Father Reszel



Born on August 26, 1910 in Skopje, Macedonia as Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu. Her father died when she was eight years old, so her mother raised her in a firm and loving manner greatly influencing the future saint's character and religious vocation.

At the age of eighteen, she left home to become a missionary with the sisters of Loreto in Ireland. There she received the name Sister Mary Teresa since her middle name *Gonxha* is translated as *Little Flower*. In December of 1928 she departed for India, arriving in Calcutta. On January 6, 1929 she began twenty years of teaching (later principal) at Saint Mary's School for girls. On May 24, 1937 she made her final profession of vows and was, from that time on, called Mother Teresa.

On a September 10, 1946 train ride from Calcutta to Darjeeling, Mother Teresa received her inspiration to help the poor. Jesus revealed to her, "Come, be my light" and asked her to establish a religious order, the Missionaries of Charity, dedicated to the service of the poorest of the poor. On August 17, 1948 Mother Teresa dressed for the first time in the white and blue bordered sari and left her beloved Loreto convent to enter the world of the poor.

Between 1948 and her death on September 5, 1997 the Missionaries of Charity grew to over 4000 sisters operating in 610 missions and established in 123 countries.

She was award the Noble Peace Prize in 1979. In 1985 she received the Medal of Freedom from President Reagan. On October 19, 2003 she was beatified by (now Saint) Pope John Paul II and became known as Blessed Teresa of Calcutta. She is the patron of World Youth Day.

She will be canonized a Saint by Pope Francis next Sunday, September 4.

*Alms atone for sins (Sirach 2:29). Alms are mercy translated into hands-on compassion. Jesus confirms Sirach's wisdom, Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy (Matthew 5:7). Conduct your affairs with humility (Sirach 3:17). Humility: we're all alike and special, for we're children of God. Jesus confirms that wisdom, too: Do not recline at table in the place of honor. Take the lowest place (Luke 14:8, 10). In fact, When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite friends, relatives, wealthy neighbors. Invite the poor, crippled, lame, blind, physically or figuratively, society's most vulnerable and marginalized, who cannot repay you (see 14:12-14). Jesus seems to be telling us to prepare for eternity with God's chosen by becoming their friend here and now. Mercy is measured not by our delight in welcoming those we like*

## Treasures from the tradition

Perhaps the most familiar traditional symbol that identifies bishops is the crozier that they carry. We see the shepherd's staff and immediately rich images from scripture come to mind, as well as the recollection that the first to respond to Christ's presence in our world were the shepherds. The staff is more than a walking stick; its crooked top is useful in snaring errant sheep but also in keeping the flock united. Bishops carry the curve outward, indicating their ministry to the wider flock, while abbots (and some abbesses, too) carry the crozier with the curve pointing in, indicating that their ministry is to the monastery alone.

The crozier was once also carried by the pope, but was phased out centuries ago. You may recall that in pre-"popemobile" days, the pope was often carried around on a portable throne called a *sedes gestatoria*. Since he didn't do much walking, the need for a crozier was minimal. Pope Paul VI introduced the innovation of a walking staff in the 1960s, and everyone remembers Pope John Paul II's walking staff, not a crook, but a delicately sculptured crucifix. Thus, the pope carries a "pastoral staff" rather than a crozier. Precisely because the pope's ministry is universal, to the whole world, popes will likely leave croziers in the hands of the bishops they commission for care of specific flocks.

## Reverence by Paul Turner

Present at the Eucharist as the people of God, we share an awesome task. We the baptized are the ones God has chosen to be a royal priesthood. At Eucharist, the task of the whole people is priestly. We give thanks to God and offer the perfect sacrifice, the Body and Blood of Christ, together with ourselves. It is not the presider alone who makes this offering—it is all of us. Consequently, attention to our duty is

critical for a meaningful celebration of the Eucharist. The church asks us to act with reverence—for the Eucharist, for our role in it, and for the community. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* says the faithful should endeavor to make their role clear by their deep religious sense and their charity toward all who participate with them in the celebration (95).

Reverence and charity may take different forms. Entering the church, we greet those with whom we will celebrate this Mass. We sign ourselves with water that recalls our priestly mission. We bow to the altar where our thanksgiving will be made or we genuflect to the tabernacle if it is central in the sanctuary. We sing the songs. We make the responses. We listen to God's word. We pray all the prayers, even those spoken by the presider alone. We share the Eucharist in faith.

At times our actions may threaten the task we perform. When we needlessly attend to other matters or neglect the songs and silences and prayers, we make it difficult for ourselves and for others to carry the reverence and charity needed for our task. Mass is not like watching a band perform music; it's like playing an instrument in the band. Sometimes you play with everyone else; sometimes you rest; sometimes you solo. But we all make the music. It requires attention and teamwork.

To carry out our priestly mission we practice reverence for God and charity for one another. If someone else's idea of reverence conflicts with yours, practice charity. It helps us fulfill our awesome task.

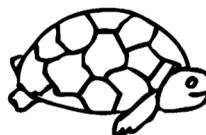
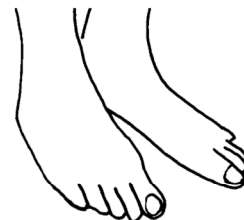
