## From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. We will continue to count the Sundays until the start of Advent (December 3) and the beginning of a new liturgical year. The Sunday of the Thirty-fourth week in Ordinary Time (November 26) will be rendered the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

To my thinking, the Back-To-School rites are most appropriately celebrated AFTER Labor Day. Despite my well established opinion, some of our parishioners have returned or are returning to the classroom as students and teachers. We pray that they will grow both in knowledge and in grace.

Since we know Jesus, in part, as Teacher, the Church has always had a teaching or catechetical ministry. On September 17 we will celebrate Catechetical Sunday as we begin the new year of Religious Education. Parents, who have not yet done so, should register their children during the Parish Picnic (see top of next column).

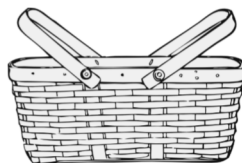
Monday August 21 is the Memorial of Pope Saint Pius X, the patron of our neighboring parish to the east and part of our grouping of parishes for the Renew My Church initiative of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The Stickney parish is named for the Pope (1903-1914) born Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto in 1835. He undertook liturgical and canonical reforms especially communion for children and frequent communion for adults. He condemned Modernism and wished "to renew all things in Christ."

## Treasures from our tradition

Once the way was cleared for additional Eucharistic Prayers, those who were appointed to compose them had to look deep within the tradition for sources. One of the prescriptions for new prayers was that they be "unencumbered by useless repetition."

From the start, therefore, the writers knew that the old Roman Canon, which had the priest bowing and crossing himself many times in a long, complex prayer, was not a model of simplicity. Aside from the prayers treasured by Eastern Christians, there is an obvious model from ancient Rome. For about a hundred years now, the historical text "Apostolic Tradition" has shed some light for us on the shadowy shape of worship in the early church. In it, its author, Hippolytus, took care to record the actual texts of worship used at the time. He himself has a shadow side, since he was so ardently conservative in his tastes that he broke ties with the Bishop of Rome and became first in the line of history's anti-popes. At the eleventh hour, however, he reconciled with his enemies and actually died a martyr. In fact, he was shipped off to the Sardinian mines as a slave with the true pope as his companion in chains. Because his tussle with the pope was over theological innovations and not liturgical texts, we are sure that his account of the style of Eucharistic Prayer in the third century is accurate. It forms the core of today's Eucharistic Prayer II.

## Optional Memorial by Paul Turner

Some people celebrate birthdays. Others don't. The day has real significance for some people, but not for others. However, the birthdays of George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, and Martin Luther King Jr. have taken on national importance. Everybody celebrates those.

On our church calendar, we have a number of days set aside as memorials to honor our saints. Some of them—such as Thomas Aquinas (Jan. 28), Augustine (Aug. 28), and Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus (Oct. 1)—are so important that everybody celebrates them. Others—such as Rose of Lima (Aug 23), Turibius de Mogrovejo (March 23), and Elizabeth of Portugal (July 4)—are significant for smaller groups. When these days fall during the week, the Mass contains special prayers to honor these saints. Although every church celebrates the days of certain saints as memorials, the days of other saints are optional memorials. Your own parish church may choose whether or not to celebrate those days.

Some optional memorials are quite popular. For example, Patrick (March 17), Nicholas (Dec. 6), and Maria Goretti (July 6) have many followers. Other saints are more obscure.

Because of the large number of saints, the calendar includes some flexibility. It adapts to local devotions and to the spiritual needs of worshipers.

When an optional memorial falls on a weekday, you need not celebrate it at all. You may just have an ordinary day. But when your parish chooses to take the option at a weekday Mass, you may hear prayers that pertain directly to the saint, especially the opening prayer of the liturgy. The Scriptures may also vary to help people reflect on the special gifts and devotion of the saint. Whenever an optional memorial coincides with a Sunday or another day of higher rank on the calendar, we omit its celebration that year.

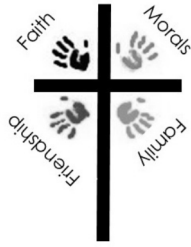

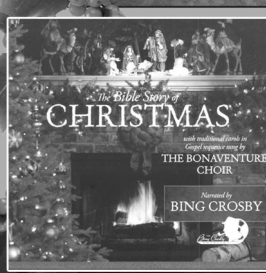
