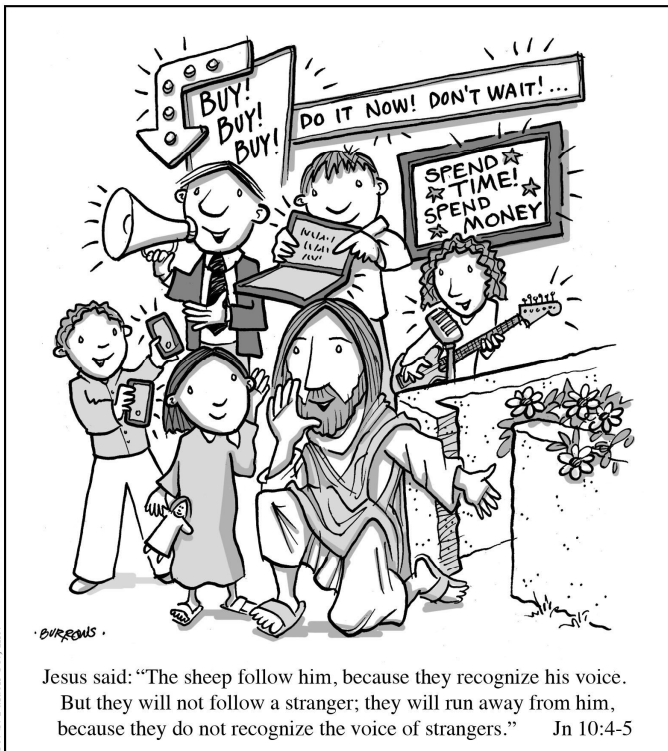

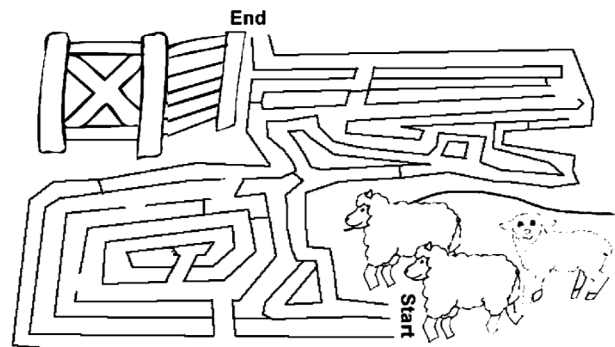
