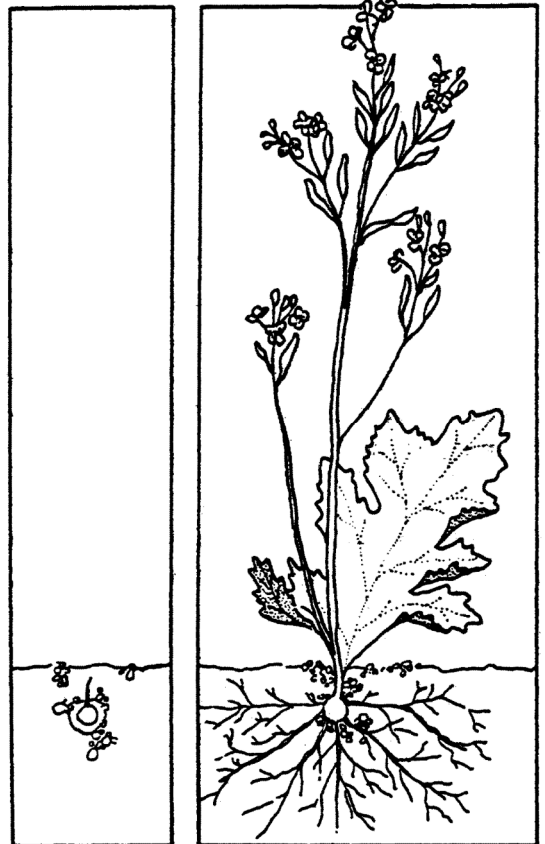

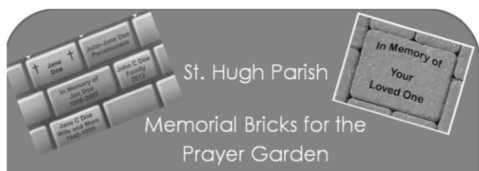


## From the Pastor's Desk

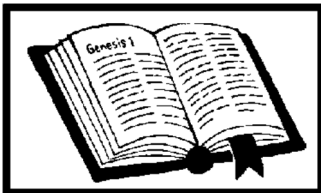


## Treasures from our tradition

For centuries, the only Eucharistic Prayer we heard as Western Catholics was the old Roman Canon, usually recited in a low voice by the priest, in Latin. By the 1940s, many Catholics were learning to follow along with the actions of the priest by means of a bilingual missal, with Latin on one side and English on the other. Drawings of the priest's position at the altar, moving from one side to the other, or bowing or standing with uplifted hands at the center, helped the readers stay on track.

The Roman Canon is a long prayer, and since it was done every day for every occasion, priests had a way of galloping through it. Even though long, its structure is fairly simple, with the consecration and sacrifice clearly marked out. Sadly, this surviving prayer had triumphed over many treasures of our tradition that emphasized other dimensions of Eucharist. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy in 1963 did not call directly for new Eucharistic Prayers, but that direction was inevitable. Discussion began almost immediately, and by 1967 the Vatican approved three new Eucharistic Prayers. In 1974, the Congregation for Worship unveiled the experiment of two Eucharistic Prayers for Masses of Reconciliation, and three for Masses with Children. At last, a period of creativity and enrichment had begun.

## Turning toward the ambo by Paul Turner

Among the new directives for the assembly in the 2002 *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* is this one, describing posture when the Gospel is proclaimed:

"Those present turn towards the ambo as a sign of special reverence for the Gospel of Christ" (133).

Most assemblies have always done this. In fact, people face the ambo and the reader for the other Scripture readings too. All the readings are to be proclaimed from the same place (128, 130, 133), so it is strange to be told to turn towards the ambo for the Gospel. The Gospel has priority among the Scriptures, but people should surely face the ambo for the entire Liturgy of the Word.

The directive has more meaning in older churches where the ambo is located not in the sanctuary but raised above a short staircase on one long side of the church. In the days before microphones and speakers, church architects made other accommodations for audibility. They built naturally resonant churches. The priest said most of the Mass quietly in the sanctuary. Choirs often sang from the back. But for preaching, some church designs placed the ambo closer to the middle of the building where all could hear more clearly. Today, when a reader proclaims the readings in those buildings, the assembly is in fixed seating, not all of which face the reader. But for the Gospel the people stand and can more easily turn toward the ambo in reverence.

A more common problem today is the faithful who read from a participation aid as the Scriptures are being proclaimed. It would give greater reverence to the word of God if all looked up, not down.
