Saint of the day

September 13. Saint John Chrysostom, the great preacher of Antioch, was the victim of his own success. Called to be a bishop, this simple monk found himself embroiled in the workings of the empire. He, however, managed to stay focused on the needs of the Church.

September 14. Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, is credited with having found the cross on which Jesus was crucified. The cross quickly became an object of veneration.

September 15. The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul, and Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple. The two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.

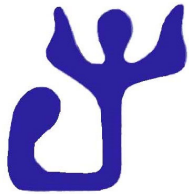
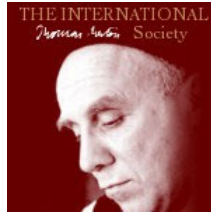

Our Lady of Sorrows by Paul Turner

On the day after the church celebrates the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, we commemorate Mary under the title of "Our Lady of Sorrows" (Sept. 15). Those who suffer emotional pain find inspiration from the strength of the Blessed Virgin, whose grief for her son never disturbed her faith. The devotion became so popular in the Middle Ages that the church reserved a day on the calendar to foster its spread.

The Gospel for the Mass is either of two stories about Mary. As a young mother, she and Joseph dutifully brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem. Once they arrived there, Simeon rejoiced to see the Messiah. But he also prophesied that a sword would pierce Mary (Lk 2:33-35). This is understood as a metaphor for the sorrows that awaited her. The other Gospel option tells of Mary standing at the foot of the cross with the Beloved Disciple while Jesus entrusted each to the care of the other (Jn 19:25-27).

A tradition evolved that Mary's life was marked by seven sorrows, sometimes called "dolores," an otherwise little-used synonym in English. Three come from the stories of Jesus' childhood: the prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, and the loss of Jesus in the Temple. The others relate to his passion: meeting Jesus on the road to Calvary, standing at the foot of the cross, observing his descent from the cross, and attending his burial.

A popular hymn to the sorrowful mother, "Stabat Mater," may be sung as the sequence following the first reading on Sept. 15. It is a popular choice for praying the Stations of the Cross, and it may be sung during the adoration of the cross on Good Friday.

Blue Mass

A Blue Mass is celebrated for those employed in the "public safety field" (police officers, firefighters, correctional officers, 911 operators and EMS personnel). Blue relates to the uniform color predominantly used by these services. The Mass, which honors those who have died in the line of duty and those currently serving as first responders, is an opportunity for the community to show gratitude to first responders and their families.



In Washington, D.C. the service is held in conjunction with National Police Week. Now a national celebration, the first Blue Mass was celebrated by Father Thomas Dade on September 29, 1934 at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Washington, D.C. September 29 is the feast of Saint Michael the Archangel, the patron of police officers.

Treasures

from our tradition

On Good Friday, at the heart of the Triduum, the commemoration of the Lord's Passion is colored by sobriety and decorum, but this Thursday the mystery comes in a luminous celebration of Christ's victory. In its deepest origins, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is the feast of a dedication of a church, since in the year 335 the Church of the Holy Sepulchre was dedicated on September 13, and on the following day the "true cross" discovered by St. Helena was brought outside to the faithful for veneration. It is a great feast of the Eastern Church, which often marks it by having the whole assembly prostrate themselves on the floor honoring the life-giving cross.

At the core of the tradition is the quest of Helena, mother of the Emperor Constantine, to acquire the cross and the nails of the Crucifixion from the ruins of Jerusalem. When she was satisfied that she had found them, thanks to the healing of a sick man whose body was placed on the cross, she had her son fund the building of the great basilica. The history of the relic is complicated, especially because it was carried off by invading Persians in the year 614 and "went missing" for fifteen years. Thursday's feast does not celebrate the relic, but rather the life-giving cross from which salvation flows. It's a good day to look around your house or office: Don't those walls look bare without a cross? What better day to remedy that?
