



From the Pastor's Desk

While the liturgical calendar returned to Ordinary Time (think Green) following Pentecost, the two Sundays following the Easter Season are given to a pair of so-called feasts of devotion. This weekend is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

In 1264, Pope Urban IV extended the Feast of Corpus Christi to the universal church. The medieval feast has been combined with the nineteenth century Feast of The Most Precious Blood of Christ (*Sanguis Pretiosissimus Christi*) to form today's solemnity. In addition to Holy Thursday and First Communions during Easter-time, we welcome this opportunity to reflect on the importance of the Eucharist.

Appropriate for this Solemnity is the picture below from last month's First Holy Communion. Those who have not yet picked up their individual pictures should arrange to do so.

On the Friday following Corpus Christi, that is nineteen days after Pentecost, we annually celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. See the invitation from the Comboni Missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on page three of this bulletin.

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is also recognized as a World Day of Prayer for the sanctification of priests. This practice was established by Pope Saint John Paul II in 2002. In your kindness, pray for holy priests both diocesan and religious.

On Saturday we will celebrate the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist - one of only three birthdays on the liturgical calendar. The other two are the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on September 8 (nine months after her Immaculate Conception) and the Nativity of the Lord (aka Christmas) on December 25 (nine months after the Annunciation of the Lord and six months from Saturday's Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist).

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

Scrip makes great gifts



Catholic Communion by Paul Turner

Visitors to Catholic parishes often complain that they may not join in communion at Mass. Many other denominations welcome all who profess faith in Christ to the communion table, but Catholics have always restricted who shares the meal. For many who practice hospitality at home by setting an extra place at the table for visitors, the Catholic custom gives offense.

However, Catholic communion is just that, a sign of Catholic unity. The Eucharist symbolizes our union with God but also our union with one another.

Many groups use a symbol to identify their members. Students wear school jackets. Scouts earn medals. These customs give groups signs of association. When a new member joins the group, the symbol frequently becomes part of the rite of initiation, a sign of transition, and a source of pride. Those baptized in other communions who make a profession of faith with us may be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church. Their communion becomes the high point of their transition into membership.

Ordinarily, Catholics do not share communion at other churches nor do other believers share communion in Catholic churches. Exceptions exist but they are rare. In danger of death, for example, or in some grave necessity, non-Catholics might receive permission from a Catholic bishop to receive communion. If they do not have regular access to their own minister, ask for Catholic communion on their own, and express a Catholic faith in the Eucharist, they may obtain permission to receive communion.

Theologians debate the possibilities for full communion while ordinary families find themselves separated by what often appears to them as small differences in their beliefs. The more unity we find among ourselves, the closer all Christian churches will come to resolving the differences.

Treasures from our tradition

At the heart of today's solemnity is a eucharistic procession, held in many parishes, that calls to mind the procession of Holy Thursday, yet has a purpose different from the somber adoration in the night watch. In the late Middle Ages, a procession through the city with the Blessed Sacrament was an occasion of heartfelt joy and great emotion. In a time when people seldom approached the altar to receive Holy Communion, the procession through the streets, past homes and workplaces, was a vibrant reminder that Christ was with them as a dear companion and guide.

Every year on this day, a joyful procession winds through the streets of Rome from the Lateran cathedral. A few years ago, Pope John Paul II, deeply moved at the sight of the throng accompanying the sacred host, said that we ought to feel profoundly united with the faithful everywhere in the world at such a moment. "Before our mind's eye all the Churches of the world, from East to West, from North to South, are present." Originally this feast was on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but after the calendar reform of 1970, its title was expanded from "Corpus Christi" to "The Body and Blood of Christ" and in the United States it was moved to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. Even though Easter season ended two weeks ago, this beautiful feast is aglow with Easter light.


