Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ February 1, 2015

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.

Some people say that ‘seeing is believing’. Last week I traveled with a group of 21 young pilgrims so that they might see and meet the many people marching for the cause of Love and Life. Our first stop in Washington, D.C. was the Holocaust museum. It might seem like an odd stop. We recognized, however, there is a great connection between how the Nazis used propaganda in order to make Jews seem less real, less human, less worthy of life. Let us never forget that Nazis also persecuted other segments of society that were not helpful to form the “pure race” they desired: the handicapped, the mentally retarded, those affected with Down’s syndrome, the autistic, and the list goes on. When we entered the museum, each person received a passport profile and biography of one of the holocaust victims. Each person had a name, a family, a future. How sad that is!

But when Nazis tried to exterminate these groups, they attempted to remove from their sight the humbling vision of someone who needs help. That vision which reminded the Nazis themselves of their own weakness and fragility before God. By getting rid of the weak somehow makes one feel stronger, greater, more free than he really is.

During our tour of the museum, one of the young travelers revealed the passport he received at the entrance. It was a German Jewish doctor. One part of his biography describes that Nazis soldiers liked him because they could force him to perform abortions on the women they had misused and abused. If the women would die anyway, I asked what could be the possible benefit of killing a child in the womb?

The Nazis had the innate sense that the existence of one more person in the world, especially one who is weak and fragile would expose the weakness and dependency of the world on God and his servants. Instead the Nazis wanted to turn away saying, as we hear in today’s first reading: “Let us not again hear the voice of the LORD, our God, nor see this great fire any more, lest we die” (Dt. 18:16). Indeed many times “seeing is believing.” Is it any wonder then, that the majority of abortion clinics do not perform sonograms for the parents to see the child? Is it any wonder that the majority of television and radio stations were not present to record hundreds of thousands of young, joyful, faithful marchers? Is it any wonder that we see fewer children with disabilities in school and playgrounds?

I thank all those who prayed, supported, and contributed to the amazing and transformative experience which the youths encountered. Let us always support the cause for life, ALL LIFE: the unborn, the disabled, the homeless, the migrant, the sick, the elderly, and the criminal even when it is difficult. No, *especially* when it is difficult. Let us be present, vocal, and visible for those who can not be present...for those who can not be. Let us be Christ who remains present in the Eucharistic bread...seemingly weak and fragile, yet who by his Divine power is the conqueror of all things visible and invisible.



Alabado sea Jesucristo, por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

Algunas personas dicen “ver es creer”. La semana pasada viaje con un grupo de 21 jóvenes peregrinos para que puedan ver y conocer mucha gente marchando por la causa de Amor y Vida. Nuestra primera parada en Washington, D.C. fue al museo Holocausto. Podría verse como una parada extraña. Reconocimos, sin embargo, que hay una gran conexión entre como los Nazis usaban propaganda con tal de hacer los Judíos parecer menos real, menos humanos, menos dignos de la vida. Nunca olvidemos que los Nazis también oprimieron otros segmentos de sociedad que no fueron de ayuda para formar la “raza pura” que deseaban: los discapacitados, los retrasados mentales, aquellos afectados con el Síndrome Down, los autistas, y la lista sigue. Cuando entramos al museo, cada persona recibió un pasaporte perfil y biografía de uno de las víctimas Holocausto. Cada persona tenía un nombre, una familia, un futuro. ¡Qué triste es!

Pero cuando los Nazis trataron exterminar estos grupos, ellos intentaron remover de su vista la visión humilde de alguien que necesitaba ayuda. Esa visión que recuerda los Nazis mismos de su propia debilidad y fragilidad ante Dios. Al deshacerse del débil de alguna manera hace uno sentirse fuerte, mejor, más libre de lo que realmente era.

Durante nuestro recorrido del museo, uno de los viajeros jóvenes reveló el pasaporte que había recibido en la entrada. Fue de un doctor Judío Alemán. Una parte de su biografía describe que los soldados Nazis lo querían porque lo podían forzar a llevar a cabo abortos en las mujeres que violaron. Si la mujer moría de todas maneras, me preguntó ¿que podía ser el beneficio de matar a un niño en su vientre?

Los Nazis tenían un sentido innato que la existencia de una persona más en este mundo, especialmente uno que es débil y frágil expondrá la debilidad y dependencia del resto del mundo. Sin embargo los Nazis querían abandonar diciendo, como escuchamos en la primera lectura de hoy: “No queremos volver a oír la voz del Señor nuestro Dios, ni volver a ver otra vez ese gran fuego; pues no queremos morir. (Dt. 18:15). Ciertamente muchas veces “ver es creer”. Les pregunto entonces, ¿Por qué la mayoría de las clínicas de aborto no hacen sonogramas para que los padres vean al niño? ¿No es extraño que la mayoría de estaciones de televisión o radio no estuvieran presentes para grabar los cientos de miles de jóvenes, alegres, manifestantes fieles? ¿No es extraño que veamos menos niños con discapacidades en la escuela y parque infantil?

Le agradezco aquellos que oraron, apoyaron, y contribuyeron a la maravillosa y transformadora experiencia en la cual los jóvenes se encontraron. Siempre apoyemos la causa por la vida, TODA VIDA: los que no han nacido, los discapacitados, los desamparados, el emigrante, el enfermo, el de la tercera edad, y los criminales aun cuando es difícil. No, especialmente cuando es difícil. Estemos presentes, vocales y visibles por aquellos que no pueden estar presentes... por aquellos que no pueden ser. Seamos Cristo que permanece presente en el pan de Eucaristía... aparentemente débil y frágil, pero por su Poder Divino es el conquistador de lo visible e invisible.
