## Mass Intentions

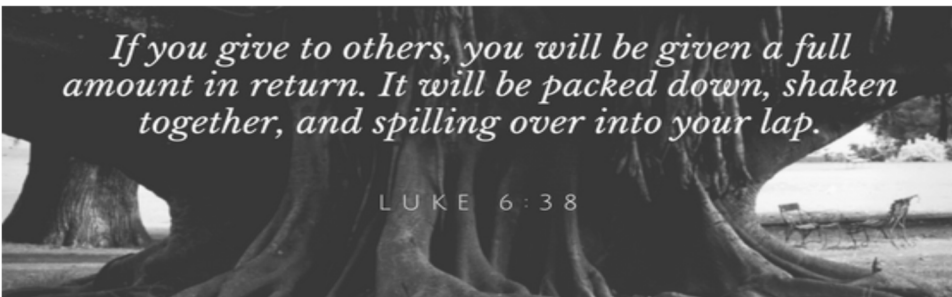

## Treasures from our tradition

The achievement of the late 1960s and early 1970s in enriching the "euchology" or "words of thanksgiving" available in the Church's prayer is important on many levels. Ecumenically, it means that the Latin Rite now reflects the wealth of the East in having more than one prayer available to the Church. Pastorally, it actually acknowledges the place of the assembly in prayer, which is particularly clear in the Masses with Children. In fact, the traditional prayers of the Eastern Church served as models for our new prayers.

In the East, what we call the Eucharistic Prayer is called the anaphora, and there are three main families of anaphora. Each family has a different "recipe" for arranging the usual parts of these prayers. All anaphora have "intercessions" included, but the Churches of Antioch place them toward the end of the prayer, Alexandria prefers them at the beginning before the "Holy, Holy," and Syria puts them at the very end. One branch of the Syrian family is unique in not mentioning the words of Jesus at the Last Supper. The Roman Canon we once prayed exclusively has some connection with the Alexandrian family, but once the signal for creativity was given, all the wealth of every prayer tradition was on the table, and our Sunday Mass has been greatly enriched.

## Solemnity by Paul Turner

A solemnity is a day of greatest significance on the Roman Catholic Church calendar. We commonly call almost any special day a "feast day," but "feast" is only one category of celebration. A solemnity is more important than a feast.

Solemnities resemble Sundays. However, not all solemnities are days of obligation. Catholics begin observing a solemnity on the evening before its date. We hear three Scripture readings at Mass. We recite the Creed. We include the Glory to God, even if the solemnity occurs during Advent and Lent, the seasons when this hymn is omitted from the Sunday Mass. On solemnities flowers may adorn the altar and the organ may play solo music, even during Lent, when these practices are otherwise forbidden. If an event such as a wedding takes place at Mass on a solemnity, the prayers and readings of the solemnity are used.

Solemnities include some biographical events and titles of Jesus (Christmas, Epiphany, Sacred Heart, and Christ the King), events and titles associated with Mary (Immaculate Conception, Annunciation, Mother of God, and Assumption), key biblical saints (Joseph, John the Baptist, Peter and Paul), and other days of religious significance (All Saints, Most Holy Trinity, and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ). Locally, solemnities include the patronal day of the city or state, the anniversary of the church's dedication, the day of the church's title, and the day of the title, founder, or patron of a religious order or congregation.

The solemnities of Christmas and Easter extend for eight days with some modified celebration each day. If a solemnity conflicts with a Sunday or another solemnity, it either replaces the Sunday or is transferred to the first available date.

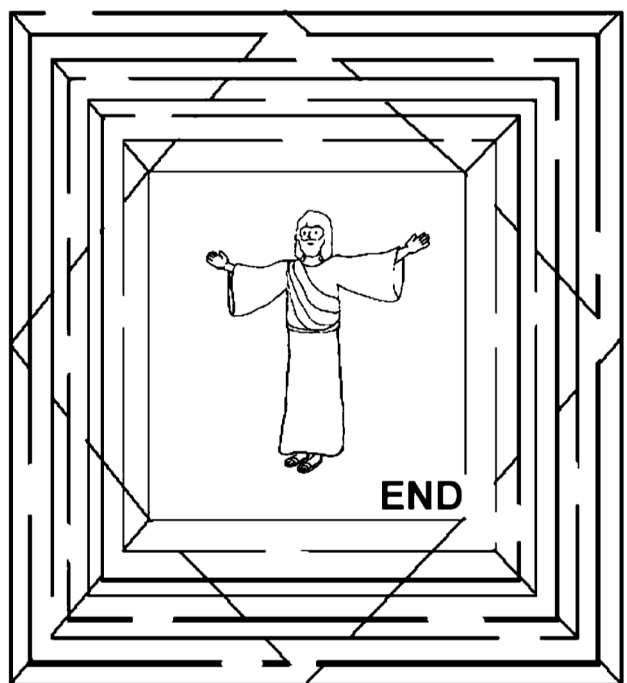
