On this Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time we welcome the Rev. Melanio Viuya, MJ as we participate in the sixty-eighth annual Archdiocesan Missionary Co-operative. Each summer we dedicate one weekend to reflect on and to pray for the missionary activity of the universal church and to support one particular cause. This year we have been partnered with the Missionaries of Jesus (MJ). Founded in the Philippines in 2002, the MJ is an international and multicultural religious missionary community presently working in Guatemala, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, and the USA. The MJ focus on evangelization of people, formation of leaders, education of the youth, socio-economic and health needs of the poor and the indigenous people.



Father Melanio R. Viuya, Jr., MJ joined the religious life in 1983. He was a missionary in Congo (Africa) for seven years where he was ordained a priest in 1995. He earned his Licentiate in Sacred Scriptures

(S.S.L.) at Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and taught Sacred Scriptures in various institutions in the Philippines. He is presently helping the parishes of St. Kevin and Precious Blood in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles while fulfilling his assignment as Director of Missions of the Missionaries of Jesus. 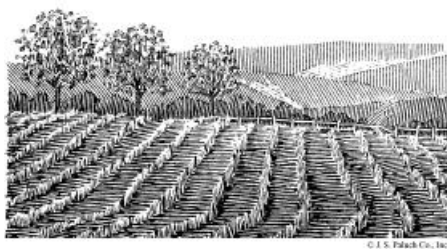

Question of the week

While "resolutely determining to journey" with Jesus this week, which priorities do I need to reorder? Which relationships refresh or rearrange? Which judgments of others do I need to transform into serene and non-judgmental prayer?

Jubilee of Mercy: December 8, 2015 - November 20, 2016



Yet again in Ordinary Time, Jesus seems to demand extraordinary commitment. A would-be disciple enthusiastically volunteers to follow Jesus "wherever" (Luke 9:57). Jesus replies that "wherever" means "nowhere to rest his head" (9:58). To other candidates, Jesus brusquely denies reasonable requests to fulfill family obligations (9:59, 61), declaring that discipleship demands total commitment--now! But Jesus also demands that we not judge how others respond. When James and John volunteered to "call down fire from heaven" (9:54) to destroy an unwelcoming town, Jesus "turned and rebuked them" (9:55). All violence of any kind is completely unacceptable among Jesus' disciples, a lesson this Jubilee Year of Mercy is teaching the Christian community once again. Paul's challenge to the Galatians and us reinforces

Jesus' decisive command to James and John that they express their commitment to him through compassion for others. We must abandon the violence of "biting and devouring one another" (Galatians 5:15), choosing instead to "serve one another through love" (5:13). - Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. 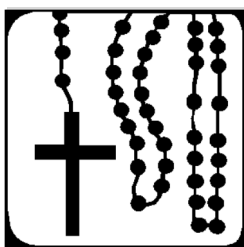

Treasures from the tradition

An old and still vital treasure in our tradition is a document called the "Apostolic Traditions," giving us a snapshot of church life in third-century Rome. Its author, Hippolytus, describes the liturgical life of the church and records the actual texts of the prayers. The way he explained the various "orders" of the church was the basis for a major reform of the rites of ordination by Pope Pius XII in 1947, and later for the Second Vatican Council. Hippolytus tells us that a bishop had to be elected by the entire people, and that ordination had to take place on a Sunday in the presence of the people, the presbyters, and neighboring bishops. The bishop-candidate is ordained by the other bishops, who impose their hands on his head while everyone else keeps a profound silence, awaiting the outpouring of the Spirit. There is a prayer of blessing said by one of them, on behalf of all, asking for the Spirit and describing his ministry. Later centuries layered new features on top of this liturgy, including the requirement for three bishop consecrators. Today, whenever a new bishop is announced (election by the people is no more), a kind of genealogy is provided, tracing his pedigree through the consecrating bishops down through the centuries to Peter and the first body of believers. Every bishop today can trace his office through his consecrators back to the beginning in a tradition called "apostolic succession."

Disposing of Religious Articles by Paul Turner

When religious articles deteriorate to a point when they can no longer be used effectively, they may be disposed of with dignity. Your parish may burn old palm branches to make ashes for Ash Wednesday. But the proper disposal of other religious articles is not so clear.

The Code of Canon Law says that sacred objects designated for divine worship by dedication or blessing are to be treated reverently. They are not to be employed for profane or inappropriate use (1171). Regarding large buildings, the code says they lose their dedication or blessing if they have been destroyed in large part, or if they have been turned over permanently to profane use (1212).

But the code does not directly answer a very practical question many Catholics have: "What do I do with a broken rosary, a tarnished medal, or a deteriorating statue?"

In the past, the Vatican has offered several different solutions. If possible, put the object to some other sacred use. If not, burn it, melt it, or bury it. Try to avoid letting the object enter secular or profane use.

If you have old religious articles at home, you may bury them in the ground. When you do, you might read a passage from the Bible such as Revelation 21:1-5, which speaks about the passing away of a former world and the coming of something new. Recall the occasions you have used these items. Pray the Lord's Prayer. Do it in a spirit of thankfulness for all that these objects have meant and out of respect for the sacred realities they have represented.

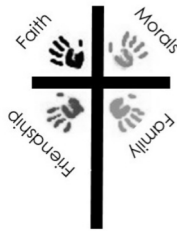

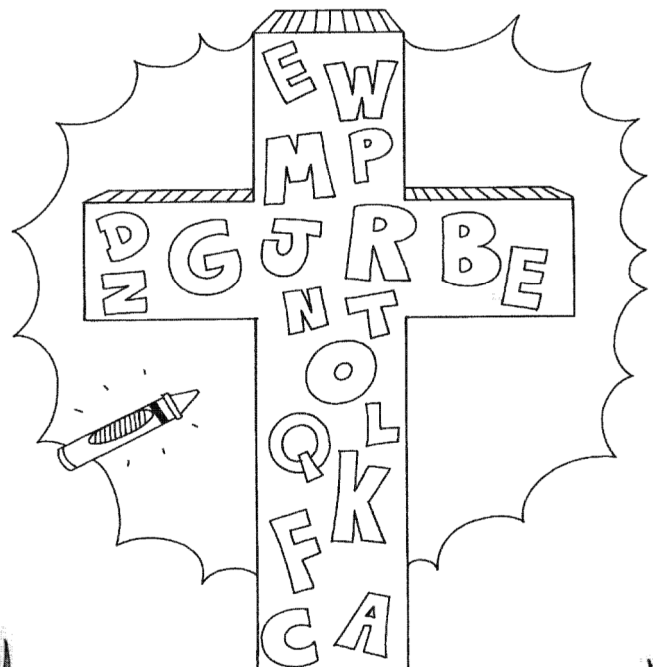
