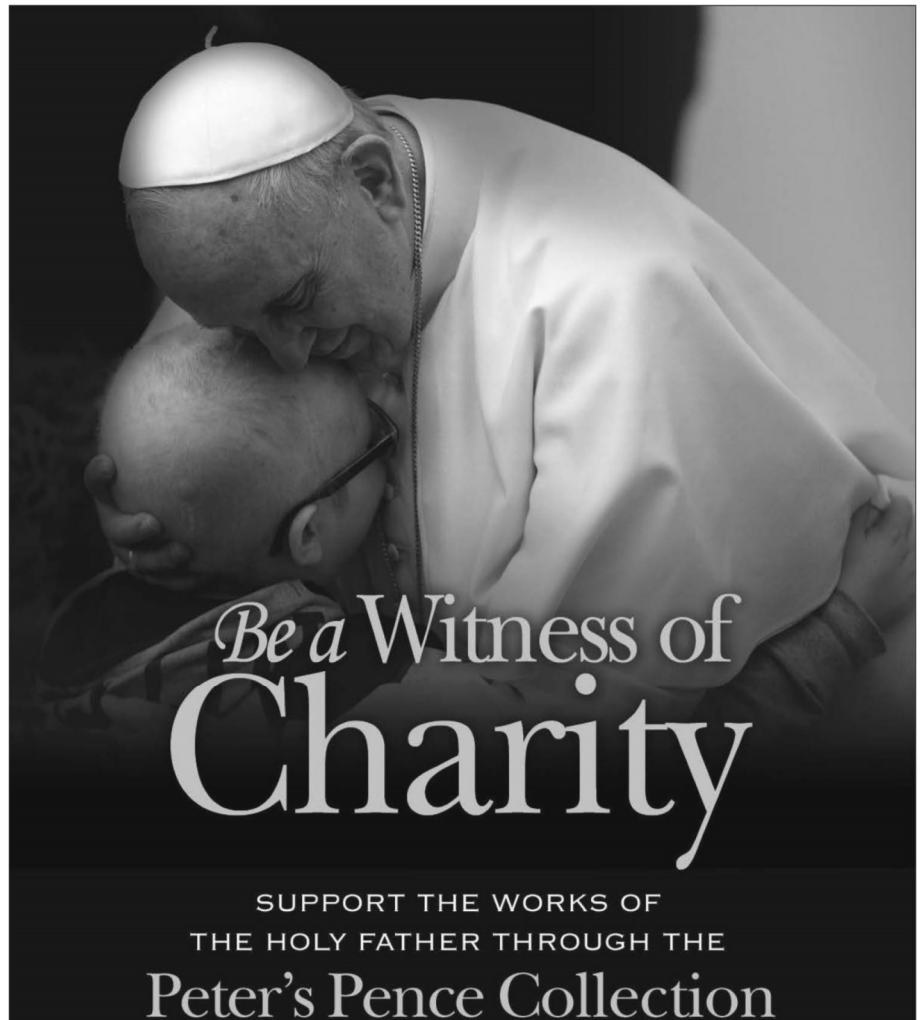

Today is the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Throughout the Green Season, we will count the Sundays until Advent (Sunday December 3) with the Thirty-Fourth Sunday rendered as the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This year, there is one exception to the counting: Sunday August 6. On that weekend, instead of the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we will celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord.

The Peter's Pence envelope this weekend supports the charitable works of Pope Francis. This collection is taken up by Catholics around the globe and helps the Holy Father reach out to the suffering in our world, especially those enduring the effects of war and violence, natural disasters, and religious persecution. Each Summer, the parishes of the Archdiocese of Chicago are paired with a particular mission cause. This year we have been partnered with the Catholic Diocese of Segheneity in Eritrea (East Africa). Summer Mission Cooperative July 1-2 for the Diocese of Segheneity, Eritrea

Eritrea is located on the horn of Africa along the coast of the Red Sea; it is the youngest country in Africa. Due to its geographical location, Eritrea has seen several wars and occupations throughout its history: by the Greeks, Ottomans Turks, Arabs, Italians, and the British; and finally by the Ethiopians. This resulted in a 30 plus years of ruthless and vicious war, until its independence was won 1991.

The new Eparchy (Diocese) of Segheneity erected in 2012 is built in a territory which includes the ancient harbor of Adulis, a Bethlehem of Christian civilization for both Eritrea and Ethiopia. Its territory consists of 29,499 square kilometer with the total population of 900,000 of whom 36,000 are Catholics.

In the new Eparchy of Segheneity there are 51 parishes and chapels, 14 Catholic schools, 9 health centers, and 2 hospitals. Furthermore, there are 5 male religious orders (including the MCCJ) and 9 female Orders.

Despite its minority status in number, the Catholic Church in Eritrea is a living witness of the gospel and by far, the most respected in the country. As our people struggle with a multitude of serious difficulties that hamper development, the Catholic Church provides pastoral work, supports orphans, assists with HIV/AIDS patients, runs schools and health clinics, counsels war trauma victims, and promotes peace and reconciliation of this region.

In January 2014, His Grace Bishop Hagos established a Board of Trustee which is made up of 15 members from the United States of America, Canada and Europe. The main mission of the Board of Trustee is to introduce the new Eparchy to the world, to organize the Eritrean Catholic Community residing across the globe and to fund-raising for the Eparchy. The funds raised by the Board will assist the Eparchy to fulfill its need in order to continue its spiritual work in catechesis, to support the Catholic schools, and to sustain the Social causes of the Eparchy of Segheneity.

June 26: Eid al-Fitr

The first day of the Islamic month of Shawwal, marks the end of the month-long fast of Ramadan. This important Islamic holiday involves many Muslims waking up early and praying. Many Muslims dress in their finest clothes and adorn their homes with lights and other decorations. Old wrongs are forgiven and money is given to the poor. Special foods are prepared and friends or relatives are invited to share the feast. Gifts and greeting cards are exchanged and children receive presents. Eid al-Fitr is a joyous occasion but its underlying purpose is to praise God and give thanks to him, according to Islamic belief.

That Saints Peter and Paul suffered martyrdom under persecutions in Rome is virtually certain. The legends about their death lack historical proof, but they make a great story:

Fire broke out in Rome in 64 A.D. under Nero, the emperor-violinist. Housing and places of amusement were destroyed. The people grew angry at Nero, who blamed the Christians for the blaze and persecuted

them. To placate the people in their continuing distress, Nero ordered the death of Christianity's two greatest leaders, Peter and Paul, in the year 67.

When Peter heard about the growing persecutions, he fled Rome. But he saw a vision of Jesus walking back toward the city of Rome. "Where are you going?" Peter asked. ("Quo vadis?") "To Rome, to be crucified again," Jesus mournfully replied. Peter, knowing he had to follow his master, turned about and went back to the city.

On the day of their execution, Peter and Paul met. Paul had been in prison in Rome, under house arrest. Since he was a Roman citizen he avoided the kind of death that awaited Peter—crucifixion in the city. Paul was to be beheaded outside the city walls. On June 29, Peter and Paul embraced on the Ostian Way. Peter marched north toward the public arena; Paul marched south outside the city gate. When Paul was beheaded, his head bounced three times. A spring of water gushed forth at each place. (The monastery of The Three Fountains stands on the site today. The residents make chocolate.) Since the main civic arena had been destroyed in the fire, Peter was crucified in a makeshift location. Claiming he was not worthy to be killed like his master, he was turned upside down on the cross. After he died, his body was buried in a pauper's grave. That grave is the site of the Vatican.

On June 29 we celebrate the apostle of the Jews and the apostle of the Gentiles. Together they brought the message of Christ to the world. So significant is their feast that in some countries it is a holy day of obligation. In the United States, when the feast falls on Sunday, it takes the place of the usual ordinary time liturgy. It helps us celebrate our mission to bring Christ to the world, no matter the cost.

Treasures from our tradition

The Eucharistic Prayers at the heart of our liturgy have a long history, beginning with the extemporaneous prayers of the early Christians. The presiders gave thanks from their hearts, not from any prearranged text, over the gifts of bread and wine. When the assembly had the sense that enough was said, someone would call out "Amen!" and that was that. For the most part, the plan flowed directly from Jewish meal prayers, which always recalled God's mighty deeds. Some other markers and signposts were added almost everywhere fairly early, like the presider's call to attention: "Lift up your hearts!"

Scholars have provided us with translations of many early texts. These have actually helped us craft new liturgical prayers, because until the liturgical reforms of forty years ago, no one could recall any prayer but the Roman Canon, now called Eucharistic Prayer I. For hundreds of years in the West, it was our only Eucharistic Prayer, and it was only in Latin. But the history of our Eucharistic Prayers is amazingly fruitful, and models have come down to us that have yielded new insights and expressions. The old custom of improvising texts according to a master plan has not endured, but we have now rediscovered a plan of standardizing the text while allowing for a great variety.

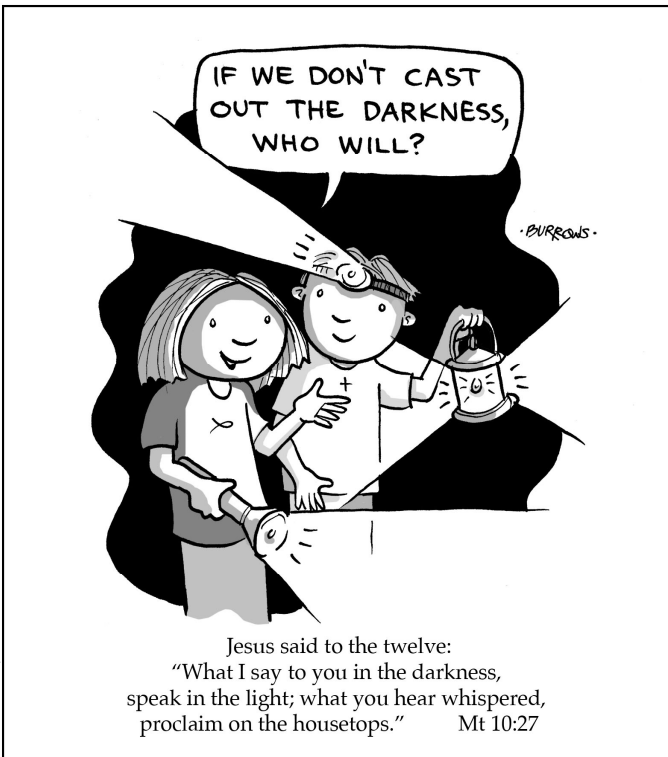

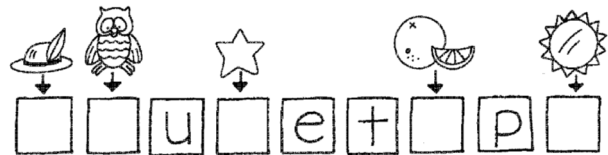
