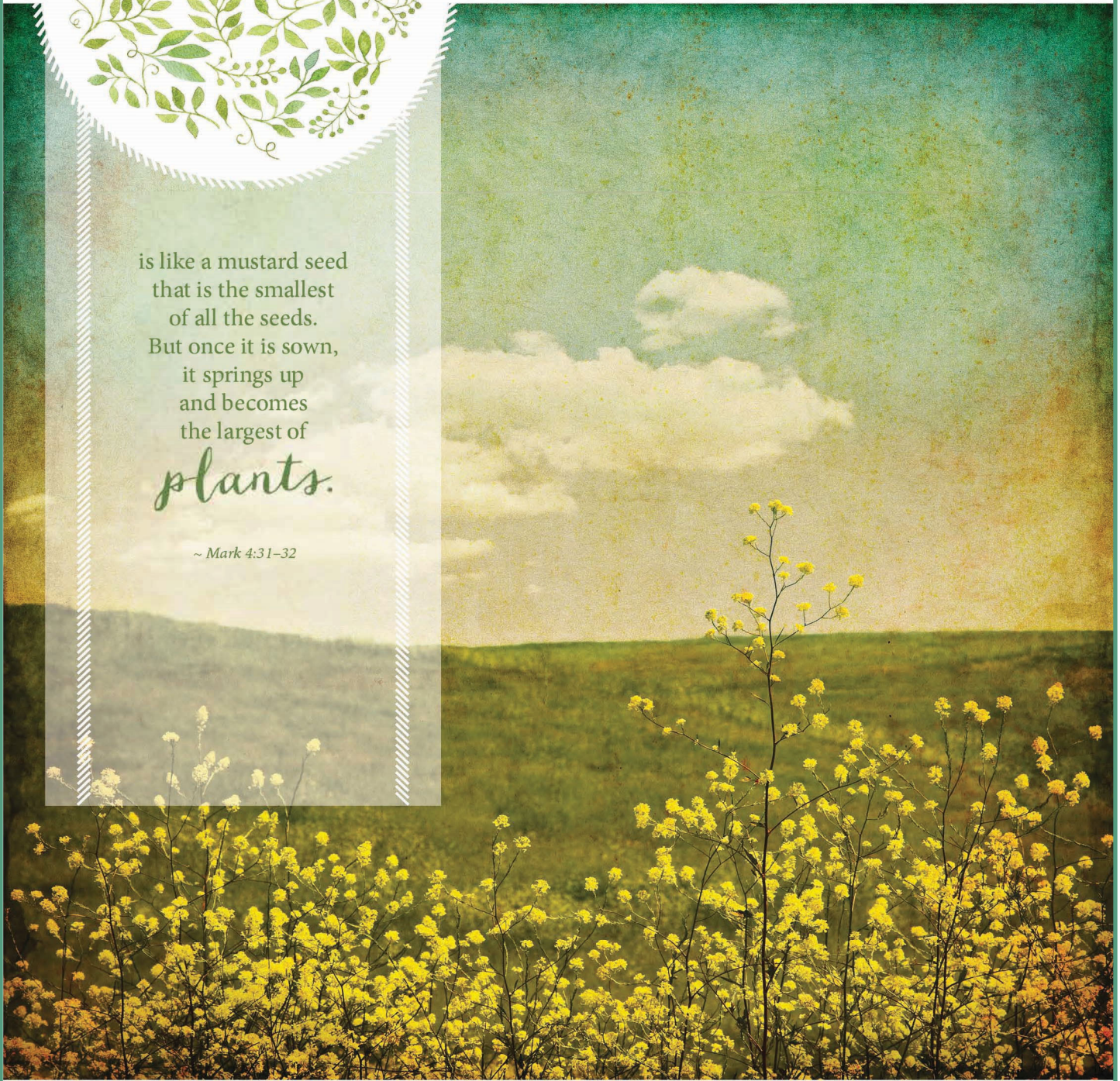

From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. As the third Sunday of June, today is nationally celebrated as Father's Day. The following *Blessing of Fathers* is taken from our Baptismal Rite:

God is the giver of all life, human and divine. May he bless the fathers of these children. With their wives they will be the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith. May they also be the best of teachers, bearing witness to the faith by what they say and do, in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen

Beginning Monday evening June 18 and continuing through the afternoon of Thursday June 21, the priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago will gather in Convocation with Cardinal Cupich at Pheasant Run in Saint Charles, IL. I am a long-time advocate for encouraging priest morale and served as a member of the initial Convocation Committee with Cardinal Bernardin in 1992. This time for shared prayer, study, and fraternity has been held every few years since; most recently with Cardinal George in 2014. While most parishes will be cancelling Masses, at Saint Hugh the daily Mass at 10:30am on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday will be covered by Comboni Missionary Priests. Pray for your priests.

Next weekend, as we celebrate the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist, I will formally say farewell as the pastor of Saint Hugh Parish. Our Society of Catholic Women is arranging for a reception following the 10:30am Mass on June 24. I am grateful for the experience of these past six years and for all who are Saint Hugh Parish.

Annually, near the end of the fiscal year, the members of the pastoral staff host a volunteer appreciation dinner to express our gratitude to those who serve in the various ministries of the parish. Paper and electronic invitations have been distributed based on lists compiled by the various ministries. However, if for any reason a name was mistakenly omitted, we would like to correct that quickly. Those planning to attend on Thursday June 28 are asked to RSVP. (See below for details.)

The Big Picture

We hear about the Kingdom of God in many of Jesus' parables. In today's passage, he uses parables to describe how the kingdom will spread. What is interesting is that they are not so much about our actions as they are about how God builds his kingdom.

Let's start with the second parable: Jesus exaggerates a little, with the mustard seed being the smallest seed and the bush being the largest plant. Like the birds on the branches, Jesus implies that the growing kingdom will attract outsiders to be members. His point is that the kingdom may look small at first, but it will keep growing. We need not be discouraged when it seems the kingdom is not growing: We might be limiting it to people who think and act just like ourselves. We might see attendance at church in our parish declining. So Jesus is reminding us to think of the bigger picture.

In the first parable about the man who scattered seeds, Jesus says that those seeds produce a harvest, even though the farmer doesn't know how or why those seeds can grow. We too can be doing things that help the Kingdom to grow, without knowing how we are helping. But God is making the kingdom grow in his own way and in his own time. Like the farmer, we can help it grow by loving each other, teaching our children about Jesus, caring for the poor and the sick. But we can also hinder the kingdom by being stingy with our love, or hurting people with our anger. So let us ask God to trust him as we do our part to help the kingdom to grow.

Saint of the Day

June 21. Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was a precocious child who had a spiritual awakening at the age of 7. He entered the Jesuits where he had to learn to live and maneuver within community. Aloysius helped nurse patients of the plague which he caught & caused his death.

June 22. Saint Thomas More is the patron of those in the law profession. Husband, father, chancellor, and lawyer, Saint Thomas More stands out as a leading figure in British history. He was reluctantly martyred by King Henry VIII in 1535.

June 23. Saint John Fisher, a bishop and cardinal, refused to agree with Henry VIII's divorce and remarriage as well as the idea that the king, rather than the pope, was the head of the Church in England. He was imprisoned and eventually martyred.

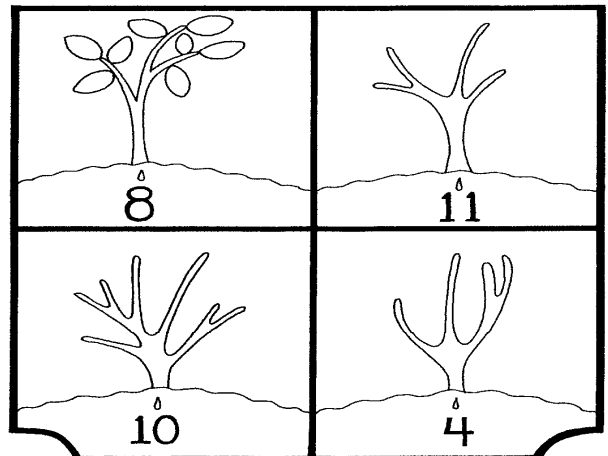

St. Vincent DePaul: We are in need of volunteers to respond to those who request our assistance. Must be over 18.

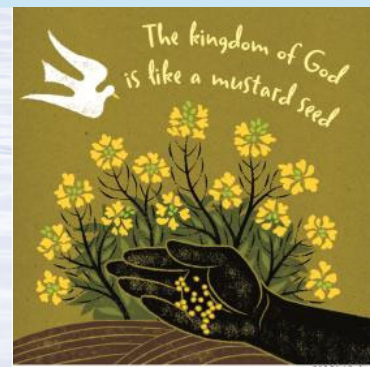
SPRED: Volunteers needed to accompany those with developmental disabilities on their faith journey. Must be 21 years old.

Treasures from our Tradition

The reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ's total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God's own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.

On Sundays, this self-giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. Yet the acts of giving from our abundance and attending to the needs of the poor open us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires.
