Saint of the Day

September 12. This feast is a counterpart to the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus; both have the possibility of uniting people easily divided on other matters. Mary encourages us to cooperate with Jesus in building a peace based on justice.



September 13. Saint John Chrysostom, the great preacher of Antioch, was the victim of his own success. Called to be a bishop, this simple monk found himself embroiled in the workings of the empire. He, however, managed to stay focused on the needs of the Church.

September 14. Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, is credited with having found the cross on which Jesus was crucified. The cross quickly became an object of veneration.

September 15. The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul, and Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple. The two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.

First Day of Religious Ed for all grades will be Sept. 9, we will begin in church at 9am.

*** ALL PARENTS MUST BE PRESENT! ***

Faith Formation is not just about receiving Sacraments, such as Communion or Confirmation. It's a lifelong journey. It is very important for our children to consistently receive formation. This includes prior to Sacraments, between Sacraments, and after Sacraments.

There are many programs available at St. Hugh, there is Religious Ed which is for PreK-12 and is for those preparing for Reconciliation, Communion, and Confirmation. Religious Ed includes the 10:30am Mass. All children will attend Mass; families are invited to join them at Mass.

We also have Children's Liturgy of the Word which is for our littlest ones. It takes place during the 10:30am Mass once or twice a month. They hear God's Word and complete age appropriate activities.

For those young adults who have received their Sacraments we offer Youth Ministry. This includes Planning Meetings, Open Gyms, Service Projects, Fundraisers, and a newer program, called Thursdays@7, where we gather to watch a movie (over two sessions) and discuss our faith in relation to the movie. Royal Treatment

St. James is exaggerating a little when he describes how people might greet visitors or new members in the church. Sadly, prejudice is a sin that is just as prevalent today as it was 2000 years ago. Today we have laws for business and government to prevent prejudice. But the subtler forms of judging people by their race, clothing, speech, religion, etc. sometimes hide behind patriotism, faith, or the desire to protect our families.

One reason for prejudice is ignorance. When you get an e-mail that says "true Americans" are white, English-speaking Christians, there is probably some prejudice behind it. The only way to fight ignorance is with the truth. Jesus himself said the truth will set you free. (Jn 8:32) He told us that God loves all people, even sinners, so what right do we have to judge someone just because they are different?

A second reason for prejudice is fear. We are told that certain neighborhoods are dangerous. Or an older adult sees three teenage boys walking down the street and because of her fear, she thinks they could be gang members. But remember how many times Jesus tells us in the gospels, "Do not be afraid."

If we can learn to see Christ in all peoples, regardless of their race or lifestyle, we are beginning to leave prejudice behind. If we teach our children to respect the poor, the disabled, the homeless, we can help them to understand what James meant about God choosing the "poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom." (Jas 2:5)

Treasures from our Tradition

Back to work we go! Summer break is over and there is much to accomplish in school and in the workplace. It's a venerable Catholic custom to assign patron saints to the trades and occupations of life. This is largely in the realm of popular devotion, and although from time to time the Vatican declares a saint to be patron of this or that, the process is free-wheeling and just about uncontrollable. Still, there is a saint for almost any purpose, whether you are on death row (Dismas), having eye trouble (Lucy), or pursued by poisonous toads (Hubert). Medieval guilds would often associate themselves with heavenly patrons, so Saint Joseph has the carpenters, Thomas More the lawyers, and physicians get Saint Luke. If you're stuck in the airport, St. Joseph of Cupertino is on call since he was said to rise off the floor when he prayed, and if you're in a long line at the ATM, Saint Anthony Claret is for you. In recent years, the Vatican has from time to time assigned a new patronage, as when Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was named the patron of HIV-AIDS patients, since as a young Jesuit novice he had cared for his fellow novices during a terrible plague. Anything that matters to us--nation, parish church, occupation, illness--can have a patron, and it is an aspect of Catholicism that has enormous appeal. To believe in the "communion of saints" is to know that the ties that bind us as a communion do not unravel with death, and that when we stand before life's struggles, we do not stand alone. Who is your patron saint?

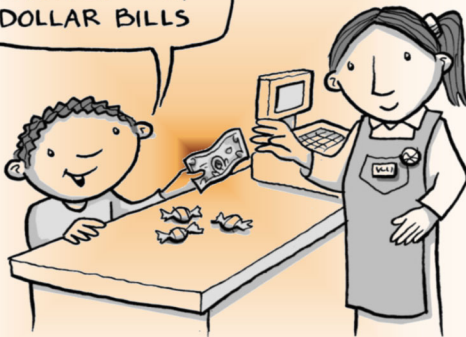

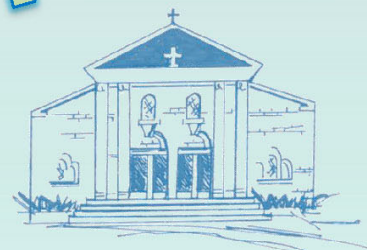
