From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) will meet at 7:00pm on Monday August 14.

Tuesday August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day of obligation. Parish Masses will be celebrated at 10:30am and 7:00pm. The liturgical revisions of Vatican II (1969) reorganized the Marian feasts recognizing four as Solemnities: August 15, March 25 (the Annunciation of the Lord), December 8 (the Immaculate Conception) and January 1 (Mary, Mother of God). The Assumption has been celebrated since the fifth century. The place in Jerusalem which commemorates this event is called the Church of the Dormition, literally the falling asleep of Mary. Tuesday's liturgy invites us to see Our Lady raised to heaven as the icon of the Church on the way to eternal glory.

On Saturday August 19 our SCW welcomes my friend Fr. Jim Presta for their continuing celebration of the Fatima Centennial (see middle column). That afternoon and evening is the annual festival supporting the Comboni Missionaries. Details are at the top right of this page and posted in the church vestibule. I look forward to attending both events on Saturday.

Our annual parish picnic is next Sunday following the 10:30am Mass. Parents will have an opportunity to register their children for Religious Education and other programs of Faith Formation. Other parish ministries will also have representatives available to sign up new members and volunteers. Free food makes this a great event for parishioners of all ages. See you there.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

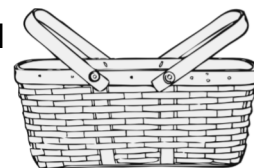

Memorial by Paul Turner

A memorial is a day of celebration on the church calendar. It ranks below solemnities and feasts. Some memorials are so minor that they are optional. The others are obligatory.

Memorials include the observance of saints' days in honor of Thomas Aquinas (January 28), Catherine of Siena (April 29), Justin (June 1), Anthony of Padua (June 13), Benedict (July

11), Mary Magdalene (July 22), Dominic (August 8), Clare (August 11), Maximilian Kolbe (August 14), Monica (August 27), Augustine (August 28), Gregory the Great (September 3), Jerome (September 30), Thérèse of Lisieux (October 1), Guardian Angels (October 2), Francis of Assisi (October 4), Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7), Martin of Tours (November 11), Cecilia (November 22), and Lucy (December 13). There are many more.

If a memorial falls on a day of higher rank—a Sunday, for example—it is not observed at the liturgy that year. Falling on a weekday, however, an obligatory memorial will always be observed. Optional memorials (such as Hedwig on October 16 or John of Kanty on December 23) may be celebrated or ignored.

On a memorial day the readings at Mass are generally those of the usual weekday. Optional readings are supplied in the lectionary for each memorial, but these are not required. In some cases, when the saint of the day is mentioned in the New Testament, the reading for the memorial is obligatory. This happens, for example, with Mary Magdalene.

The collect will always be proper to the memorial. The prayer over the offerings, the preface, and the prayer after communion may also pertain to the memorial. The priest vests in a color associated with the saint of the day, whether white or red.

Treasures from our tradition

The Roman Canon, called Eucharistic Prayer I, is probably seldom heard in your parish. Some priests will choose it for at least one of the Masses of Christmas, or the Easter Vigil. Such sparing use of this prayer seems strange, especially since it was the only Eucharistic Prayer in the Latin Rite for many centuries, from as long ago as 500 right up to 1970.

In 1965, the vernacular language was approved for the canon of the Mass. Almost immediately, some experimental texts began to surface in the Netherlands, and priests began to use new Dutch texts without permission. By 1966, Pope Paul VI had set up a committee to consider whether or not it was time to approve such experimentation and extend it to non-Dutch churches. No sooner had the committee been formed than other individuals copied the Dutch by just plunging on ahead. The Dutch bishops had approved the use of the new prayers nationwide in 1968, and Flemish bishops in Belgium quickly agreed. By then, German translations of the Dutch prayers were in wide use, and before long nearly one hundred Eucharistic Prayers, all unapproved, were in circulation in France. The Vatican heard the widespread desire for more variety in Eucharistic Prayer forms, and, with the pope's approval, the process of creating new official prayers began.

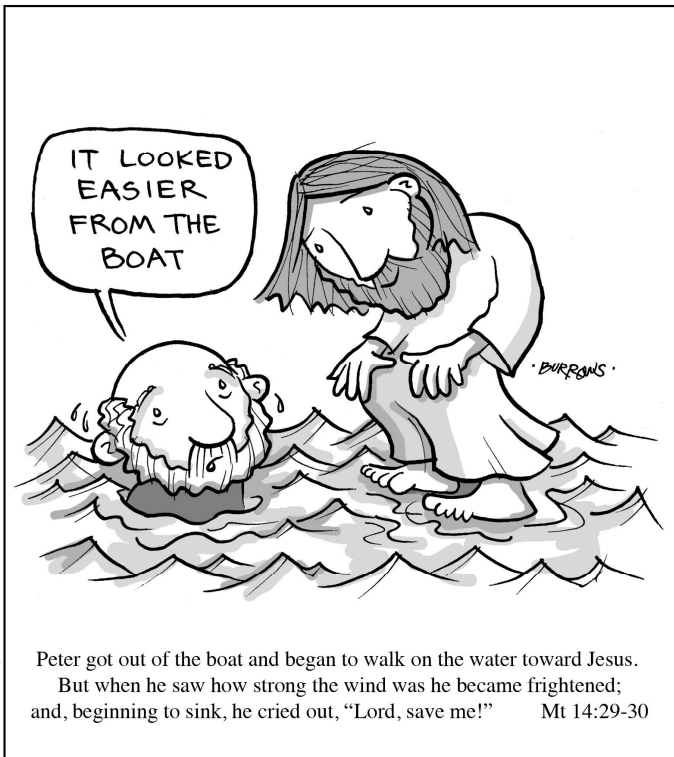

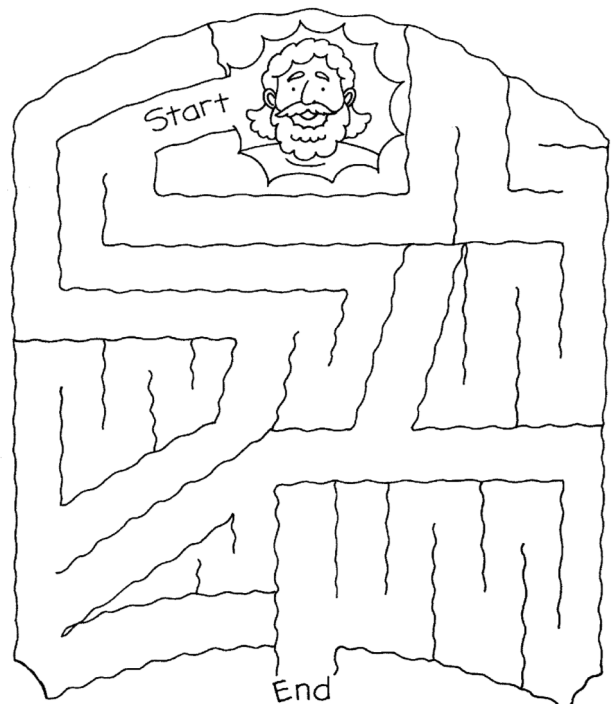
