From the Pastor's Desk

While the liturgical calendar returned to Ordinary Time (think Green) following Pentecost, the two Sundays following the Easter Season are given to a pair of so-called feasts of devotion. This weekend is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

In 1264, Pope Urban IV extended the Feast of Corpus Christi to the universal church. The medieval feast has been combined with the nineteenth century Feast of The Most Precious Blood of Christ (*Sanguis Pretiosissimus Christi*) to form today's solemnity. In addition to Holy Thursday and First Communions during Easter-time, we welcome this opportunity to reflect on the importance of the Eucharist.

In the United States June 3, when not a Sunday, is the memorial of Saint Charles Lwanga and companions. Today, in Kampala, I will be among a million faithful, including many pilgrims, celebrating the Uganda Martyrs.

On this first Sunday of June, we happily recognize, congratulate and bless those who are members of the Class of 2018. While *commencement*, literally a beginning, is about what happens next, the graduation rites also allow one to look back and appreciate with gratitude what one has achieved during his or her studies. The following prayer *For Graduation* was composed by Jim Dinn for Pax Christi USA:

Spirit of Wisdom, whose truth fills our world and invites us into a lifetime of learning, bless these graduates. Give them joy and a sense of accomplishment in what they have achieved. But give them also a thirst for knowledge. Make them seekers who will enjoy the process of discovery. Let their education go beyond classrooms and books. Sensitize them to the lessons of experience and the wisdom of the heart. Open them to faith as well as reason, intuition as well as logic. Give them curiosity that goes beyond partial answers and old insights. But through all their life give them an inner peace so they are neither inflated by what they know nor frustrated by what is still beyond their grasp. Abiding teacher, may this graduation signal the beginning of their larger education. Bless them and all of us with your wisdom and peace. Amen

On the Friday following Corpus Christi, that is nineteen days after Pentecost, we annually celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This June 8 is a major feast for the Comboni Missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (MCCJ).

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is also recognized as a World Day of Prayer for the sanctification of priests. This practice was established by Pope Saint John Paul II in 2002. In your kindness, pray for holy priests both diocesan and religious.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

I never noticed it before, but our reading from Mark's gospel is similar to the story in John's gospel of the wedding feast at Cana. They begin with a problem presented to Jesus: Lack of wine (John) and a place for Passover meal (Mark.) Jesus responds to both by giving orders: to the waiters (Jn) and to the apostles (Mk.) And both have miraculous changes: water into wine (Jn); bread and wine into Jesus' Body and Blood (Mk.)

Now the wedding feast showed Jesus replacing the water used for purifying dishes with wine to bring joy to the wedding. He replaced the kosher laws with a new one, the law of love, symbolized by the feast. In our gospel today, Jesus replaces ordinary food with spiritual food. He is doing something new, beyond the requirements of the Old Testament.

What does that mean for us? Jesus is showing God's love for us in a new way. The bread and wine at the last Supper were signs of Jesus' body being broken and his blood poured out for us on the cross.

When he gave his life for us, he rose from the dead to give us hope. And now we have the Eucharist, in which he becomes our new food and drink.

Do we really believe that the Eucharist is Jesus, the Son of God? The way to measure that is to ask, how has Jesus changed your life? Do you love others more because you know God loves you? Do you have less fear of the future, because the Holy Spirit gives you courage? Let us look forward to being renewed in spirit whenever we receive the Body and Blood of Christ.







Treasures from our tradition

The origins of today's solemnity lie in thirteenth-century Belgium. In those days, people seldom received Holy Communion, and never from the chalice. A nun in a troubled convent, Juliana of Liège, devoted her life to stirring up love for the Eucharist, lobbying for a feast day to honor the Blessed Sacrament with Masses and processions.

Juliana may have been inspired by the Ascension Day processions in nearby Bruges. Crusaders brought a treasure home to Bruges from Constantinople in 1204: a reliquary said to contain a cloth from Joseph of Arimathea with which he had helped prepare the body of Jesus for burial. The stain on the cloth was said to be the holy blood itself, and so the people of Bruges built a great basilica to house the relic. Bruges became a great center of pilgrimage because of this treasure, and the procession of the Holy Blood is still one of the greatest festivals in Belgium today. The bishop carries the relic through the narrow streets, and the people wear medieval costumes and act out scenes from the Bible.


