ST. PATRICK'S NEWS

During the month of May we reflected on our Blessed Mother and June on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During the month of July the Church calls us to reflect on the Precious Blood of Christ. Pius IX instituted the feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord in 1849, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merits sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

Whenever I celebrate mass and lift up the chalice at the consecration, I visualize the Blood of Christ coming from our Lord's blessed side into the Chalice and overflowing upon all who are present. Yes, this out pouring of Christ's Blood not only quenches our thirst, but drenches us with his healing and redeeming love. In the Prayer after communion for the mass of the Precious Blood, the ancient teaching of the Church is expressed about the Blood of Christ.

"Refreshed, O Lord, by this saving food and drink, we pray that we may always be bathed in the Blood of our Savior, so that it may become for us a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Yes, this Precious Blood of Christ refreshes us, it restores us and it heals us. It is at the mass where we truly receive the holy transfusion we truly need to live. Yes, Lord, allow your Precious Blood to invade our veins so that our heart will pump your Blood Type throughout our bodies.

Let your Blood refresh us with a new outlook on life, a new meaning, and a new direction.



Strengthen our weak human wills so that we will not only NOT run from the cross, but WELCOME every opportunity to shed our blood in spirit in union with your Precious Blood, so that, dying to ourselves in time we might live with You in eternity. Parish Council

St Patrick's Parish Council Minutes

The St. Patrick's Parish Council met June 19th at 7:00 pm. Members present were Fr. Dan, Ginny Darr, Tom Connor, Jim Watts, and Dan Hanrahan

Fr. began by getting an update on hail damage to the grounds. An adjustor found hail damage to the roof on the church sacristy, as well as the flashing around the windows on the church's west side. There was some additional damage to some shingles on the house, as well as paint being knocked off its south side. Still waiting to hear a damage estimate, but have begun looking for contractors to do the work.

The large window at the front of the church was also discussed. The exterior storm window is cracked. The Diocese recommended having another glass company take a look at it. Since the council meeting they have, and it appears the window will take more work than previously thought.

Fixing the door at the back of the church was also a point of discussion. It no longer shuts tight, and is letting water in onto the new floor during storms. Dustin Cozad looked at the door, and suggested we put in a commercial, custom made metal door, very similar to what is currently there. He gave a rough estimate of \$2000 for the door, and offered to install it for nothing. The council voted to pursue this option.

Dustin also attempted to fix the open slot on the church bell tower. He found the wood behind the tin had deteriorated. It was a larger project than he could handle, and we decided again pursue another contractor.

We are also looking for a mason to take a look at the flaking foundation under the sacristy, and give us recommendations on how to proceed.

The floor of the porch on the Parish House is also in need of repair. An initial bid came in on the job at \$7000. It included pouring four footings, and the use of a poly flooring resistant to rot. The council decided to ask them to resubmit a bid essentially rebuilding it the way it was.

Father updated us on our Annual Diocesan Appeal Goal. Currently we were at 78% with \$6175 pledged of our \$7800 goal.

Also discussed was resuming a 2nd Collection this fall. It will be taken on the first Sunday of every month, beginning this October, and the proceeds will be donated to the Madison Warren Ecumenical Association.

Father also gave an update on the proposed St. John Paul II Center. He has been in contact with Joan Bindle of the Des Moines Diocese, who will help us better flesh out our case, prior to the beginning of a feasibility study.

Finally, Father mentioned the upcoming Religious Education Summer Week in July. The next meeting was set for August 21^{st} .
