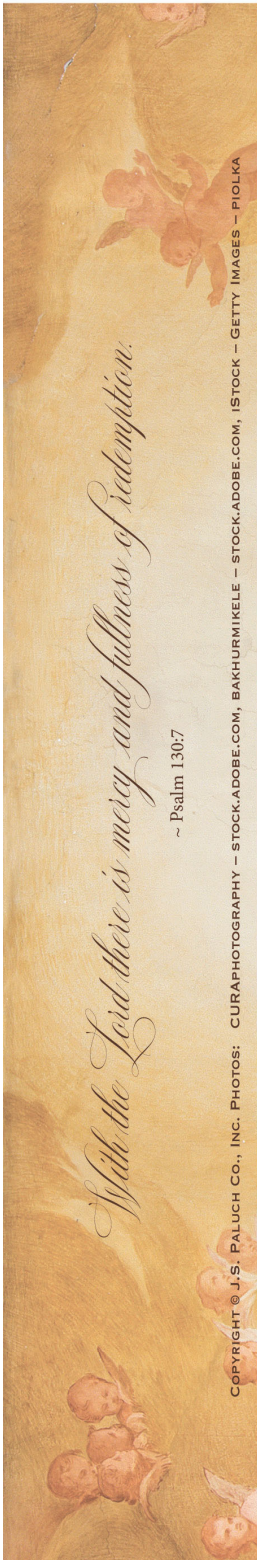

From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings from Uganda – the Pearl of Africa.

I look forward to joining you in prayer at the altar of Saint Hugh Parish next week.

Today is the Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Throughout the Green Season of Ordinary Time, we will count the Sundays until Advent (Sunday December 2) with the Thirty-Fourth Sunday rendered as the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This year, there is one exception to the counting: Sunday June 24. On that weekend, instead of the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist.

The extra envelope this week is for retired priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Donations will help to support my three living predecessors: Fathers Ed Stokus, Tom Moran, and Bob Burnell through the good work of the Priests' Retirement and Mutual Aid Association aka PRMAA.

Thursday is Flag Day. Officially established by the 1916 proclamation of President Wilson; in 1949 President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14 of each year as National Flag Day.

Annually, near the end of the fiscal year, the members of the pastoral staff host a volunteer appreciation dinner to express our gratitude to those who serve in the various ministries of the parish. Paper and electronic invitations have been distributed based on lists compiled by the various ministries. However, if for any reason a name was mistakenly omitted, we would like to correct that quickly. Saint of the day

June 10. Blessed Joachima was a wife, mother, widow, and founder of the Carmelite Sisters of Charity. Used to taking care of others, she experienced total dependency on others toward the end of her life.

June 11. Saint Barnabas played a fairly big role in the expansion of the early Church. Closely associated with Saint Paul, he shared in several of Paul's trips and difficulties.

June 13. Saint Anthony of Padua was an Augustinian monk who joined the Franciscans hoping to be a missionary. But God had other plans for him. He became one of the outstanding philosopher/theologians of the Order.

June 15. Saint Marguerite founded the Sisters of Charity of Montreal, the "Grey Nuns," rescued a failing hospital, and cared for the sick. Not even the destruction of the hospital by fire drove her to despair.

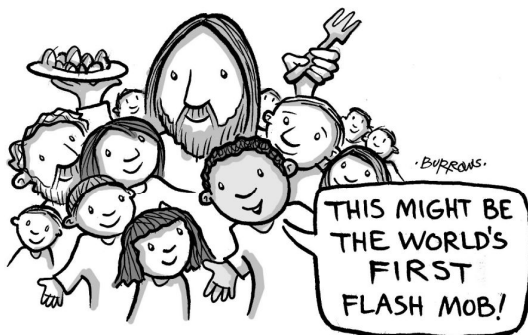

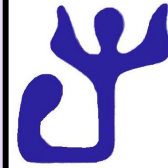

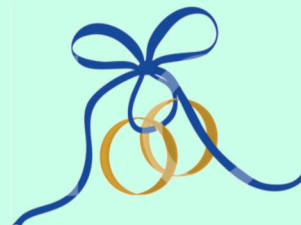

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus longs for us to belong to one family in him, through baptism. Today's readings look at three blessings provided by membership in God's family: understanding, permanence, and hospitality. In Genesis, Adam and Eve, filled with shame, hide from God. God finds them, of course, and sees deep into their hearts. Before God discusses their disobedience, God shows understanding and tenderness by banishing the creature most responsible for their sin: the serpent. God always understands and protects the members of God's family. This protection does not prevent suffering on earth, but, as Saint Paul explains to the Corinthians, guarantees our permanent, glorious happiness in heaven. Today's Gospel reminds us that God wants to welcome all of us into that glory. Breaking all barriers, Jesus assures us he heartily welcomes all who love and follow him. God's family welcomes, understands, and offers eternal life.

Treasures from our Tradition

The cathedral is a treasure in a diocese and in our tradition. It is not simply a "big church," as some say; some parish churches are larger. What makes a cathedral is the presence of the chair, called a *cathedra* (Latin for seat) reserved for the bishop.

There are many instances in our country of a local church (diocese) outgrowing a cathedral. In Baltimore and St. Louis, the former cathedrals are historic treasures in the heart of the old city, but new and larger structures now function as the seat of the bishop.

When a bishop dies or retires, it is said that "the seat is vacant," and when the new bishop is installed, the central ritual is the moment when the decree of the Holy Father is read and the new bishop is escorted to the *cathedra*. No one but the bishop sits in the *cathedra* during a ritual, but in Los Angeles the *cathedra* in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels is accessible, and no one seems to mind when a visitor tries the *cathedra* out for the bishop's point of view.

The family of the deceased should rely on the professional skill of a funeral director who will assist in making arrangements with the parish and cemetery.
