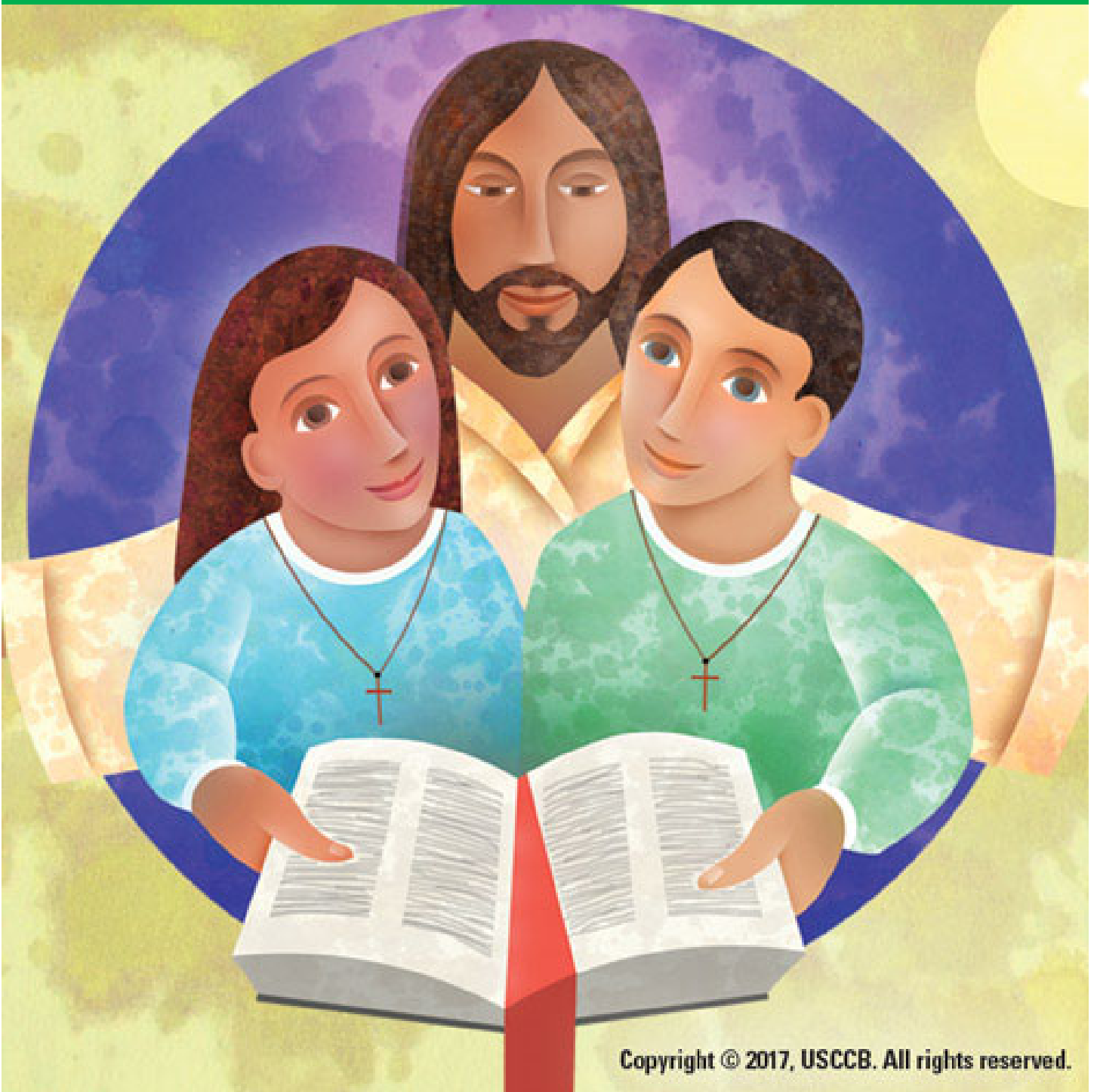

LIVING AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES



From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. As the third Sunday of September this is nationally recognized by the USCCB as Catechetical Sunday. At the 10:30am Mass we publicly commission and formally thank our catechists. This year's national theme is: *Living As Missionary Disciples*.

One example of living as a missionary disciple is Blessed Stanley Rother the American priest and martyr who will be beatified on Saturday September 23. More on page five and at stanleyrother.org

BEDS Plus is a local organization (based in LaGrange) that helps vulnerable individuals stabilize their lives through housing and supportive services. For 30 years BEDS Plus has organized an emergency overnight shelter program. This year, October 2017 through May 2018, St. Hugh will be the BEDS Plus shelter site on Wednesdays. This decision was made with the advice and the full support of the pastoral staff and the PPC (Parish Pastoral Council). Our current commitment is simply to provide the space. Experienced volunteers and members of the BEDS Plus staff will handle the rest. Learn more about this important work at beds-plus.org

While some bulletin features are still being moved around, the requests for prayers of the sick can still be found on page three. Some of those named are relatives of parishioners; others are former parishioners. This makes it difficult to keep the list updated. Before setting arbitrary rules, if you have requested prayers for someone on the parish list, please contact the parish office with an updated status of those in need of our prayers.

As planned for in the budget and discussed by the finance committee, we need to replace the boiler (church heating) prior to this winter. When repairs were made last winter, we were informed that, while the boiler may last another year, the cost to replace it in an emergency would be double. We have received an estimate of \$39,950 to do the work this fall. We have over half of the cost in the building fund and have budgeted for this capital expense. The Archdiocese is aware of the project and has given us permission to proceed. Those wishing to contribute to this particular cost, should do so through the Major Repair envelope.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

Melchizedek by Paul Turner

When an alliance of kings attacked the area surrounding Sodom (Gn 14), their warriors kidnapped Lot, Abram's nephew, and stole his property. Abram mounted an army of 318 trained soldiers, conquered the enemy and brought back Lot, his family, and his property. The king of Salem, a priest named Melchizedek, brought out bread and wine and blessed Abram and his God.

From this little story came a big name that Christians sometimes hear in their public prayer. The reason has to do with the New Testament Letter to the Hebrews, which presents Melchizedek in its treatment of Psalm 110. The psalm recalls the event from Genesis by naming Israel's king a priest forever, like Melchizedek. The Letter to the Hebrews applies this image to Christ, calling him God's eternal high priest (5:10; 6:20; 7:15-22). Hebrews further points out that "Melchizedek" means "king of righteousness" and that "king of Salem" means "king of peace" (7:1-3), both images of Jesus' ministry. Furthermore, Melchizedek appeared in the Book of Genesis without parents or descendants, making his mysterious arrival and departure a symbol of Jesus.

From the earliest centuries of Christianity, the bread and wine that Melchizedek offered were thought to foreshadow the Eucharist. This is one reason why the first eucharistic prayer includes the prayer that God will accept the offerings, "as once you were pleased to accept ... the offering of your high priest Melchizedek, a holy sacrifice, a spotless victim."

Christians, then, see in the story from Genesis themes that prefigure our belief in the eternity of Christ, his mission of peace and righteousness, and the offering of the Eucharist.

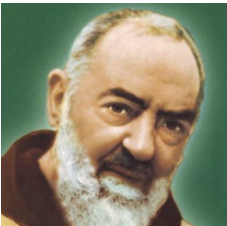

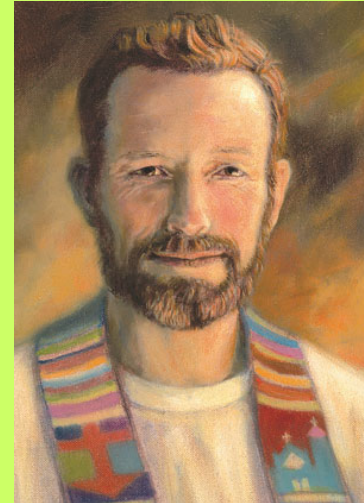

Treasures

from our tradition

We've seen how the rescue of Eucharistic Prayer II from the mists of history changed the style of our prayer, introducing a sleek simplicity to the prayer said aloud by the priest. Remember, before the reform of our prayer in the late 1960s, the priest whispered the words of the Roman Canon, Eucharistic Prayer I. His voice was not amplified, his back was to the people, who could only tell what was going on by a shift in his posture as he bowed and genuflected and as bells were rung to indicate his progress through the prayer.

With the emergence of the new prayers, some feared that the old prayer would be lost forever if it weren't somehow changed. The reformers asked that it be streamlined a bit by omitting the repeated "Through Christ" at the end of various intercessions, and trimming the list of somewhat obscure saints. The new edition therefore brackets parts of the two lists of saints in the prayer, unfortunately dropping all the women from the second set. The decision was also made to keep the Lord's words at the consecration exactly the same in every Eucharistic Prayer, although there is precedent for more variety. On November 2, 1968, Pope Paul VI signed off on the plan of the new Mass, and by April 1969, the publication of the revised order of Mass was announced.
