Mission Cooperative for the Diocese of Segheneity, Eritrea

Eritrea is located on the horn of Africa along the coast of the Red Sea; it is the youngest country in Africa. The new Eparchy (Diocese) of Segheneity, erected in 2012, consists of 11,393 square miles with the total population of 900,000 of whom 36,000 are Catholics. Abune Fikremariam Hagos Tsalim is the first Bishop. There are 51 parishes and chapels, 14 Catholic schools, 9 health centers, and 2 hospitals. Furthermore, there are 5 male religious orders (including the MCCJ) and 9 female orders. As people struggle with a multitude of serious difficulties that hamper development, the Catholic Church provides pastoral work, supports orphans, assists with HIV/AIDS patients, runs schools and health clinics, counsels war trauma victims, and promotes peace and reconciliation of this region. Today's first reading reminds us of the importance of hospitality. Please consider the following as we try to make visitors and parishioners welcome this summer. Our hospitality can be a powerful way of saying "We are glad that you are here. Please join us every Sunday for worship." Here are some suggestions for extending hospitality:

- Before Mass: Greet one another. Introduce yourself. Move toward the center of the pew so that it is easier for others to enter. Silence your phone. Smile.
- During Mass: Actively participate. Sing. Take the initiative at the sign of peace. Pray with and for each other. Smile.
- After Mass: Return two copies of *Breaking Bread* to each book rack. Return the Order of Service card to the hat clip with the word WELCOME being the first thing that the next person will see. Put the kneelers up so that it is easier for the next person to enter. Remove whatever you have brought into the pew including the bulletin, tissues, diapers, papers, and water bottles. Smile.

Saints in the Eucharistic Prayers by Paul Turner

When Catholics pray, we often ask the saints to join us, just as we ask friends and family. Privately, Catholics may pray to a particular saint, but at Mass we address prayer to the Father. Just as the assembly of the faithful on earth prays, the assembly of the saints in heaven joins in. This is especially obvious in the eucharistic prayers that mention saints by name.

The clearest example is Eucharistic Prayer I, which has origins in the fourth century. The first versions of this prayer did not mention any saints, but as devotion increased in subsequent centuries, the names of several saints were added. The name of Mary appeared in the sixth century with her title "Mother of our God and Lord, Jesus Christ" to proclaim a recently defined belief—not that God had a mother, but that Jesus, the Son of Mary, is God. Joseph was included in 1962. The names of the 12 apostles follow—with Paul replacing Judas in the list. For balance, 12 martyrs come next—almost all of them from the early church in Rome.

Later in the prayer more saints are named. John the Baptist and Stephen head the second list as key biblical figures. Matthias, who replaced Judas, is finally mentioned, and then 12 more saints to balance the group of 12 earlier in the prayer. This second list includes seven women martyrs. Many priests do not read the whole list of saints in Eucharistic Prayer I; the abridgement is permitted for simplicity.

Other eucharistic prayers name a single saint—for example, the patron of the local church or the one whose feast is being celebrated. Whenever saints are included in the eucharistic prayer, they appear as intercessors who assist and as models to imitate.

Parish Patrons in our Renew My Church grouping:

Both Saint Mary (Riverside) and Mater Christi (North Riverside) are named for Mother of Jesus. Saint Pius X (Stickney) is named for the Pope (1903-1914) born Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto in 1835. He undertook liturgical and canonical reforms especially communion for children and frequent communion for adults. He condemned Modernism and wished "to renew all things in Christ." The patron of sick pilgrims, his feast day is August 21.

Treasures from our tradition

It's Independence Day week, and there is a link worth tracing between the Declaration of Independence and the language of liturgy. One of the signers of the Declaration on that July 4 long ago was Charles Carroll, probably the wealthiest man in the colonies and one of the few Catholics on the political scene. As a flourish to his signature, he sought to distinguish himself from other prominent citizens bearing the same name by penning "Charles Carroll of Carrolltown"--a defiant "come and get me if you dare" postscript aimed at the British.

Carroll's brother John was a priest and patriot who in 1789 was given the task of organizing the Catholic Church in this country. By 1791 he had assembled a synod, or assembly of delegates, to launch that task formally. Archbishop Carroll wanted to gain acceptance of our faith by American people who mistrusted our customs and could not comprehend our liturgy. He made the amazing proposal to Rome that our liturgy should be prayed not in Latin, but in the vernacular, English. His wish was denied, but one hundred sixty years later, his deep desire helped the American bishops and scholars at the Second Vatican Council to win the vote in favor of the vernacular not just for the United States, but for the Church throughout the world.

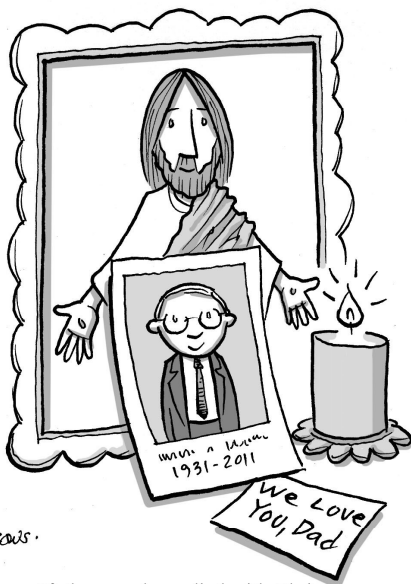

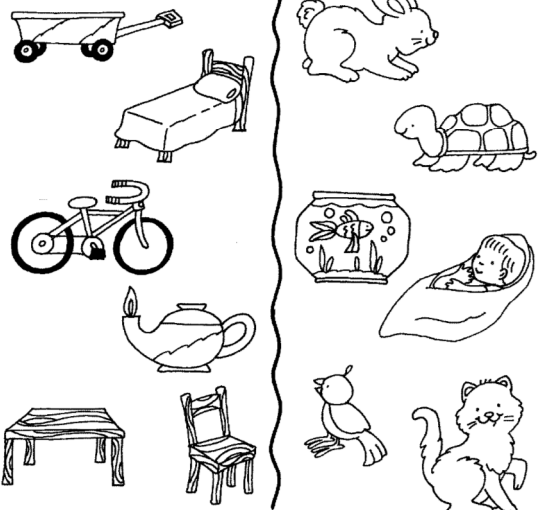
