From the Pastor's Desk

Today is the Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time. While the autumnal equinox is not until September 22, the holiday weekend with Labor Day has traditionally been considered the finale of summertime. Once, this was the time to store your white shoes until Memorial Day and to get ready for the first day of school on Tuesday.

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday September 5, 1882 in New York City. In 1884 the first Monday in September was selected. It has been a Federal Holiday since 1894.

During the 10:30am holiday Mass on Monday September 5 we will bless the tools or symbols of our work. All those attending are invited to bring a work related item for the blessing.

On September 8 we celebrate the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. See Father Paul Turner's article on page four of this bulletin for the history of this feast.

In the wake of racial tensions and tragic events, Archbishop Joseph Kurtz, President of the USCCB, has called for a National Day of Prayer for Peace in Our Communities on September 9, the feast-day of St. Peter Claver. The Archbishop hopes that this will be one way to *nurture open, honest and civil dialogue in our communities struggling with violence in many forms*. Saint Peter Claver was a 17th century Jesuit missionary in Columbia where, for 38 years, he ministered to African slaves.

In the United States, the celebration of the Memorial of Saint Peter Claver is obligatory. Although not celebrated here liturgically, September 9 is also the feast-day of Blessed Frederic Ozanam, the founder of the Society of Saint Vincent DePaul. We beg his intercession for our local conference and for our parish's efforts to assist those who come to us in their need.

The special intention for the 10:30am Mass on September 10, the eve of the fifteenth anniversary of the horrific events collectively known as 9-11, will honor the firefighters, police officers, and emergency medical technicians who serve our local communities and those who have died during the past year. This is sometimes called a *Blue Mass*.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish.

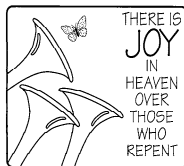

Weekly Vincentian Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus lays out the demands of following him, the great cost of discipleship. The Mission Statement of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul states: "Vincentians witness God's love by embracing all works of charity and justice...the Society makes no distinction in those served because, in them, Vincentians see the face of Christ."

Jubilee of Mercy: December 8, 2015 - November 20, 2016



"If anyone comes to me without hating . . . father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his [or her] own life" (Luke 14:26). Hating? Can anyone imagine a less appropriate Gospel for the Jubilee Year of Mercy? But scholars call this Semitic hyperbole. Jesus exaggerates to jolt us into confronting life-changing challenges. Faced with conflicting loyalties, disciples must reorder priorities, even relationships, to give Jesus and the gospel's demands first place. Today's second reading presents a real-life example. Paul challenges his wealthy convert, Philemon, to welcome back Philemon's runaway slave, Onesimus, whom Paul has baptized in prison. Not only with unconditional forgiveness but with a counter-cultural, world-shattering change of status--as an equal. No, even more--a beloved brother in Christ. What in my

life does the Jubilee Year of Mercy challenge me to "hate"--meaning reform, redo, even utterly revamp--so I can give everyone, no conditions, no exceptions, shockingly Christ-like love? - Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

Treasures from the tradition

Sometimes, this "Treasures" column can seem to be a species of crib-notes for Catholic Jeopardy. Indeed, you may never know when knowledge of our particular vocabulary may come in handy. Such is the case with papal bulls, which conjure up all sorts of images, but are actually not what you might expect. A bull is a papal letter on a matter of great consequence, such as a decision about a crisis in the Church, the declaration of a doctrine, the summoning of a council, or the canonization of a saint. It has a more solemn intention than a mere letter or even an encyclical, a teaching letter circulated through the whole Church. Its odd name comes from the Latin *bulla*, which is the stamp used to apply a signatorial design to the hot lead, or even molten silver or gold, that seals the decree.

The format for the bull is the name of the pope in Latin, followed by the title "servant of the servants of God," also in Latin, and then the text. The title of the bull is always the first two words of the text. Some famous papal bulls are *Exsurge Domine* (Arise, O Lord), written against Martin Luther's Ninety-five Theses in 1520; *Munificentissimus Deus* (The Most Bountiful God), the promulgation of the dogma of the Assumption in 1950 by Pope Pius XII; or *Humanae Salutis* (Human Salvation), by which Pope John XXIII convened the Second Vatican Council in 1962.

Birth of Mary by Paul Turner

Tradition has it that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was born of parents named Joachim and Ann in Jerusalem at the end of the first century BC. In fact, all that we know for certain is that Mary was born.

The names of Joachim and Ann first appeared in a legend dating from the turn of the third century. In the story the wealthy Joachim, ridiculed in his old age for having no children, turned to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The despairing Ann, at prayer in her sorrow, beheld an angel who promised she would conceive. The story bears similarities to the birth of Samuel (1 Sm 1), whose mother had a similar name (Hannah) and sang a prayer resembling Mary's magnificat (compare 1 Sm 2:1-10 with Lk 1:46-55). However, because this legend is so late, the truthfulness of the story is doubtful, as are the traditional names of Mary's parents.

The strongest tradition places the birth of Mary in Jerusalem near the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus would later heal a cripple on the Sabbath (Jn 5). A church dedicated to St. Ann stands near the pool today. Beneath the church lie remains of a house where our ancestors believed that Mary was born. The place has witnessed Christian worship since the third century. Other traditions place the birth of Mary at Nazareth or Bethlehem, but in each case the evidence is too slight to be certain.

The date of Mary's birth has similarly been lost. Because the church of St. Ann in Jerusalem was dedicated on September 8 in the fifth century, that day entered the calendar as the celebration of Mary's birth.

We honor the birth of Mary every year on September 8 as a feast day. The Mass has its own special prayers and readings and calls for singing the Glory to God.

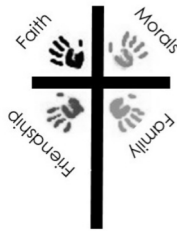
