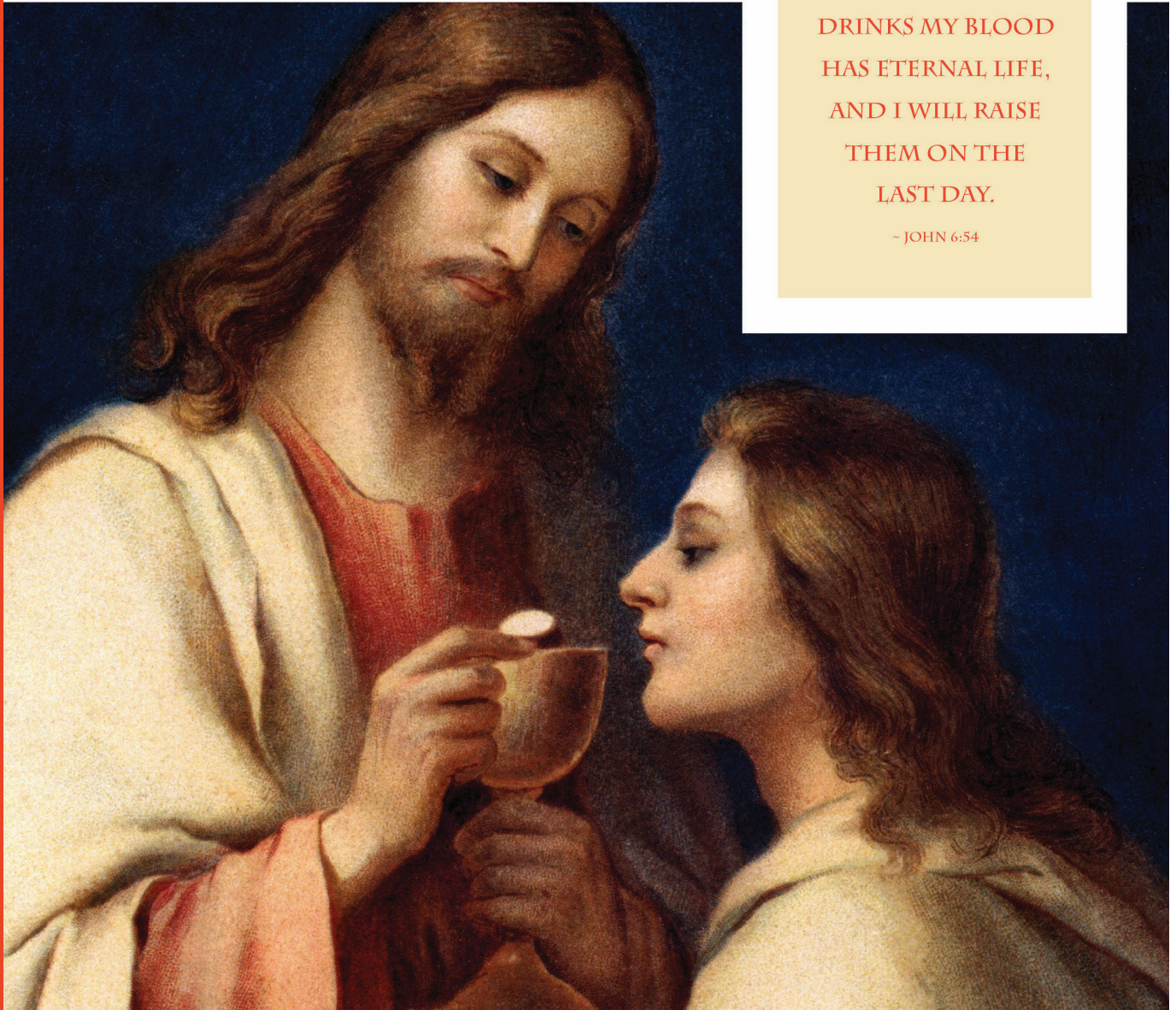

From the Pastor's Desk

Very recently Pope Francis has said that the death penalty is ALWAYS "inadmissible" because it attacks the inherent dignity of all humans.

(Catechism #2267)

The pope explains that there are different ways than the death penalty to protect the common good. In an accompanying letter the head of the Vatican's doctrine office said the development of Catholic doctrine on Capital punishment didn't contradict prior church teaching, but rather was an evolution of it! This is a clear message for all of us.

Human life is precious. God is author of all life. But he doesn't sign off once we are born or especially when a crime is committed, even the most horrible one. God should make His decision about our beginning and the end. Once evil exists, we Catholics should be an example of Love and forgiveness.

Those who commit a capital crime, should be treated accordingly. There are many ways to exclude the death penalty and to replace it with something else. The treatment after any crime should give a chance for the guilty to redeem themselves. A redemption after crime requires not only time but also mercy and education.

Most civilized (rich) countries have gotten this idea many decades ago. The death penalty has been replaced there with many years or permanent imprisonment, often the people who have been convicted are supervised for a long time. They are in therapy that is part of their "returning to the society" programs.

In my research there are 31 states in the US that still have the death penalty. Obviously, the message from Pope Francis needs to be heard and absorbed by the government. A different mind set could change quickly the fate of those on the "Death row." Their life, yet tainted by their wrong choices should not be lost by executions but saved by the Mercy of Christ! Because Christ was able to forgive those who were crucifying and spitting at HIM during the darkest hours of agony.

(Lk. 23:34) - "Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing."

We need to follow his example and change the culture into the culture of Life.

Wise Fools

When we were in high school, we learned that the word sophomore came from Greek words meaning "wise fools." The idea was that the second year student thinks he knows it all now, but still has a lot to learn. The first two readings invite us to a banquet of wisdom. Jesus says he himself is the way to understanding God's will; he gives himself as food and drink for eternal life. So how will we accept these invitations to partake of the Wisdom of God?

One way is to read the scriptures every day, taking time to think and pray about what you read. Don't do all the talking; let God have his chance to be heard. The gospels are especially good "food" because of all the examples Jesus gave in his sermons and parables.

Listen to the readings and homily at Mass. The Pastor may have some insights that make you think. Receive communion often to be fed with the living Bread. The Church has always taught that we are fed with both the word and the Eucharist.

If we want to grow in God's wisdom, we have to exercise our faith. If you have a friend or relative who is a good example of faith, talk with that person about how you experience God or your lack of experiences. You could offer to be a sponsor for someone in the RCIA, and help someone else's faith to grow. Your parish or diocese may also have on-line resources or discussions. God never forces himself on anyone. To grow in his Wisdom, we have to accept it. Ask him for real food and you won't be disappointed. But be patient, God only gives what we are ready to receive.

Saint of the Day

August 21. A man of humble background, and wanting to maintain a simple lifestyle, Saint Pius X endured the trappings of the papacy as best he could. Known for encouraging frequent reception of Holy Communion, and concerned about world affairs, he led the Church in holiness and grace. He was undoubtedly one of the greatest popes of the 20th century.

August 23. A member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic, Saint Rose of Lima lived a life of penance and holiness at home under the disapproving eyes of her parents. They wanted her to marry, but Saint Rose felt another calling. While her lifestyle raised some eyebrows, at her death the city of Lima recognized her sanctity.

August 24. We know nothing about today's saint, Saint Bartholomew, except that he was one of the original twelve apostles. If he is the man called Nathanael, then we know he is from Cana in Galilee--but that still doesn't tell us much. But knowing that he gave his life in the service of the faith is enough.

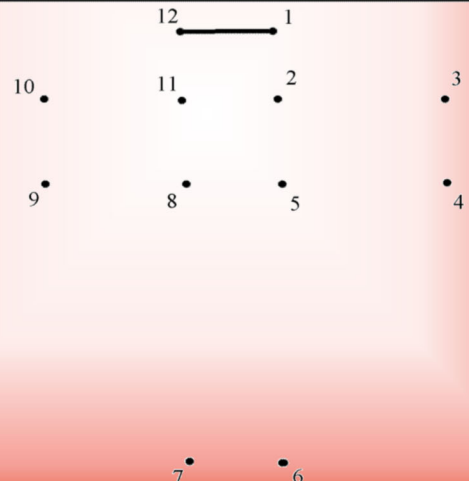

Treasures from our Tradition

Sometimes the heat of summer translates into unrest in a city's streets. In the summer of 1834, popular sentiment against the presence of the Ursuline nuns near Boston reached a boiling point. An influx of Irish laborers had an impact on the work force in the city, and a deep-seated resentment against Catholics fueled the fire. The nuns supported themselves with a school, and most of the young women students were drawn from patrician Protestant families. Nevertheless, rumors fed by the saga of an unhappy junior sister and a later episode of a senior sister fleeing the place increased tensions. The city's selectmen were given a tour by the disgruntled sister, who by then had returned, and found all things in good order. That didn't please the mob, and the mother superior didn't help matters when she said that the bishop had platoons of Irishmen at hand, twenty thousand strong, to do marauders harm. By August 11, the convent had been invaded, ransacked, and burned to the ground. The nuns fled to Maine and Canada. The diocese attempted to recover losses, but the commonwealth offered only ten thousand dollars, which was rejected. Years later, a legislative bill for the state to rebuild the convent and school was roundly defeated. Yet the enterprise of Catholic education had great resilience, and in 1946, more than a hundred years after the riots, the Ursulines returned to Boston to re-establish an academy that endures to the present day.
